




FIG. 3. Reconstructed section of Barrow No. 1.







This is a sketch of the above graves showing the positions of the skeletons one above the other, arranged as they stood when laid down etc. - The drinking cup at the feet of the young man in height by 1/2 across the rim. This occurred in putting together, very well, the drinking cup on the arched grave stone. The child's bone is crushed & buried in shape of bone sandal - The first year dead near both shoulders of upper skeleton 6' 3 inches by nearly 2 1/2 as every project as well as the arm of the child which was not. The second child had his head bent back so as to cover the face of the child above him.


