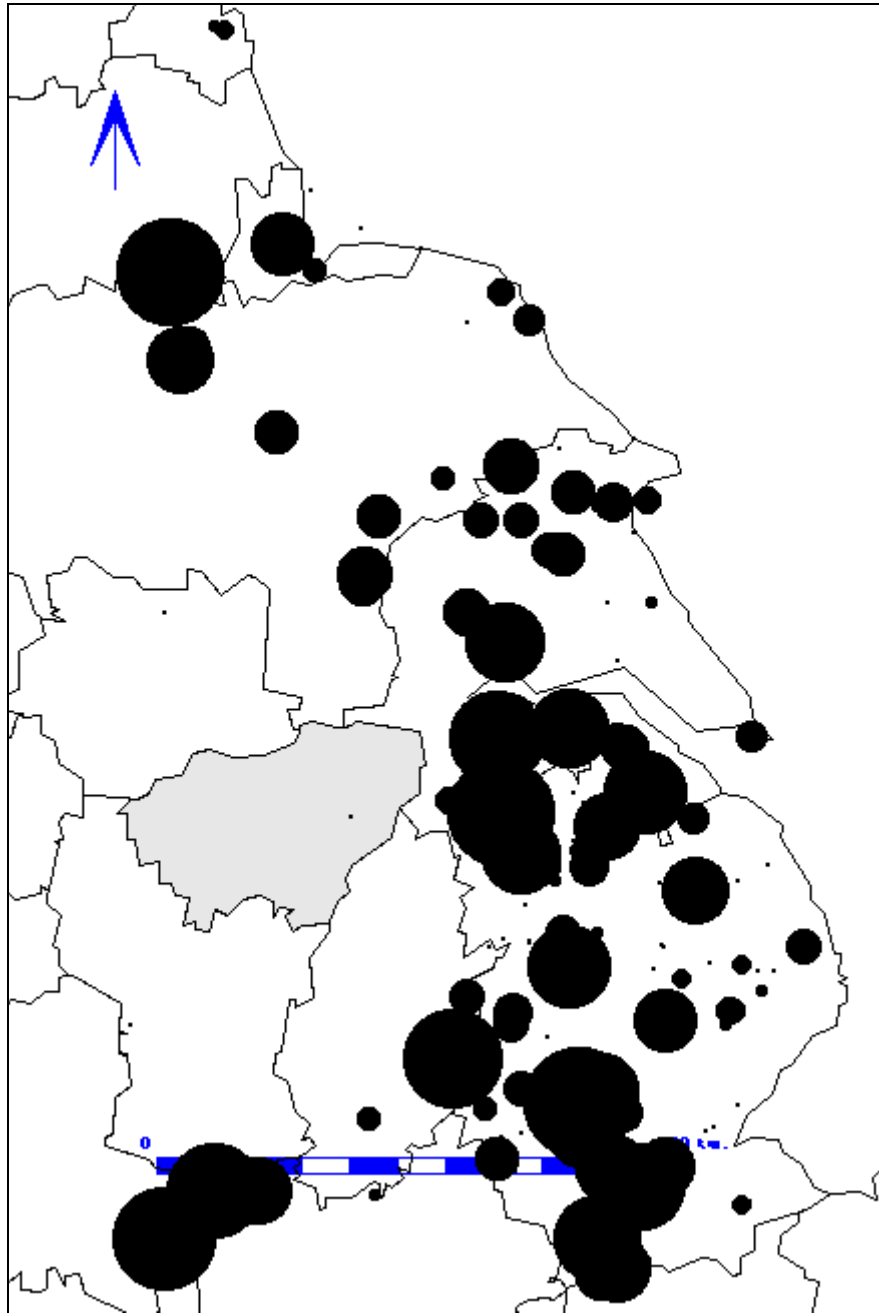
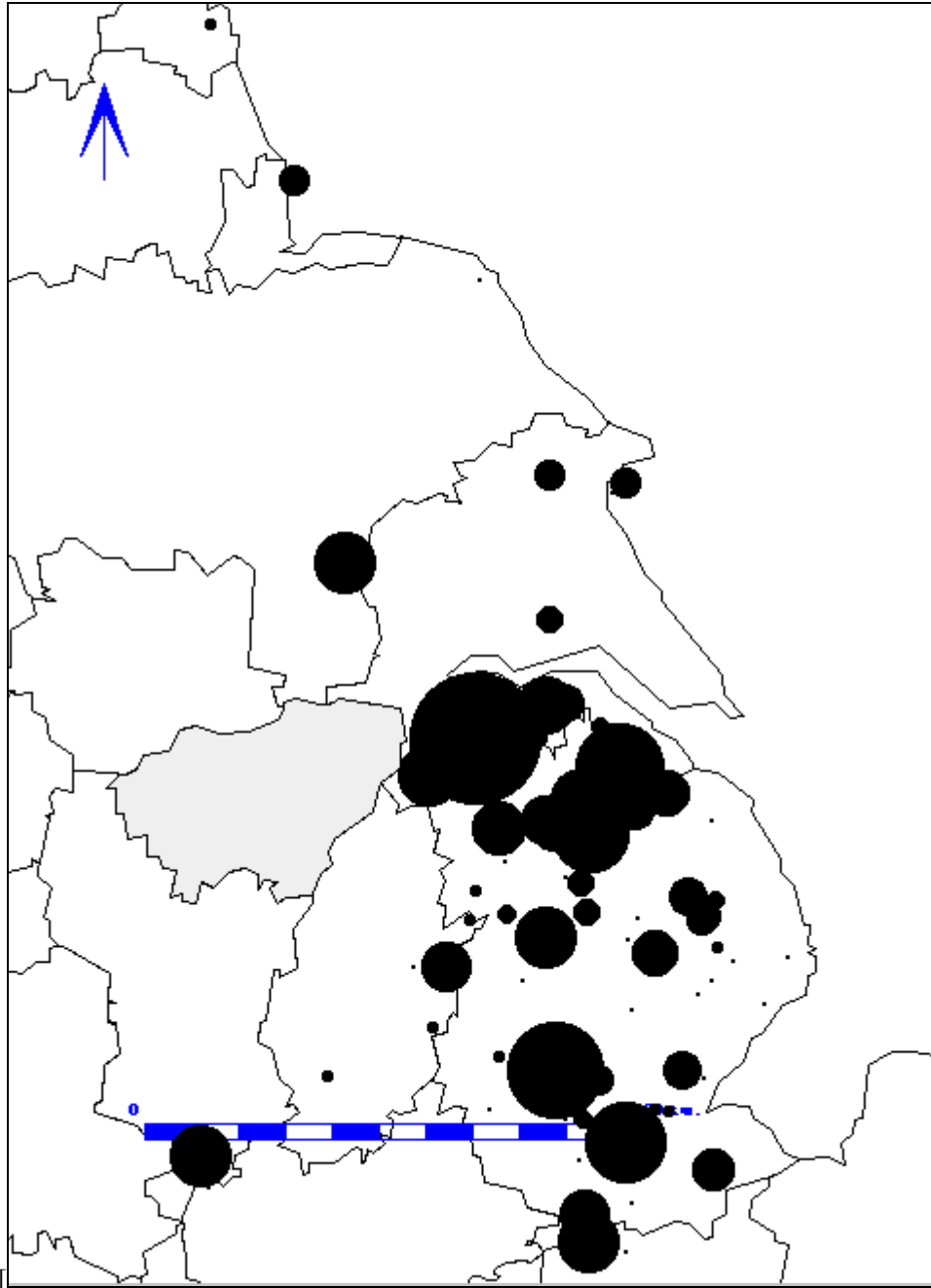
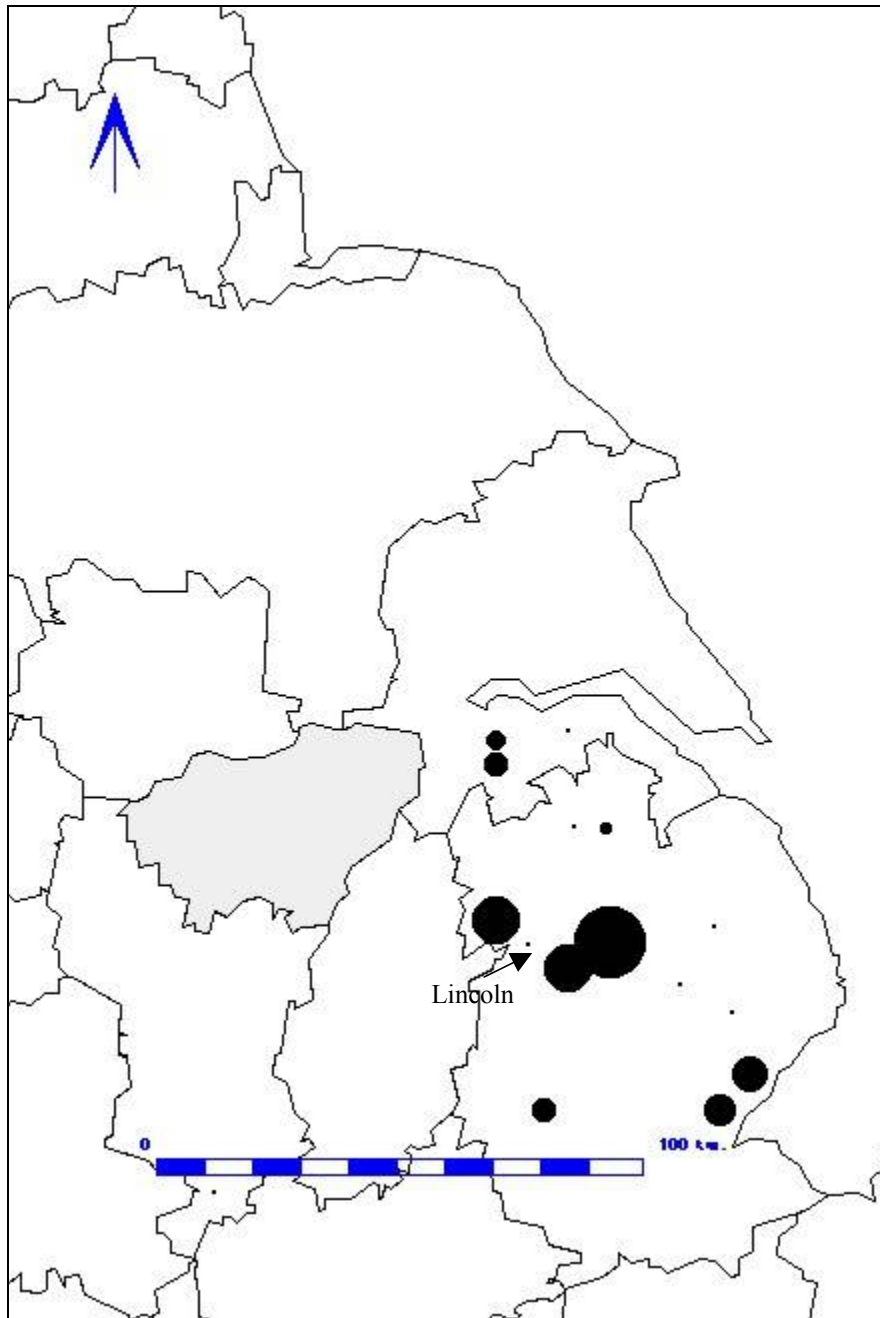


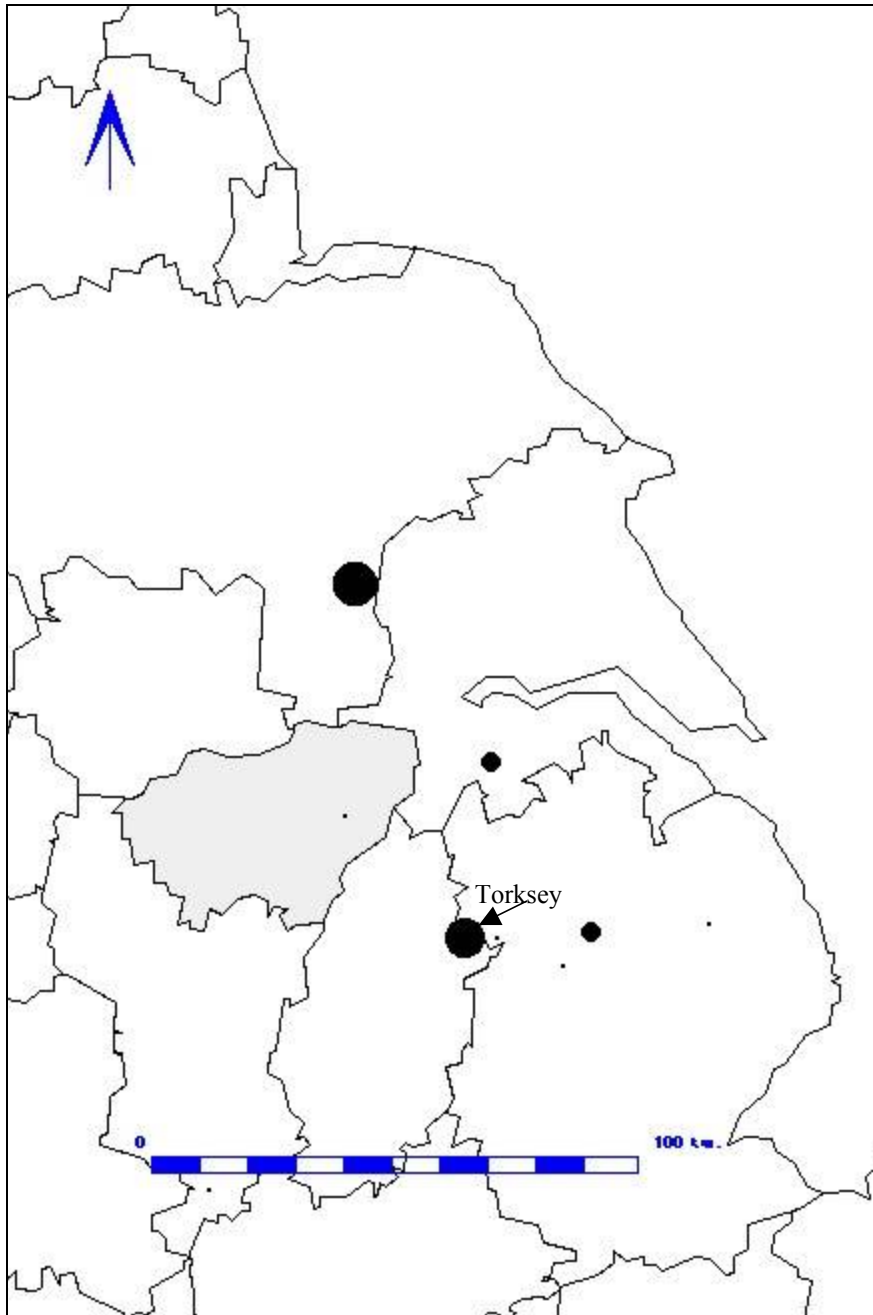
