HANNEY CROSS.—An effort is being made to restore an ancient cross in the village of Hanney. According to tradition it was called the Butter Cross, and probably marked the site of a small market. It has been broken up many years and its fragments built in walls and small bridges in various parts of the village. A number of the stones have been recovered, including the head of the cross and the plinth, and it is to be hoped it will be restored in its entirety.—W. H. HALLAM.
