# Assessment of some finds from Market Place, Mansfield, Nottinghamshire (MPM05)

A small number of finds from archaeological fieldwork at Market Place, Mansfield, Nottinghamshire, undertaken by Pre-Construct Archaeology (Lincoln) Ltd were submitted for identification and assessment. The finds consist of clay tobacco pipe stems and fragments of post-medieval glass, of late 17<sup>th</sup> century or later date.

#### Description

## **Clay Tobacco Pipe**

Two clay pipe stems were submitted. Neither is decorated and both have bore diameters consistent with a late 17<sup>th</sup>-century or 18<sup>th</sup>-century date.

## Glass

A fragment of window glass and a dark green bottle were submitted. The window glass consists of an almost complete square pane with a light blue tinge to the glass. The pane had been scored and snapped. Square-paned windows with glass of this type first appeared in the later 17<sup>th</sup> century and continued to be used until at least the middle of the 18<sup>th</sup> century. The bottle glass consists of the lower body and base of a bottle with a conical lower body, similar to that found today in some liqueur bottles (e.g. De Kuyper cherry brandy). The degree of weathering and colour suggest a mid 17<sup>th</sup> to mid 18<sup>th</sup>-century date but this is not a common form at that time. The closest form would be the "shaft-and-globe" form, current from c.1650 to c.1670.

#### Assessment

The site produced a post-medieval well and investigation included the fill of the well, its construction trench fill and lining and the deposits through which the well was cut. The finds are consistent with a post-medieval date.

The finds should be retained for potential future study but no further study is recommended. The glass will require a conservation assessment and appropriate packaging.
