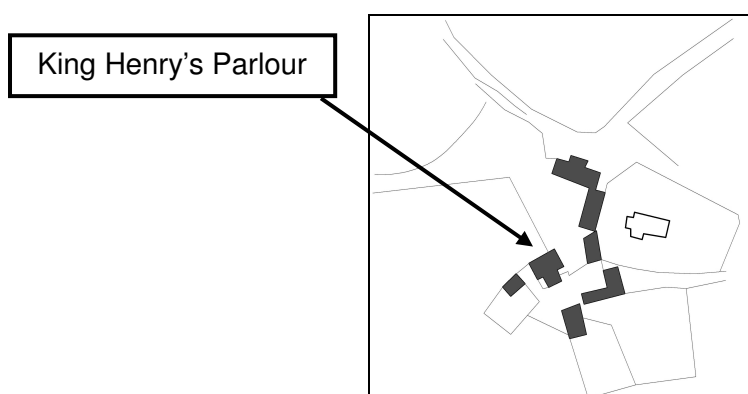


Figure 4: Traced extract from map of 1796

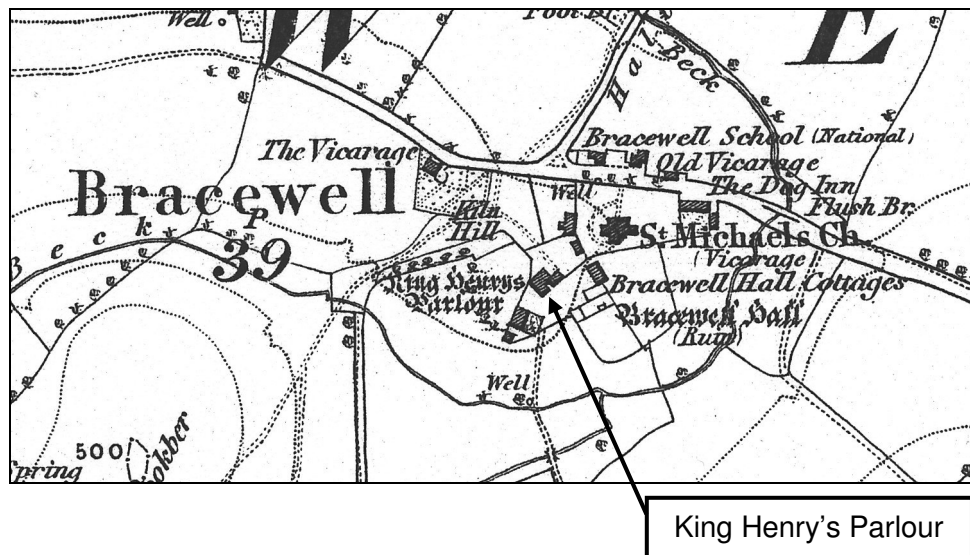


Figure 5: Ordnance Survey 6" to mile map (enlarged), published 1853 (survey date: 1849-50)