Figure 1 Distribution of 5<sup>th</sup>- to 7<sup>th</sup>-century pottery in the east midlands and northern Britain



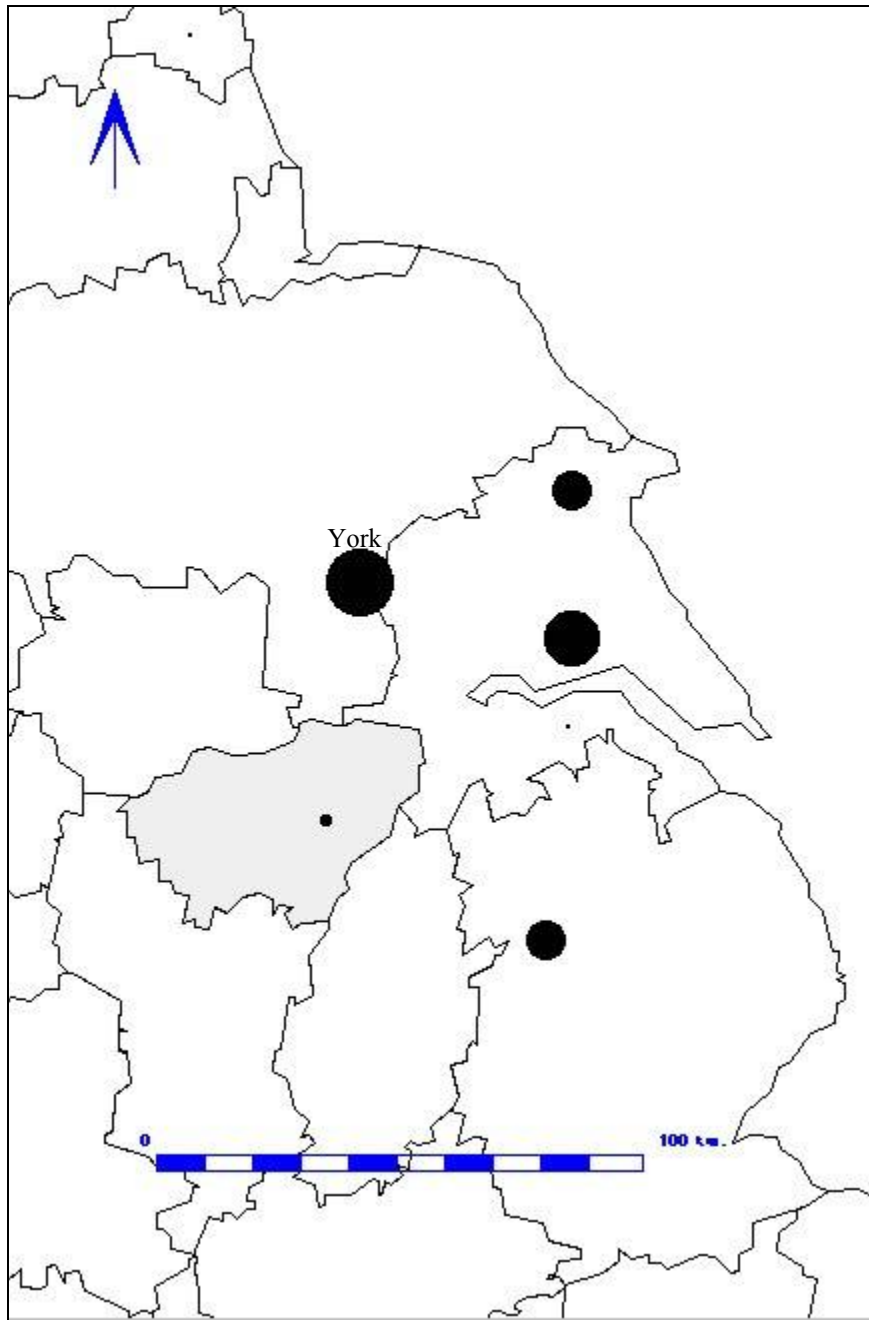
