

## **Glass from Boroughbridge**

### **Glass**

Thirteen fragments of post-medieval bottle glass were recovered from context 3000. They vary widely in appearance, mainly in the degree of weathering and in colour. Two fragments, a neck and base, are particularly highly weathered and are consistent with being from a wide, squat bottle of the types used in the late 17<sup>th</sup> and early 18<sup>th</sup> centuries (the so-called 'onion' and 'mallet' forms). The remainder, however, are free-blown tall wine bottles with single string rims. Such bottles, with diameters of c.95mm, are typical of the mid 18<sup>th</sup> to early 19<sup>th</sup> centuries. A late 18<sup>th</sup> century date is likely for the assemblage.