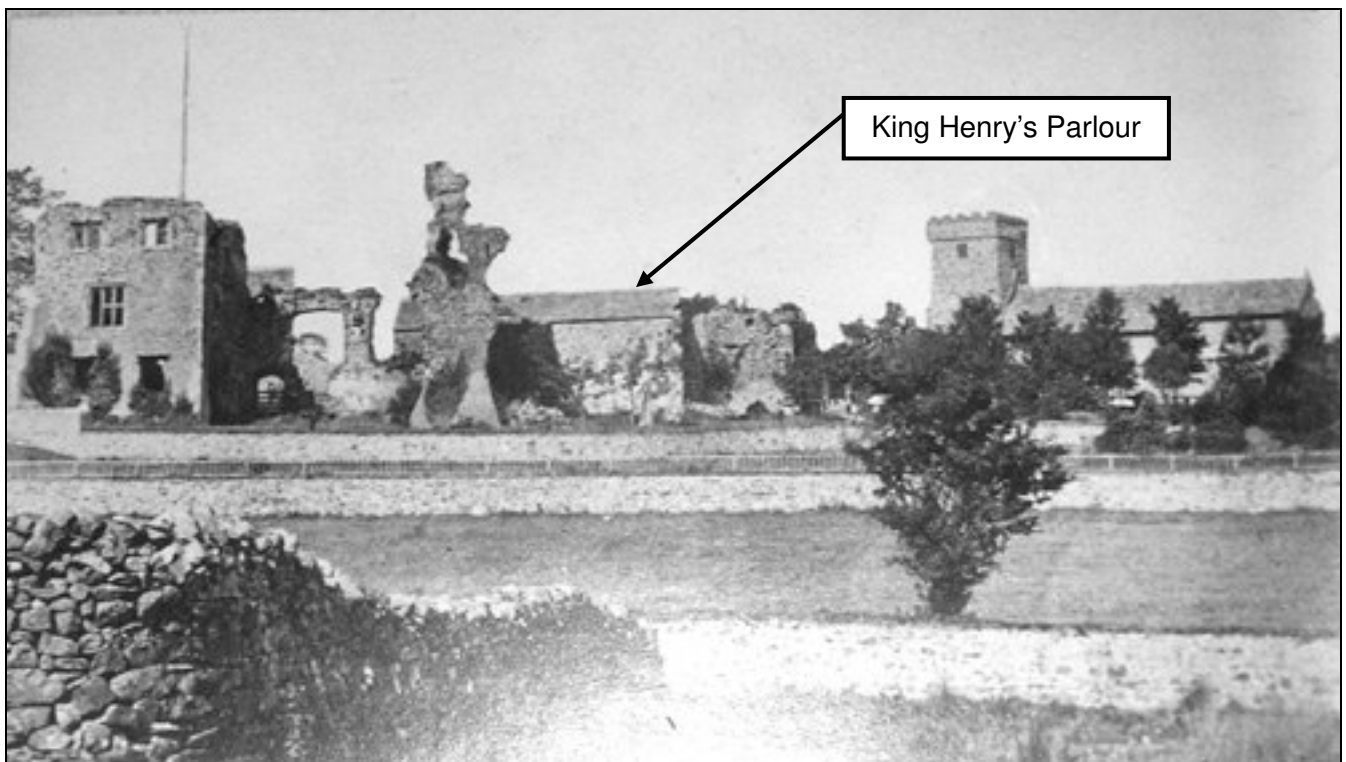


Figure 6: Photograph of the ruins of Bracewell Hall, taken from the south-east, believed to be c.1850