**Figure 2 Distribution of Northern Maxey-type ware, Ipswich ware and mid Saxon imports in northern England**



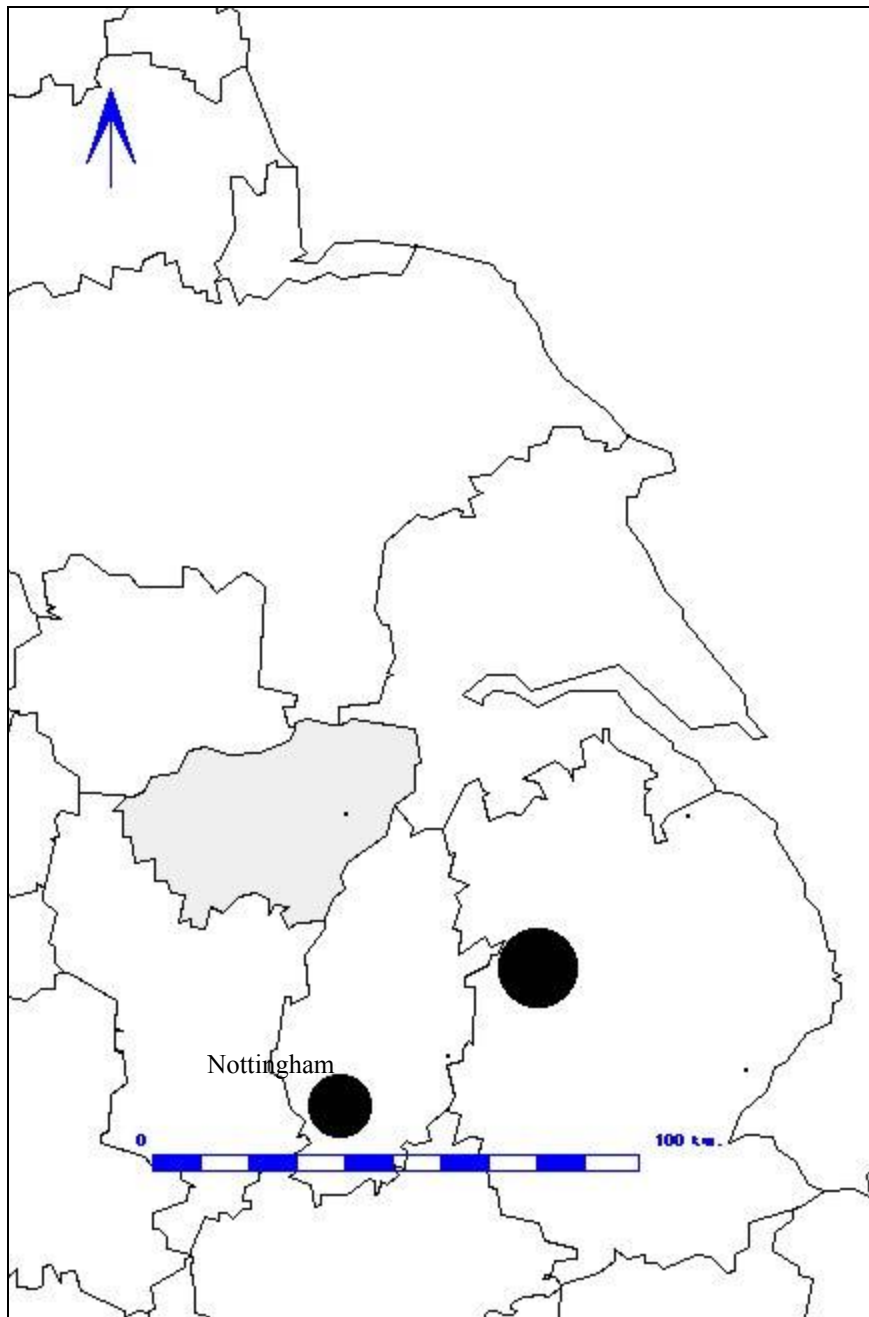
