# Assessment of the medieval and later pottery from Castle Howard, North Yorkshire (CASH02)

#### Alan Vince and Kate Steane

Seven hundred and ninety-eight sherds of pottery from excavations at Castle Howard were submitted for identification and assessment by Bath Archaeological Trust, for Time Team (Site Code CASH02).

The earliest pottery found was of late 12<sup>th</sup>-century date but the majority of the sherds were of locallyproduced North Yorkshire Whiteware, some of which were definite wasters and much of which was probably also waste. A collection of post-medieval pottery was found, most of which was probably contemporary with the construction and early use of the grounds of Castle Howard. Finally a small group of late 18<sup>th</sup>-century and later types were present.

# Description

#### Medieval

Four hundred and eighty sherds of medieval pottery were recovered from the six excavated trenches. Of these, the majority, 444, were of locally-produced North Yorkshire Whiteware (NYWW) and of these 328 sherds came from Trench 4.

The earliest wares present were of late 12<sup>th</sup> to early 13<sup>th</sup>-century date. Twenty-two sherds could be assigned to this time bracket (Table 1). Of these, the majority were of Staxton-type ware (STAXT). This ware was produced at Staxton and Potter Brompton, at the southwest of the Vale of Pewsey. However, the style of pottery made at these sites was also made at other centres and there are locally-produced variants supplying Hartlepool and Beverley. The remaining sherds are all of glazed jugs, of three wares: Beverley ware, Scarborough ware and York ware. All of these wares are thought to have been introduced in the mid to late 12<sup>th</sup> century and there are no examples of Yorkshire Gritty ware from the site, which presumably provided pottery for this area in the late 11<sup>th</sup> and early 12<sup>th</sup> centuries.

The majority of the medieval sherds, however, were of later medieval date (Table 2). All but 14 of these sherds were of North Yorkshire Whiteware. These sherds include a ridge tile in a Coal Measures Whiteware fabric (CMW), sherds of Humber ware of mid 14<sup>th</sup> to 15<sup>th</sup> century date (there are no

examples with a purple/brown glaze, which appears to be a 16<sup>th</sup>-century introduction), a single sherd of late 14<sup>th</sup> or 15<sup>th</sup>-century Langewehe stoneware and sherds from a jar of Midlands Purple ware, probably of 15<sup>th</sup> century date .

The North Yorkshire Whiteware included 39 sherds which were definite wasters. In most cases the evidence consisted of glaze running over broken edges and in a few cases consisted of vitrified sherds. These wasters mainly came from Trench 4, with single sherds from Trenches 3 and 5. All but the Trench 5 sherd, which was from a pipkin, were from jugs. There were no fused masses of wasters, however and the collection has more the appearance of material from a waster dump than from a kiln itself. Several different vessel types were represented (Table 3) but the majority were either from jugs or from closed vessels which might have been either jugs or jars.

Eleven rim sherds were present. Of these 7 were complete enough for classification. All were triangular with the flat top either sloping inwards or outwards. The necks of these vessels were either plain or horizontally grooved. A single example with an outward sloping rim had finger-tip impressions at the outer rim edge.

Thirteen jug sherds came from handles or handle evidence for handles. Where the handle form could be established it was a strap handle with grooves down the back. In the six examples where the number of grooves could be established it ranged from 3 to 6, with two examples each of 3- and 4-grooved handles. Most of the base sherds were plain, knife-trimmed and either flat or only slightly sagging. Single examples with splayed bases and with continuous, slightly overlapping thumbing were present.

Decoration was scarce but 7 jug sherds with wavy combed lines on the body were present. A single example of a twisted half-handle consisting of two twisted rods of clay secured with thumb impressions was found. The most unusual decoration consisted of two sherds from a bowl with incided black letter script, possibly combined with heraldry. Twelve sherds had evidence for knife-trimming, of which most probably came from the base or the lower body of jugs. The glaze varied in colour from yellows to olive and green hues but in most cases seems to have taken its colour from the iron in the clay body. There is evidence for the use of copper in the glaze in at least 64 examples, however.

Unfortunately, since these sherds come from a site with evidence for occupation from the late 12<sup>th</sup>/13<sup>th</sup> century through to the end of the medieval period and where sherds with no evidence for flaws might be domestic waste it is difficult to be certain about the date of the pottery production. We can, however, be certain that the most common form produced was the jug and that these jugs had strap handles with grooved backs. The vessels also generally had simple knife-cut bases and triangular rims with and without horizontal grooving around the neck, wavy combing on the body and sometimes twisted half-handles. These features are sufficient to identify the production as a Hambleton Ware industry (1992, 30-31), which is dated in York to the later 14<sup>th</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup> centuries.

#### **Post-medieval**

Ninety-one sherds of pottery could be dated to the post-medieval period (Table 4). Although the highest number of sherds is of Staffordshire slipware (STSL) the majority of these probably come from a single vessel, sherds of which were found in trenches 2. 3. 5 and 6. This vessel is of a type produced first in the 1680s but still being made and used in the early 18<sup>th</sup> century. Likewise, 11 sherds come from a Ryedale ware cup. The wares can be divided into those which definitely pre-date the establishment of Castle Howard,, those which might be contemporary with its establishment and those which post-date it.

The first group consists of Cistercian ware cups, a Frechen stoneware bottle, of 17<sup>th</sup>-century type, and possibly some of the Ryedale ware.

