I haveing reced a testemny from the inhabitans of Stanlake that they have all with one unanimus consent made choyce of Robert Lloyd to be theire perish Register for marrages birthes burialls according to the late Acte of Parliament & according to that Acte I have sworne him. witnesse my hand the day & yeare above written John Nixon.

James Marshall of Burford & Susanna Burnett married last of May & their contract published 3 severall markett dayes at Woodstock.

Memorandum that when the minister of the Parish was at London the latter end of Febr: An: 1709, the Collecter came for three Briefs which had been read according to the late Act of parlement,

but . . . collected & deliverd before his return, the mony collected was indorst upon every Brief, but forgetting the names of the Briefs is the reason the said Briefs are not registred.

Johannes Chambers S.T.B. et Coll. D. Magd. Soc. inductus erat in [Rectoriam, *lined through*] ecclesiam de Stanlake per Gualt Bayley, Rector de Ducklington.

Memorand. An. 1691 July 21.

[The Paraphrase of Erasmus upon the New Testament, lined through] & a book of Homilyes belonging to the Parish Church of Stanlake is in the custody of the present incumbent, J.C. [as is likewise a Common Prayer Book in fol. lined through].

Memorandū. Besides this Register Booke ther are three Register stiched Bookes belonging to this Parish of Stanlake; whereof the first is written in vellum, & doth beare date the 9th yeare of the raigne of Queen Elizabeth; & of our Lord God 1560, & is coverd with a vellum cover. The second Register is written partly in vellum and doth beare date the 7th of King Charles 1st, & of our Lord God 1631. The third Register is in base greasy partchment & is coverd with it, & doth beare date in the beginning of the yeare of our Lord 1653; & doth end in the yeare of our Lord God 1669.

Christopherus Harris, centum annos (ut ferunt) natus, sep. 27 Oct 1680.

William Haward D.D. Rector & Mary Meetkerke of Rushden, Herts, mar. at St Paul's, Covent Garden 4 July 1749.

N.B. He is the first Rector (according to all accounts) that ever ventured upon the married state.
