

CASTELPORZIANO 1984-2009 INDEX OF SITE CODES

CPS	Castelporziano Survey: the coastal zone of Castelporziano, together with parts of the adjacent estates of Castelfusano (towards Ostia) and Capocotta (towards Lavinium), as mapped in 1988-1991. The map (see Section 1.2.4) is aligned with the modern Via del Telefono, which runs just inland from the ancient Roman coastline, and is divided into 7 transects, each 1 km wide and 2 km deep, lettered A to G. Each transect has its own internal numeration identifying individual archaeological features or 'sites' within it.

CPV B	Castelorziano Vicus zone B:	east-west street between blocks A and C, H and F, G and XL/Y
CPV C	Castelorziano Vicus zone C:	city block occupied by a single building with a large peristyle garden and bath suite
CPV D	Castelorziano Vicus zone D:	wide north-south street between blocks C and F
CPV E	Castelorziano Vicus zone E:	west of D, south of F, partly excavated buildings forming south-east angle of block F.
CPV F	Castelorziano Vicus zone F:	large city block occupied by several separate buildings
CPV G	Castelorziano Vicus zone G:	peristyle and other structures, partly excavated west of F
CPV H	Castelorziano Vicus zone H:	west of block A, north of block F, containing the Forum, three temples and other associated buildings