The second group consists of some of the Ryedale ware (for example the cup), the Staffordshire brown stoneware, the Staffordshire mottled ware and the Staffordshire slipware.

The third group consists of an Agate ware bowl of mid 18<sup>th</sup>-century date, a Chinese Export Porcelain bowl, a locally-produced flowerpot (PMLOC), an English white saltglazed stoneware bowl (SWSG)

and a tin-glazed ointment pot (TGW). This third group is small but it is notably that it contains several sherds of high quality finewares.

#### **Early Modern**

Although 226 sherds of pottery of late 18<sup>th</sup> century or later date were recovered (Table 5), most of these were flowerpots. The remaining sherds were of common types: Creamware (CREA), a Derbyshire stoneware blackleading bottle (DERBS), an unidentified English stoneware bottle (ENGS), Pearlware (PEAR), Transfer-printed ware (TPW) and a Selzer bottle of Westerwald stoneware. Nothing in this collection reflects the grandeur of Castle Howard and one might suggest that at this period the only pottery entering the ground on the excavated sites was associated with gardening and gardeners.

#### Assessment

#### Trench 1

Most of the deposits in this trench produced early modern pottery, mainly flowerpots. The one exception was context 105 which contained a single sherd of North Yorkshire Whiteware. Amongst the residual medieval pottery in this trench were examples of the three late 12<sup>th</sup>/early 13<sup>th</sup>-century glazed wares (Table 6).

#### Trench 2

Trench 2 produced the highest quantity of late 12<sup>th</sup>/early 13<sup>th</sup>-century pottery found in any of the trenches. Of these, only the sherds in contexts 217 and 218 were not associated with later types. That in context 211 contains a single sherd of early modern flowerpot whilst context 209 contains 16<sup>th</sup>-century Cistercian ware. Context 202 contains material contemporary with the construction of Castle Howard. Context 203 contains mid 18<sup>th</sup>-century Agate ware bowl sherds and 201 contains early modern flowerpots and other wares.

#### Trench 3

Two contexts in Trench 3 produced pottery assemblages. That from context 305 contains wares contemporary with the construction of Castle Howard and that from 302 contains mainly flowerpots of early modern date.

#### Trench 4

Fifteen contexts in Trench 4 produced assemblages of pottery. Much of this pottery was North Yorkshire Whiteware and most of these sherds are likely to be production waste. Other late medieval wares include the Langewehe stoneware ((414) and Humber ware (416 and 424). A sherd of Ryedale ware from context 424 may be intrusive or date this context to the 16<sup>th</sup>/17<sup>th</sup> century. There is other 16<sup>th</sup>/17<sup>th</sup> century pottery from this trench, but all in contexts which also contain early modern wares (401, 402, 403 and 412). Archaeological judgement is required to decide whether the odd sherds of flowerpot date these deposits or are intrusive as a result of horticultural activity.

#### Trench 5

Two contexts (506 and 514) in Trench 5 produced only late medieval pottery (in once case, 514, alongside earlier wares). Contexts 512 and 516 produced sherds of the same STSL posset pot as was found in other trenches, dating roughly to the construction period of Castle Howard. The remaining contexts (501, 502, 503, 504, 505, 507 and 521) produced sherds of early modern flowerpot and other wares (Table 9).

#### **Trench 6**

Three contexts in Trench 6 produced pottery assemblages. Those from 601 and 603 only contained North Yorkshire Whiteware whilst that from 604 produced sherds of the STSL posset pot, also found in Trench 5 and dating roughly to the period of construction of Castle Howard.

#### **Chronological assessment**

If one discounts the sherds of North Yorkshire whiteware from this site as being production waste then there is actually a very small quantity of medieval and early post-medieval pottery from the site, ranging in date from the late 12<sup>th</sup>/early 13<sup>th</sup> century to the 17<sup>th</sup> century. Only Trench 2 may have actually found strata of 12<sup>th</sup>/13<sup>th</sup>-century date whilst Trench 4 may have encountered part of a late medieval waster heap. Elsewhere the pre-Castle Howard material occurs in later or contaminated contexts and whilst it may have been intact medieval/early post-medieval stratigraphy which has been contaminated during the construction and use of Castle Howard it is also possible that it has been moved over considerable distances as part of the landscaping of the site.

A horizon associated with the construction of Castle Howard may be recognised through the presence of sherds of a single Staffordshire slipware posset pot in several trenches, where these are not also associated with later wares. This horizon might contain contexts 202, 512, 516 and 604. Since the posset pot can in all probability be dated by its context it should be drawn as a aid to the study of these vessels elsewhere (such vessels were traded around the world). Likewise, it seems likely that the Ryedale ware cup is also associated with this event and this too should be illustrated.

All other deposits on the site contain pottery contemporary with the use of Castle Howard. In most cases these contain flowerpot sherds. Context 203, containing sherds of an Agate ware bowl of mid 18<sup>th</sup> century date, may be earlier than the majority of these later deposits since it contains no types which must date to the late 18<sup>th</sup> century or later.

#### **Pottery production**

The pottery production debris from this site is of considerable interest and all illustratable sherds should be drawn and published. Fifty four sherds have been selected for illustration. The fabric of the

vessels should also be characterised using chemical analysis in order to identify examples of Castle Howard products on consumer sites.