**Figure 3 Distribution of Late 9<sup>th</sup>/early 10<sup>th</sup>-century Lincoln products in the East Midlands and Northern Britain**



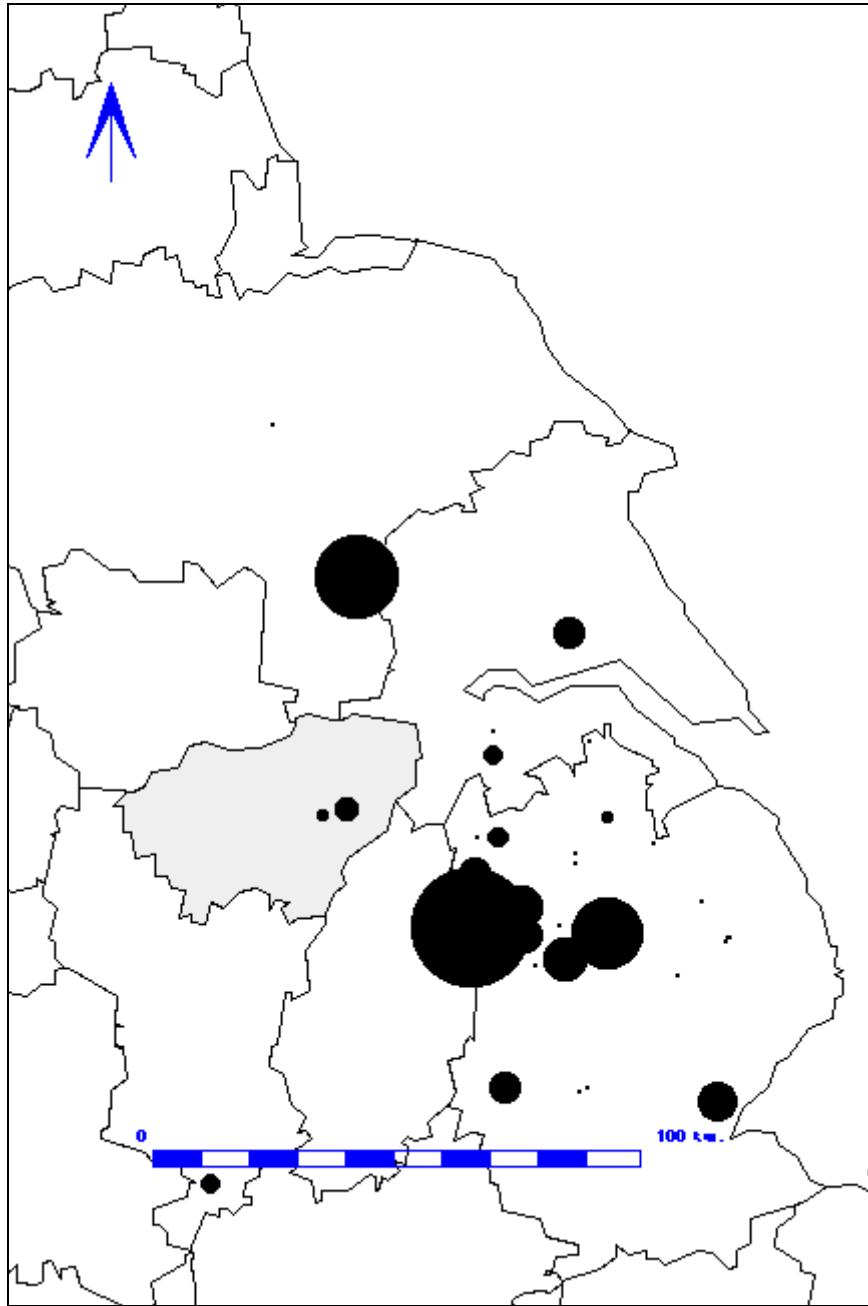
