ARBORFIELD.

THE Arborfield property is the subject of a letter from Thomas Barker to Bishop Fox, dated 22 Dec. 1516. (Letters of Richard Fox, ed. P.S. and H.M. Allen, no. 53). Barker had evidently been asked by Fox to report on any land for sale in his neighbourhood, and wrote to say that Thomas Dorsett had a house "sumwhat at reparacion" and 9 acres of good land at Erberfeld, which he would sell for not less than 20 marks: also Richard Newlond had three crofts near the house, for which he asked 8 marks. From 2.i.30 and 2.ii.8 it appears that both bargains were settled ten days later at lower figures.

One deed—2.i.10—was misplaced in the transcripts: it should come after 2.i.21. The holdings dealt with in the group 3.ii are included in the deed 2.i.30. 2.i.28 has been omitted from the calendar: as noted by Twyne, it refers to a purchase at Heyford, Oxon. 2.ii.14 is concerned with some property of Claimond's which did not come to the College, but, being a Berkshire deed, is included.

The abbreviations for recurrent place-names in the calendar are—A—Alfeldcross (Alfeldcrouch): B—Beaconsfield (Bekenefeld): E—Arborfield (Erberfeld): H—(La)Hurst: N—Newland (Le Newelond): R—Reading: S—Swallowfield (Swalefeld).
