Medieval and Later Pottery from All Saints School, Nunnery Lane, York (OSA01EX01)

One hundred and fifty-five fragments of medieval and later pottery were recovered from All Saints School, Nunnery Lane, York. They were submitted by On Site Archaeology for identification and assessment.

The material came from two deposits: a series of layers interpreted as medieval and later ploughsoil and dump layers (henceforth 'ploughsoil') and from building debris overlying this ploughsoil (henceforth 'modern'). The earliest post-Roman pottery present is of 12th or 13th century date suggesting that during the Anglian and Anglo-Scandinavian periods the area was not occupied. The pottery sequence continues into the high medieval period (the later 13th and early 14th century), the late medieval period (c.1350 to c.1550), the early post-medieval period (c.1550-c.1650), the later post-medieval period and the early modern period (c.1780 onwards). The latest pottery from the ploughsoil dates to the late 18th or 19th centuries whereas vessels of late 19th/early 20th-century date were recovered from the modern building debris.

Description

Medieval Pottery

Seventy-three sherds of medieval pottery were recovered from the site, 53 of these came from the ploughsoil and the remainder from modern deposits. There is little difference in character between the two groups and it is assumed that all the pottery originated in the 'ploughsoil'.

The earliest datable sherd is of a Stamford ware pitcher with a thin, drab glaze. Such vessels were produced in the late 11th and early 12th centuries. Its presence suggests that some of the York Gritty ware sherds from the site also date to this early period, although most are probably later. The Stamford ware sherd is small but no more abraded than other sherds from the site.

The next earliest wares present probably date to the late 12th or early 13th centuries and consist of York Gritty ware sherds, York glazed ware, York Splash-glazed ware, Red Sandy ware, Beverley ware and a possible sherd of Hillam ware. Of the 27 sherds found, 16 are from glazed jugs whilst at least some of the remaining 7 York Gritty ware sherds are likely to be earlier. This very high frequency of glazed jugs is a feature of urban assemblages and indicates that the pottery found was probably from occupation in York or suburban development along Micklegate Bar.

Pottery dating to the later 13th or earlier 14th centuries is represented by 11 sherds of Brandsby ware and a sherd of Coal Measures Whiteware. These came from several layers classed as medieval or later ploughsoil: 1010, 1028 and 1036 as well as in the modern debris, 1000.

Later medieval wares consisted of Humber ware and Walmgate ware, a total of 16 sherds, spread through contexts 1001, 1003, 1010, 1012, 1028, 1034 and 1036.

There is thus a fairly even spread of medieval pottery from the 12th to the 15th or early 16th centuries.

Post-medieval Pottery

Twenty-seven sherds of post-medieval pottery were found. They include both early post-medieval and later post-medieval wares.

The early post-medieval pottery consists of 11 sherds of Ryedale ware, 3 sherds of Cistercian ware and one sherd of Midlands Purple ware. These ware are of 16th or early 17th century date. A possible sherd of a Ryedale ware bowl has traces of use as a paint pot with deposits of two paints on the exterior. One of these was a blue paint whose colour was provided by a fine blue crystalline or glassy powder.

The later post-medieval pottery consists of Staffordshire slipwares (press-moulded plates or dishes, mottled-glazed posset pots and tankards and posset pots with slip decoration, one with feathered slip and one with white slip-trailing over a brown external slip), two sherds of black-glazed ware (unknown source), one sherd of a slipped posset pot with feathered slip on the exterior and an inclusionless pink coloured body and finally the spout from an ornate tin-glazed posset pot in which the drink was obtained through a hollow tube running down the body of the vessel. Given that the total later post-medieval assemblage consists of 9 sherds it is difficult to say whether this high proportion of finewares is significant but the high number of drinking vessels is consistent with the use of this area for temporary accommodation for visiting merchants.

Early Modern Pottery

Thirteen sherds of late 18th century or later date were recovered. The only items of note were two almost stoneware vessels with thick brown glaze. These have been identified by a Lincoln bottle collector as Buchan ware, from Portobello, near Edinburgh. Both were probably used for cream, one as a storage jar and the other as a jug. The vessels are dated to c.1895-1915 (Figs 1 and 2). The collection contains four sherds of flowerpots, which is consistent with the area being used as private then public gardens and part of a ceramic egg. These were used, apparently, to encourage broody hens and may therefore be evidence for the keeping of poultry on the site. The fabric is unglazed pipeclay and is essentially undatable, although probably of the post-medieval or early modern period.

Assessment

The pottery collection is a mixed assemblage with similar quantities of pottery from every period from the 12th to the 19th centuries. The sherds are not heavily abraded, as would probably have been the case if they had been buried within a ploughsoil or garden soil, exposed to chemical and mechanical weathering. Therefore, they are probably evidence for the dumping of urban night soil on the site.

AVAC 20/08/10

The lack of pottery earlier than the late 11th or early 12th century may indicate that such manuring was a post-conquest phenomenon but the total size of the collection is too small for much weight to be put on this absence.

Should further ground disturbance take place on this site the collection of a larger assemblage of pottery should be a priority.

None of the pottery requires further treatment but the whole collection should be retained for future study.