**Figure 4 Distribution of Roller-stamp decorated Torksey ware in the East Midlands and Northern Britain**



**Figure 5 Distribution of York A and York D wares in the East Midlands and Northern Britain**

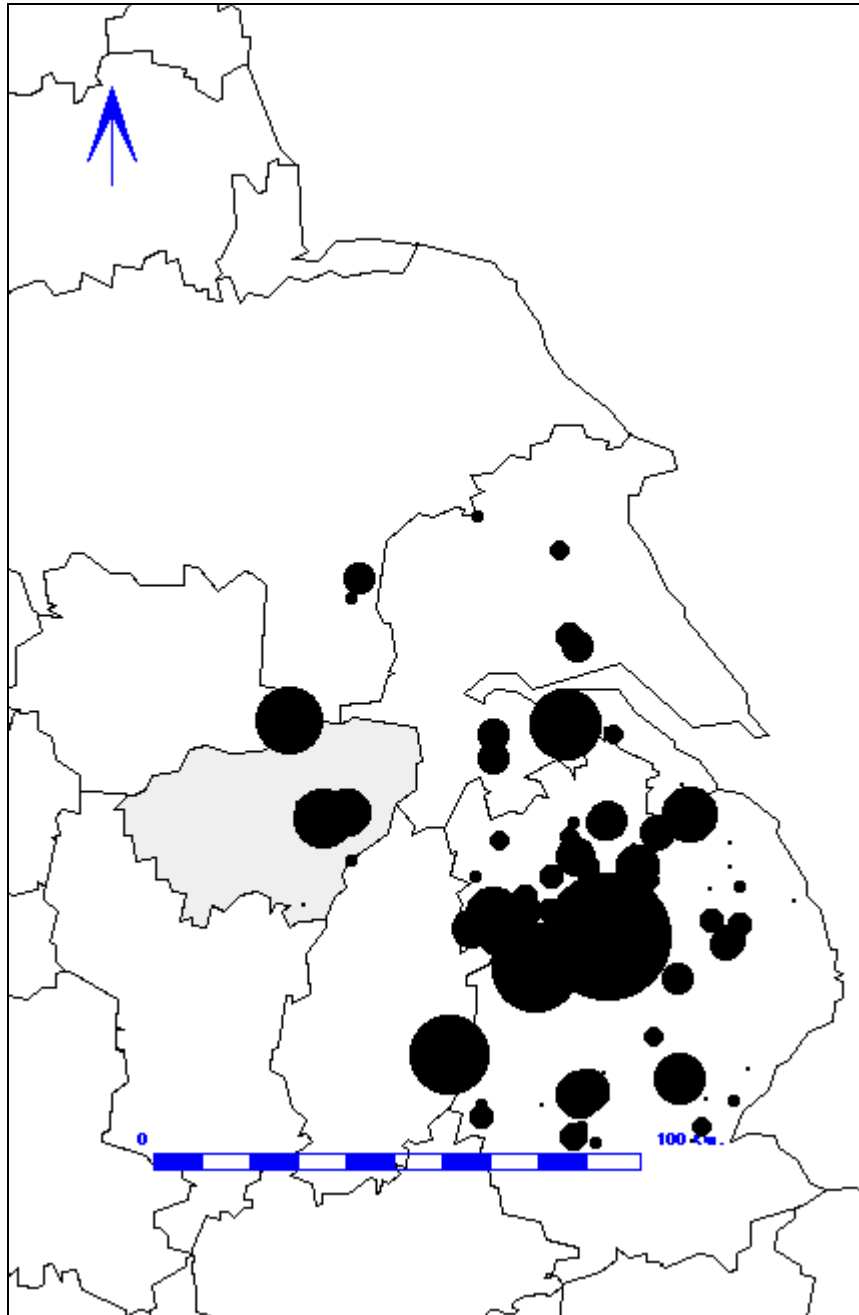


**Figure 6 Distribution of Nottingham Late Saxon Sandy ware (NOTTS) in the East Midlands and