

Summary of Mucking Catalogues

We have the following catalogues (with total numbers):

Fired clay

1. Belgic bricks: 68
2. Briquetage: 106 pieces, 820(g?) weight, including 16 salt vessels, 4 pedestals, 7 angles and 7 misc.
3. Fire bars: 294
4. Loomweights: 100 (15 from South Rings)

8. Wattle: 52 (6 from South Rings)
