Assessment of the Finds from 15-17 Walmgate, York (OSA05 WB25)

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A moderate-sized collection of pottery, clay tobacco pipes and other finds from an archaeological watching brief carried out at 15-17 Walmgate, York, by On-Site Archaeology was submitted to the authors for identification and assessment.

The finds include a small quantity of later medieval pottery, some apparently stratified in late medieval deposits, post-medieval pottery, much of which appears to have been re-deposited, but as coherent groups, and early modern pottery, none of which need be later than the late 18th century.

Description

One hundred and forty-six finds were submitted, representing no more than 1129 objects and weighing, in total, 3.046Kg. A single fragment of ceramic building material was submitted for identification, a tin-glazed tile. The remaining ceramic building material has been identified and assessed elsewhere. The finds catalogue is included here as Appendix 2 together with a list of the fabric code used (Appendix 1).

Ceramic Building Material

A fragment of a tin-glazed tile was recorded from context 2031. The thickness identifies it as a wall tile of later 17th to mid 18th-century date. The fragment is too small to identify the design, which was applied in blue paint and is probably a scene within a circular border.

Clay Tobacco Pipes

Twenty-three fragments of clay tobacco pipe were recorded. These include two heeled bowls of early to mid 17th-century date; two bowls of mid/late 17th-century character with slightly splayed heels, one 18th-century bowl, one 19th-century decorated bowl with a shield on the side, a 19th-century bowl decorated with Masonic symbols; a 19th-century bowl with leaf-decorated seams; a light green glazed mouthpiece (probably of 18th or 19th-century date) and the heel of a pipe stamped AB.

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Copper Alloy

A copper alloy coin was recorded from context 1020. It is covered with corrosion products and cannot be identified without either investigative cleaning or radiography.

Glass

The complete profile of a phial in light blue glass was recorded from context 1020. Such phials were first produced in the later half of the 17th century and are common in late 17th to mid 18th-century deposits, after which clear glass phials, often moulded and decorated, replaced them (Vince and Egan 1981).

Pottery

Medieval

Thirteen sherds of medieval pottery were recorded. They are of three fabrics: Brandsby-type ware (BRAN); Humberware (HUM) and Saintonge Mottled glazed ware (SAIM). Brandsby-type ware was first produced in the mid/late 13th century but continued to be produced throughout the medieval period, eventually being superceded by Ryedale ware. One of the sherds comes from a cistern with a spigot hole on the side, just above the base. This form was probably used for the brewing or dispensing of beer and is certainly more common in the later 14th century and later, coinciding with the spread of popularity of beer and the introduction of hops. Humberware is first found in York in the mid/late 14th century. Production waste has been found at Fishergate and Walmgate, although none of the sherds from this site appear to be wasters. Two of the sherds have a purple glaze (the result of overfiring an iron-rich slip). This technique is typical of the 16th century. Saintonge Mottled glazed ware was first produced in the mid 13th century but continued to be made throughout the 14th and 15th centuries, although later medieval examples often have little or no glaze.

Post-medieval

Eighty-seven sherds of post-medieval pottery were recorded. They range in date from types which were current in the 16th and early/mid 17th centuries (such as Frechen stoneware) to types which were current in the mid 18th century (including the complete profile of a refined redware tea cup with an internal white slip).

Joining sherds of a brown-slipped Staffordshire chamber pot made in a light-bodied fabric (STSL) were recovered from context 1019 in Trench 1 and 2010 and 2040 in Trench 2. Although it might be as early as the later 17th century (1670s onwards) brown slip, as opposed to a black slip, coloured with iron or manganese, is usually found on mid 18th-century Staffordshire light-bodied slipwares.

Early Modern

Nineteen sherds of late 18th-century or later pottery were recorded. They include types present from the later part of the 18th century (Creamware – CREA, Pearlware – PEAR, Transfer-printed ware – TPW) and types which appeared first in the mid 19th century (Buff ware – NCBW and Miscellaneous Whiteware – WHITE). Two fragments of transfer-printed teapot from contexts 1018 and 1020 appear to come from the same vessel, although they do not join.

