- (9) Sherds of decorated late Neolithic pottery from a pit at Brackmont Mill, Leuchars, Fife. By R. D. M. CANDOW, F.S.A.SCOT., and R. CRERAR, Dundee.
- (10) Neolithic, Bronze, and Iron Age pottery from an occupation site at Heanish Bay, Tiree (NM 038435) and sherds of hand-made pottery, possibly medieval, from a shell midden on the west side of Achnahaid Bay, Enard Bay, Ross-shire (NC 018132). By C. F. TEBBUTT, Eynesbury.

- (14) Small Middle Bronze Age cinerary urn having three ridges round the middle, found over 100 years ago on the estate of Achalader, Blairgowrie, Perthshire. Bequeathed by Major C. L. CAMPBELL of Achalader, Blairgowrie.
- (15) Bronze socketed axe found on Arthur's Seat, Edinburgh (approx. NT 276727). By K. R. S. STAFFORD, Oregon, U.S.A.
- (16) Three socketed axes, two rings and a knife or dagger, all of bronze, found at Creag Beathach, Torran, Ford, Argyllshire, in June 1962 following a find at the same spot in 1881 (*P.S.A.S.* XVIII (1883-4), 207 and *supra*, 352-4, Pl. LVIII); decorated upper quern stone found at Asknish Forest, Loch Fyneside and a man's jacket, of about the 1860s, found in deep peat at Creran, Appin House, Argyll. By H. M. Forestry Commission.

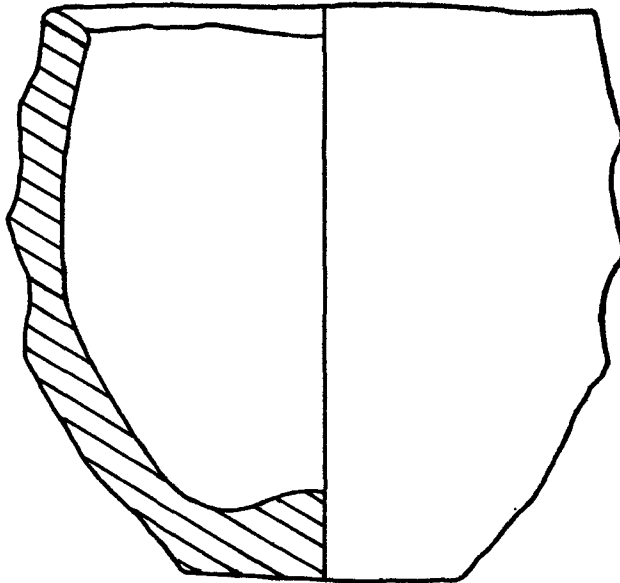


FIG. 1. Item 14, urn from Achader Estate ( $\frac{1}{2}$ )

- (24) Collection of small sandstone balls found in the garden at Kemback Lodge, by Cupar, Fife. By F. C. STEAD, Cupar.

- (25) Sandstone disc found on Traprain Law, East Lothian. By C. C. CATTERMOLLE, Haddington.
- (26) Part of an upper quern stone, found in the fort on Manor Sware, Peeblesshire (NT 235394). By R. W. FEACHEM, F.S.A.SCOT.
- (27) Large bead of colourless glass inlaid with a greenish chevron. Found at a sandpit at Lechuary, Kilmichael Glen, Mid-Argyll, by the donors. By R. McGUINNESS and J. ROSE, Lochgilphead, per E. Cregeen, F.S.A.SCOT.
- (28) Sherds of medieval pottery, and two pieces of rotary querns, from a settlement site at Helm End, Kilbucho, Biggar. By J. ROBERTSON, Biggar.
- (29) Lead spindle whorl found in the garden of 'Beechwood', Broughton, by Biggar. By Miss CATHERINE C. J. RAE, Broughton.
- (30) Stone whorl from Caldermains Farm, Halkirk, Caithness. By Mr ROBERTSON, Halkirk.
- (31) Twenty-one coins (James V-James VI) from a hoard found at Noranside, Tannadice, Angus and three out of five one-merk pieces of Charles II found in Laxdale, Lewis. By the Queen's and Lord Treasurer's Remembrancer.
- (32) Wooden ceiling about 27 by 18 ft. from Rossend Castle, elaborately painted about 1610-20 with emblems and the monogram of Sir Robert Melville. By the Town Council of Burntisland, per Ministry of Public Building and Works.
- (33) Communion token of the Parish of Dyke with the initials of William Falconer Minister 1674-89; found in the Culbin Sands by the late Dr John Johnston, F.S.A.SCOT. By Mrs J. JOHNSTON, Aberdeen.