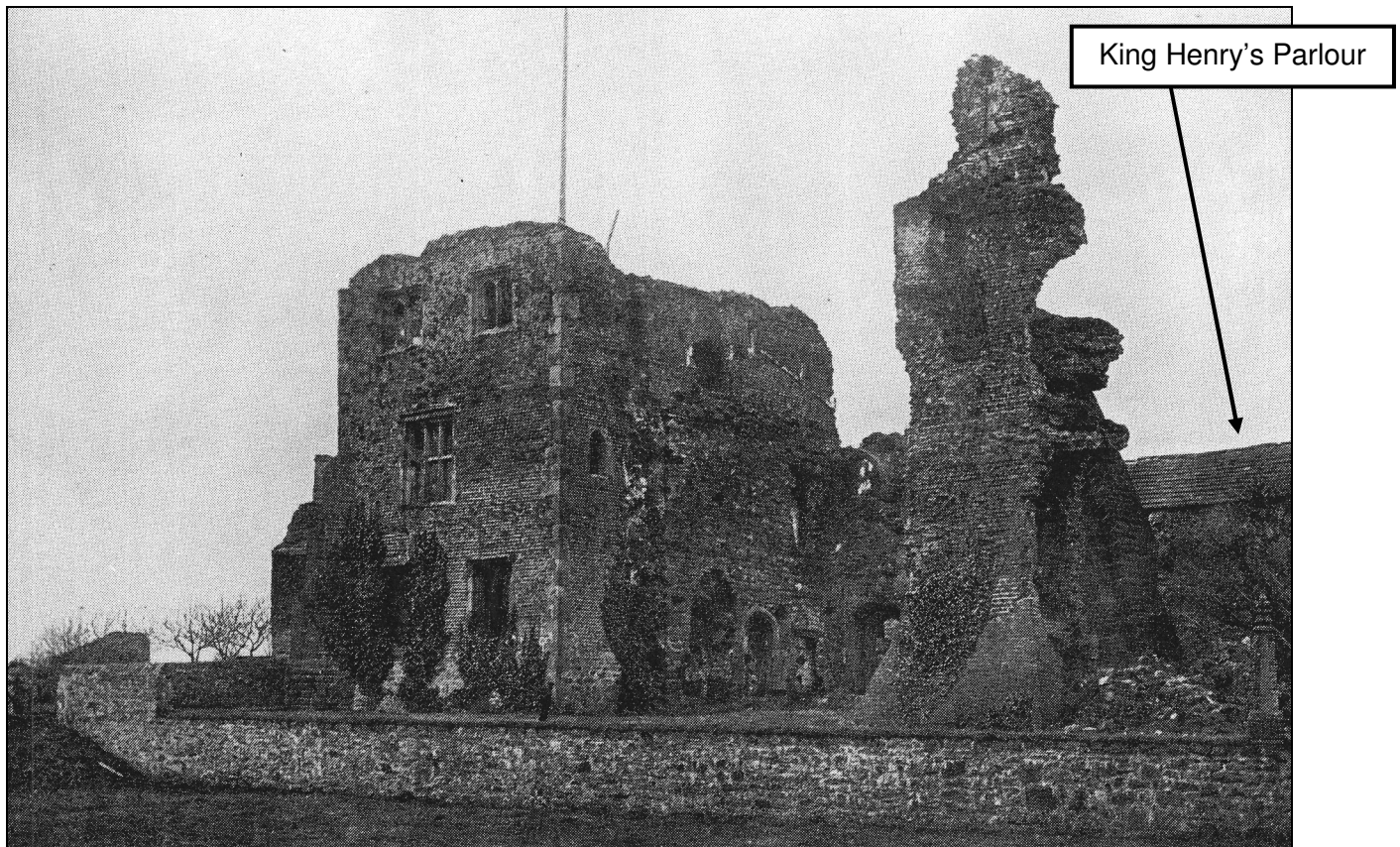


Figure 7: Photograph of the ruins of Bracewell Hall, taken from the east, in 1862

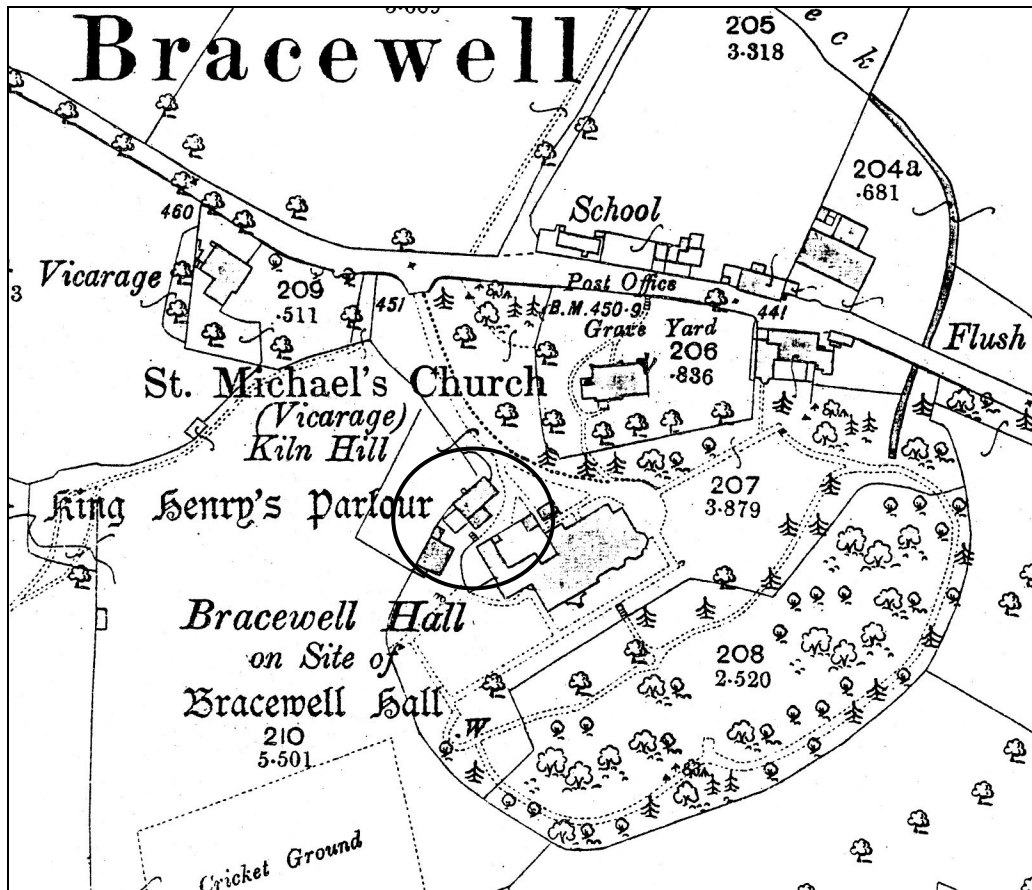


Figure 9: Ordnance Survey 1:2500 map, published 1894 (survey date: 1892)

 King Henry's Parlour is circled here

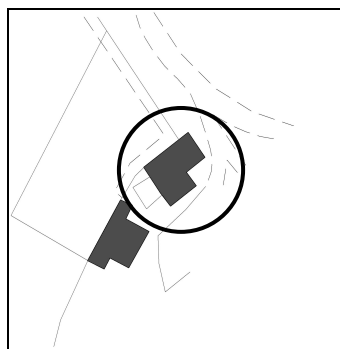


Figure 10: Tracing of Ordnance Survey 1:2500 map, published 1909 (revision date: 1907)