Northern Britain**

**Figure 8 Distribution of Lincoln Fine-Shelled ware (LFS) in the East Midlands and Northern Britain**

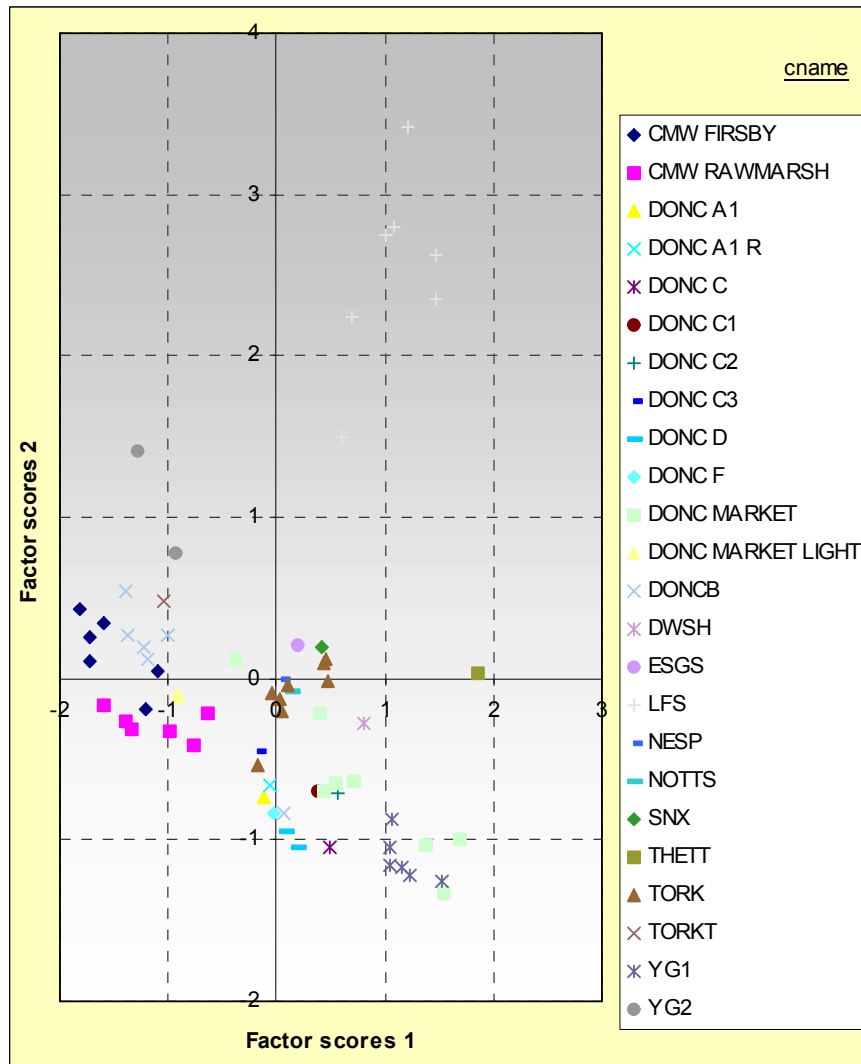