- (35) Silver-mounted meerschaum pipe and silver 'picker', said to have belonged to Prince Charles Edward Stuart, after 1746, and acquired as a pledge for a loan by Thomas Chrystie of Old Meldrum, when in Denmark early in the nineteenth century. - (36) An engraved Amen Glass, a glass with a painted portrait of Prince Charles Edward and a letter from Robert Burns in reply to an invitation to dine on the Prince's birthday (*Book of Old Edinburgh Club* (1909), 172); a silver teapot (James Welsh, Edinburgh, 1749-50) engraved with inscriptions from medals awarded by the Edinburgh Society to John Hutton for papermaking, and a two-handled lidded silver cup (London, 1700-1); silver spoons, rings, snuff boxes and other items, all from the family collection of the donor. - (37) Linen damask napkin 1748 (Margaret Thomson and John Morison), and two Victorian Christmas cards. By Mrs I. A. RUSSELL, Rosemarkie.

#### *Meetings*

The Anniversary Meeting was held on 30th November 1962. Monthly meetings then continued until April 1963 and were resumed in October 1963.

#### *Administration*

*Centenary.* Our only remaining Lady Associate, Dr M. A. Murray, celebrated her 100th birthday on 13th July 1963. The Council sent her a letter on behalf of the Society congratulating her on the event. It was with great sorrow that we read of her death recently.

*Abstract of Accounts.* In order to save expense on printing and postage, an Abstract of the Treasurer's Annual Account is exhibited for inspection by Fellows in the library. The circulation of copies to individual Fellows has been discontinued.

#### *Editor's Report 1962-3*

Volume XCIV of Proceedings, which included a List of Fellows, was published in September, an improvement of two months over last year. Council acknowledges with thanks grants made towards the publication of papers by H.M. Treasury (for the Royal Commission on Ancient and Historical Monuments), the East Lothian County Council, the Council for British Archaeology and the Carnegie Trust for the Universities of Scotland.

One paper for Volume XCV, for which a grant has been promised, has been delayed,

but the remainder has been sent to the printers and publication is expected in the summer of 1964. This will be similar in size to Volume XCIV, but in the interests of economy the Rules of the Society and other introductory matter have been omitted.

Material already exists for Volume XCVI.

*Chalmers-Jervise Prize.* The competition for the Chalmers-Jervise Prize was advertised to the public through the newspapers on 1st March 1963. The closing date for entries was 31st October, by which time a number of entries had been received. Judges are being appointed and the results will be announced in due course.

*Sale of Publications of the Society.* A Catalogue of the Publications of the Society was produced early in the year and was sent out to all interested. The demand for both off-prints and back copies of Proceedings has been considerable and sales during the year have amounted to £421 15s. 3d. Although the supply of some items has been exhausted, there are still large stocks held which are available for sale.

This Report was unanimously approved on the motion of Mr Grant G. Simpson, seconded by Mr George Murray, M.A.

The President spoke of the state of the Society which he said was very healthy. The public was showing an increasing interest in antiquities and he encouraged all present to urge others to join the Society. The costs of publications were rising and in particular the prices of well-produced works of reference were often beyond the reach of the ordinary private person. The Proceedings of this Society still gave remarkably good value and was

an authoritative and well produced work of reference. He repeated the warning that he gave last year that it was inevitable that the rate of annual subscriptions would have to be increased in the near future; the situation was still critical and the Council was now considering the best means of carrying this out.

The Treasurer then made a Statement regarding the funds of the Society for 1962-3, and read the Auditor's docquet. The Accounts were unanimously approved on the motion of Mr A. Kennedy seconded by Mr L. Grahame MacDougall, A.R.S.A., A.R.I.B.A., F.R.I.A.S.

Mr William H. Valentine, a grand nephew of Sir Daniel Wilson, then spoke about a silver tea-set presented to Sir Daniel Wilson by the Society of Antiquaries of Scotland. He had brought with him the silver tray belonging to the tea-set, which he put on view during the Meeting. Mr Valentine stated that he had presented the tea-set to the University of Toronto, of which Sir Daniel Wilson became Principal, with the exception of the silver tray, which he had retained for use by his family.
