[EDITORIAL PREFACE].

We are greatly indebted to Mr. Acton Pile for consenting to transcribe for this journal these important documents, which are of immense value in tracing the history of lands and manors. Pedes Finium or "Feet of Fines" differ from the Fine Rolls which contain accounts of fines paid to the Crown for licenses to alienate lands, for freedom from knight service, or being knighted, for renewals of charters, etc. The fine or contract recorded before a judge, had five parts, (1) the original writ, (2) license of the Crown giving the parties liberty to record, (3) the concord itself, (4) the note of the fine, an abstract of the original concord, and (5) the foot of the fine which always begins thus-"Heec est finalis concordia facta in curia Dom. Regis apud Westm" etc. the official summary of the concord, was cut off in an indented line (hence the word indenture) so as to tally with the part delivered to the suitor and prove its authenticity, and retained by the court. manorial history can be considered satisfactory until these records have been consulted (vide Dr. Cox's How to write the History of a Berkshire antiquaries and all who are interested in genealogy and family histories, will therefore be grateful to the transcriber for thus placing at their disposal this valuable source of information. The transcriber in this number furnishes us with the latest document, and will work backwards to those of earlier times. The material parts of the initial Fine are given in full; the rest are abbreviated. Any reader who wishes to have further particulars of any Fine can have them by applying to the Editor, who will publish in subsequent numbers those which are asked for.
