

Assessment of the Pottery from Charlie Brown's, Bootham, York (CBY'06)

A small collection of pottery from an archaeological evaluation at Charlie Brown's, Bootham, York, undertaken by Field Archaeology Specialists, was submitted for identification and assessment. The finds include a small quantity of Roman pottery, a small quantity of later 11th to 13th century pottery and a large amount of later medieval pottery. Later 15th-century and later finds, including clay tobacco pipes, were also present, but in smaller quantities.

Description

The submitted finds consist of one piece of ceramic building material (not assessed), 21 pieces of clay tobacco pipe and 305 sherds of pottery. The finds were quantified by sherd count (Nosh), the maximum number of vessels present in a context (NoV) and weight in grams (Table 1).

The pottery was classified according to the systems employed by York Archaeological Trust (Monaghan 1997; Holdsworth 1978; Brooks 1987; Mainman 1993).

Clay Tobacco Pipes

Twenty-one fragments of clay tobacco pipe were recovered. All but two were unmarked stem fragments. These could be roughly dated by visual examination of the bore diameter. Six have wide bores, typical of early to mid 17th-century pipes, three had intermediate bore diameters, typical of later 17th to mid 18th century pipes and eight had narrow bore diameters typical of the late 18th and 19th centuries.

Two bowls were present. One, a small bowl from a heeled pipe, probably dating to the period 1600-1640. The other bowl is probably slightly later, c.1640-60 and has a shield-shaped heel.

Pottery

Roman

Eight sherds of Roman pottery were recovered (Table 2). They are mostly of late 1st to mid 3rd century date but include one fragment of a Crambeck greyware jar (YATB12) with obtuse lattice burnishing. This is of late 3rd or 4th century date.

The vessels present are mostly jars but include one lid and the Samian Dr37 bowl.

Late 11th to 13th century

No pottery of Anglo-Saxon or Anglo-Scandinavian date was found and the earliest medieval pottery is York Gritty ware, which can only be broadly dated from the mid 11th to the mid 13th centuries. In total, 22 sherds earlier than the late 14th century were present (Table 3). Some of these are of types which probably did not continue in use into the 13th century and these therefore provide evidence for some activity in the later 12th century. However, all of these sherds were recovered from later deposits and need not have come onto the site until later (although most likely there were disturbed from earlier deposits too deep to be investigated during the archaeological work).

The pottery consists of jars and jugs, with more jars than jugs. The vessels come from a variety of sources: West Yorkshire (YG and NGR); the Hambleton Hills (YORK); the York area (YSP); Beverley (BEVO2B) and Lincolnshire (LFS). This is a typical range for later 12th and early 13th-century York.

Later 14th to 15th century

One hundred and forty-two sherds of pottery of later 14th or 15th-century date were recovered (Table 4). The majority of these were whitewares of Brandsby-type ware and Hambleton ware, both produced in the Hambleton Hills area (although wasters of Hambleton ware have been found at Castle Howard, further to the southeast). The next most common ware consists of Humberware, probably mostly produced in York itself but possibly including vessels from other production centres, such as West Cowick and Holme-upon-Spalding Moor. Two sherds of Dutch Red Earthenware were the only non-local wares present.

Of those sherds whose form could be determined, the majority were jugs (81/111), followed by jars (25 sherds), cups (3, 2 of which were lobed) and unglazed drinking jugs (2).

Late 15th to mid 18th-century

Eighty six sherds of post-medieval pottery were recovered (Table 5). These ranged in date from the late 15th or early 16th century to the mid 18th century. Included here are a few of types which continued in use in to the later 18th and 19th centuries (such as Nottingham Stoneware, NOTS).

The range of vessel forms represented in this collection is wider than in the preceding period, and consists mainly of bowls, cups, jars, and dishes. Examples of pancheons, plates, chamber pots, drinking jugs, bottles, posset pots and teapots were present. This range is typical of post-medieval pottery in York and perhaps the only point of note is the low quantity of imported wares, consisting in this case of a sherd from a Raeren stoneware mug (later 154th to mid 16th century) and a sherd from a Westerwald stoneware chamber pot (mid 18th century).

Late 18th century and later

Twenty-two sherds of later 18th or 19th-century date were recovered (Table 6). Creamware was the most common type, followed by Transfer-Printed and Pearlwares. This suggests a late 18th or early 19th century date for most of the pottery. Most of the sherds come from plates (14 out of 22) with examples of jars, bowls, cups, chamber pots, and tankards.

Assessment

The pottery comes from three separate trenches.

Intervention 1

Pottery was recovered from two horizontal deposits, C1034 (the lowest excavated deposit) and C1032, which was one of a number of successive layers. The pottery suggests a deposition date of late 18th century or later for C1034 and 19th century for C1032. Culvert F13 was sealed by C1034 and produced late medieval pottery (C1062). Ditch F9 was stratigraphically later than C1032 and produced late 18th-century or later finds but can be dated to the 19th century by its relationship to C1032.

Intervention 2

The lowest excavated layer in Intervention 2, C1056, produced late 14th-century or later pottery. A subsequent horizontal layer, C1053, produced pottery of later 17th century or later date and was cut by a post hole, F6, which produced late 15th-century or later finds (C1021), presumably residual unless the late finds in C1053 are intrusive. A subsequent post hole, F4, and a ditch F5 which cuts the post hole, F5, produced late 18th-century or later finds (C1019 and C1020 respectively).

Intervention 3

The earliest pottery from Intervention 3 comes from layers into which pits and linear features were cut. The earliest layer, C1074, produced pottery of 15th-century or later date whilst the pits produced finds of late 15th century or later date, with one pit, F17 producing a mixed assemblage containing mainly late 14th-century or later date and one sherd of late 16th century or later date (C1073).

A subsequent layer, C1064/C1065, included late 17th century or later date, but was cut by a pit, F15, which produced an early 17th-century clay tobacco pipe (C1070), and a pit, F12, which produced finds of late 15th-century or later date (C1052).

These deposits were cut by the brick foundations of a public house, known to be on the site in the 19th century. These contained finds of early 18th century or later date (Wall F1 (C1046); Wall F2).

A layer post-dating the foundations produced 19th-century finds whilst subsequent layers produced finds of late 17th or later and early 18th-century or later date (C1005 and C1002).

Discussion

Since none of the interventions reached natural deposits and the earliest deposits found in each trench date to the later medieval period (culvert F13 and layers C1056 and C1074) it is impossible to say anything about the start of suburban development along Bootham from this site. The quantity of late medieval pottery and its condition indicates that the street frontage was already occupied by this date and the finds suggest continuous activity from this period onwards. The brick structure revealed in Intervention 3 can be dated to the early 18th century or later on the basis of the pottery.

Pottery earlier than the later 14th century was uncommon and whilst some are quite small and abraded, other sherds are fresh. However, the site is so close to the fortress that these sherds might easily have come onto the site with make-up or other dumping, centuries after the pots were discarded.

The later medieval and post-medieval finds include no large assemblages and are probably mainly the result of material being discarded on middens which were subsequently dug into the soil. The only exception to this is the late 14th-century material, which is not only present in relatively large groups from the earliest levels but is also found redeposited in subsequent deposits. This suggests that there may have been a major period of site re-organisation in the later 14th or 15th century.

Retention

All of the finds come from stratified deposits and should be retained for future study.

Further work

None of the finds require further treatment at this stage.