Assessment

Trench 1

Finds were recovered from six contexts in Trench 1. The earliest of these was context 1024, a dumped deposit. This deposit produced six sherds ranging from late medieval to early post-medieval in date. The latest types present were Midlands Yellow ware (aka Reversed Cistercian ware – MY), Late Humberware – LHUM, Glazed Red Earthenware – GRE and Frechen stoneware – FREC. The Frechen sherd appears to come from a Belarmine bottle, although no diagnostic features to confirm this identification were present. If so, then an early to mid 17th-century or later deposition date can be assigned to the dump. If not, then a later 16th century or later date would be given.

The next assemblages in the stratigraphic sequence are 1001, a brick wall, which produced a sherd of Nottingham Stoneware bowl, probably of later 18th or 19th-century date, and 1018, a dump which produced a mixed assemblage composed of 17th-century and late 18th-century (or later) wares.

The next three assemblages all come from silts: 1019; 1020 and 1023. Context 1019 produced six sherds of post-medieval and early modern date. The latest type present is a Creamware tankard. Context 1020 produced nine sherds of pottery, including the Refined Redware cup and Transfer Printed Ware teapot, both of which could be of late 18th-century date; the glass phial, probably of mid 18th-century date; a pipe bowl fragment decorated with a shield and the copper alloy coin. The latest type in the assemblage is the decorated pipe bowl. City arms are commonly found on clay pipes of the early 19th century but probably not before c.1820. The assemblage from context 1023 is much earlier, forming a coherent group

of 17th-century date. However, it appears from the stratigraphy that the entire assemblage is residual.

The latest assemblage, stratigraphically, comes from context 1022. As with context 1023, the assemblage contains no types which have to date later than the 17th century.

Trench 2

Six contexts in Trench 2 produced finds assemblages. The earliest of these comes from context 2058, a collapsed oven, which produced a sherd of Brandsby-type ware cistern, probably of later 14th to 15th-century date.

The next assemblage came from context 2031, a dumped deposit. The assemblage, which includes the tin-glazed wall tile, consists mainly of post-medieval pottery, of which the latest types date to the late 17th century.

Two assemblages come from the foundation trenches of brick walls. That from context 2040 includes a mid 18th-century Staffordshire slipware sherd with cross links to contexts 2010 and 1018 and a clay pipe stem whose bore diameter suggests an 18th-century date. That from context 2042 contains mid 18th century pottery, including a rim sherd from a scratch-blue decorated white Saltglazed vessel (SWSG) and a tin-glazed plate of late 17th to mid 18th-century character (it has no foot ring). Alongside these sherds, however, is a clay pipe bowl with Masonic symbols. This pipe is probably of 19th-century date.

The next assemblage comes from context 2038, a silty sand deposit overlying a cobbled surface, 2017. The pottery assemblage includes 18th-century and late 18th-century or later types. A glazed clay pipe mouthpiece came from the same deposit.

Finally, an assemblage came from context 2010, the fill of a modern pit which contained demolition debris. The pottery from this feature is a coherent group of mid 18th-century date. The latest types are a press-moulded dish with trailed slip decoration and a Staffordshire slipware chamber pot with cross links to contexts 1019 and 2040. Presumably, the whole assemblage is redeposited and therefore residual.

Further Work

The glass phial should be drawn as it is not a standard shape. The scratch-blue decorated stoneware jar rim should also be drawn, as it too is an unusual form (not present, for example, in a large group of white Saltglazed scratch-blue-decorated wasters from Burslem recently assessed by one of the authors). The complete profile of the Refined Redware cup should also be drawn as it too is an unusual type.

The coin should be x-rayed in the hope that this will allow it to be identified.
