Assessment of finds from the Rabbit-Proof Fence, Byland Abbey (BLA'07)

A moderate quantity of pottery, clay tobacco pipes and ceramic building material was recovered from an archaeological watching brief carried out during the construction of a rabbit-proof fence around the ancient monument of Byland Abbey, North Yorkshire, carried out by Field Archaeology Associates Ltd. The finds range in date from the later 12th or 13th century to the late 18th to 20th centuries and include one fragment of probable kiln waste which is further evidence for the existence of a pottery production site in the area in the medieval period.

Description

Ceramic Building Material

Two fragments of ceramic building material were recovered. One is too small to identify and the other is a fragment of cylindrical field drain of mid 19th century or later date.

Clay Tobacco Pipes

Eight fragments of clay tobacco pipe were recovered. Two have bore diameters which suggest a later 17th to 18th-century date. One bowl is of similar date, having a bulbous bowl and pronounced circular heel. A band of triangular rouletting runs around the rim. General size suggests a date in the late 17th century. The remaining fragments are of later 18th or 19th century date and include one small rounded bowl with a moulded foliage heel.

Fired clay

A single fragment of fired clay was recovered. The fragment shows no sign of deliberate forming but is coated with a thick glaze and has a single scar from a whiteware vessel attached. It was probably used in a pottery kiln to support or separate vessels. Pottery wasters of later 12th to 13th-century date have been previously recovered from the Byland Abbey site and this is possibly associated with that production. Thin section and chemical analysis would enable the clay to be compared with that of the pottery fragments, which have been analysed (Vince 2007).

Pottery

Medieval

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Fifteen sherds of medieval pottery were recovered. Three of these are of York Glazed ware (YORK) which was produced locally in the later 12th to mid 13th centuries, as demonstrated by the wasters mentioned above. The remainder were of Brandsby-type ware, also produced in the Hambleton Hills area, from the later 13th to the 15th century. One of the York Glazed ware sherds is possibly a piece of kiln furniture and comes from a slab of clay with glaze over the edges. The remaining sherds are from jugs apart from one Brandsby-type sherd which might be from a jug or a bowl.

Post-medieval

Thirty-eight sherds of post-medieval pottery were recovered. Some are of types which cannot be closely dated, such as blackware (BL) or glazed red earthenware (GRE). Others probably date from the earlier part of the period, from the later 16th to the mid 17th centuries. These include Ryedale ware and Raeren stoneware (RAER), both which span the dissolution period, and Frechen stoneware (FREC) which is probably dissolution period or later. The remaining sherds are of later 17th to mid 18th-century types. They consist of London stoneware (LONS); Staffordshire embossed ware (STEM); Staffordshire mottled ware (STMO); Staffordshire light-bodied slipware (STSL) and white saltglazed stoneware. All three sherds of the latter ware are of an early type, made from a Coal Measure light-firing clay which was then covered with a thick white slip (SWSG SLIPPED). As a group, these later types are likely to be of early 18th-century date.

Early Modern

Twenty-eight sherds of later 18th and 19th-century wares were recorded. These include some vessels with sponged decoration which are probably of mid 19th century or later and include no sherds of Creamware. Therefore, as a group these sherds seem to date to the mid 19th century or later.

Assessment

Chronological interpretation

These finds could span the period from the later 12th to the 19th centuries. However, the quantity of later 12th to mid 13th-century material is very low and it is quite likely that no material earlier than the mid 13th century is actually present in the collection. Furthermore, there is a lack of Humberware, which might indicate that there is little material of later 14th or 15th-century date in the collection. On the other hand, the Byland area is at the extreme north-eastern fringe of the distribution of Humberware and, given the proximity to Brandsby, it is quite possible that the abbey was using Brandsby-type wares whilst areas further south and west were using predominantly Humberware.

There is a small amount of material which might date to the period of the dissolution but most of the post-medieval finds probably date to the later 17th and early 18th centuries. There is

then another possible gap in deposition, during the mid 18th to early 19th centuries followed by the final phase, which includes the one fragment of field drain.

Retention

All of the material should be retained for potential future study.

Further work

Analysis of the possible kiln furniture and glaze-covered fired clay would be able to confirm or reject the identification as well as supplying information on the character of the clay used to make kiln furniture and how that compared with the composition of the pottery itself.