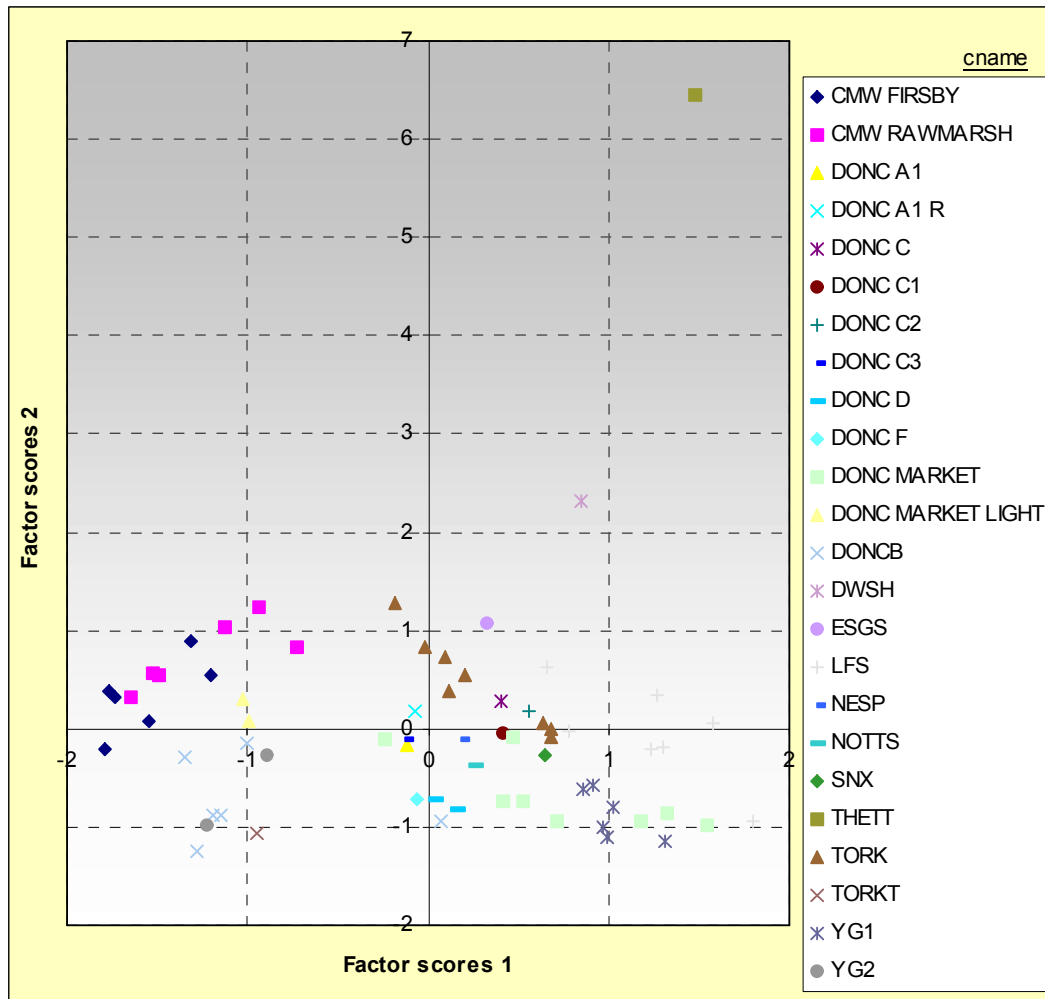

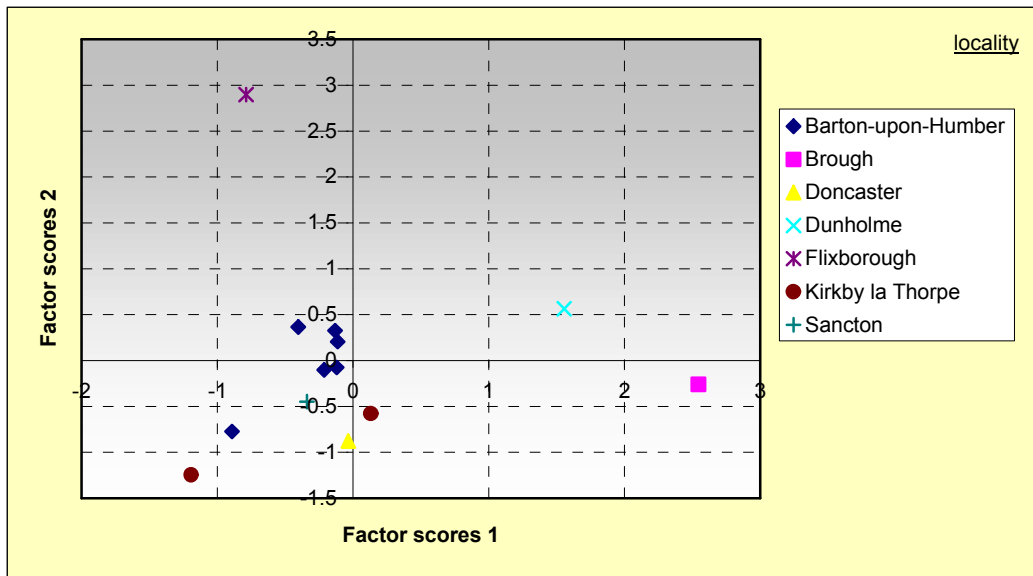

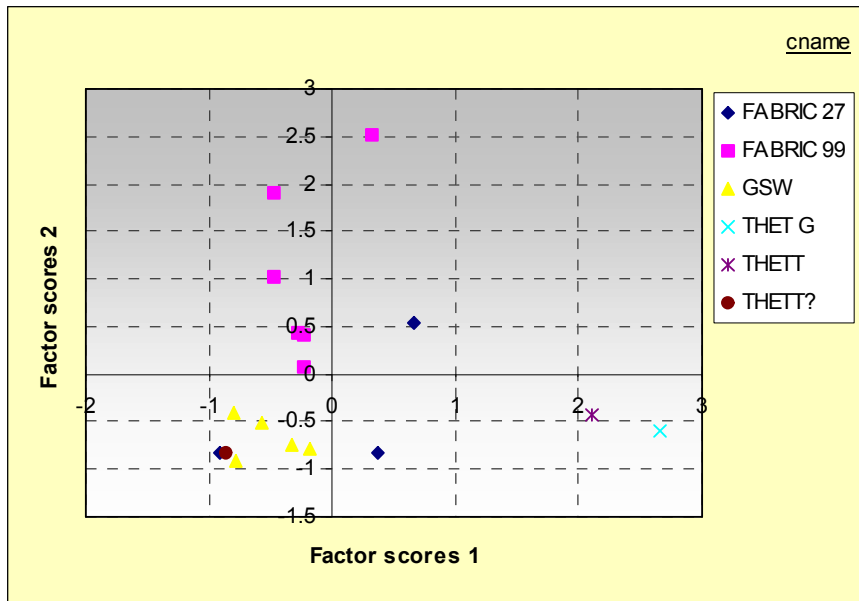

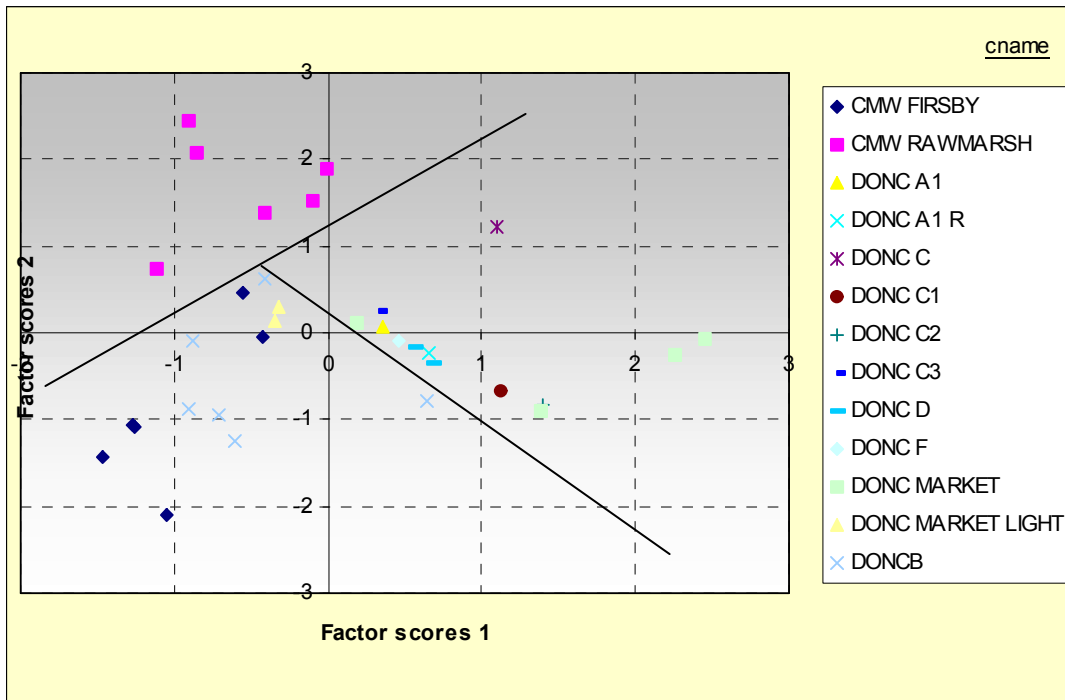
