- Republican denarius of M. Mettius, 44 BC, showing obv. Caesar's head, small, with projecting wreath; rev. flat. Cf. Crawford 1974, 488, no. 480.2, pl. LVI. Much worn. (D5 SF89 Phase III).
- 2 TITUS, AD 77-8. Sestertius, Lyons mint, Salus Augusta type cf. Mattingly and Sydenham 1926, 106, no. 774 Vesp. Worn. (D7 SF108 Phase II).
- 3 DOMITIAN, AD 92-4. Sestertius, Rome mint, commemorating Julia, daughter of Titus, cf. Mattingly and Sydenham 1926, 209, no. 441. Much worn. Probably saw 40 or 50 years of wear at the least before being lost. (D5 SF57 Phase III).
- 4 ____, AD 81-96. Dupondis, Rome mint. Much worn; no detail survives. (E1 SF2 Phase VI).
- 5 ____, AD 86. As, Rome mint, Moneta Augusti type, cf. Mattingly and Sydenham 1926, 196, no. 335. Fresh and unworn. (A4 SF1 Phase II).
- 6 TRAJAN, AD 104. Sestertius, Rome mint, SPQR Optimo Principi (Emperor on horseback, falling Dacian warrior in front), cf. Mattingly and Sydenham 1926, 282, no. 543. Slightly worn to worn. (Unstratified).
- 7 ____, AD 98-9. Dupondius, Rome mint, seated Abundantia type cf. Mattingly and Sydenham 1926, 272, no. 382. Unworn to slightly worn, but encrusted. (E2 SF18 Phase VI).
