# Assessment of the Pottery and Clay Tobacco Pipes from Lucy Tower, Lincoln Castle, Lincoln (LCC'08)

# Jane Young, Alan Vince and Kate Steane

A small collection of pottery and clay pipe fragments was recovered from fieldwork undertaken by Field Archaeology Specialists Ltd at Lincoln Castle (Site Code: LCC'08).

The finds consist of medieval pottery, mainly of early 13<sup>th</sup>-century date, and post-medieval and later pottery and clay pipe fragments.

#### Description

# **Ceramic Building Material**

Ten fragments of ceramic building material were recovered. All were examined by Jane Young and compared with the Lincoln CBM fabric series.

Examples of five fabrics were present of which one, LSWA – Lincoln Glazed Ware Fabric A, is also a pottery fabric (Young and Vince 2005). The remainder are specific to ceramic building material and thin section analysis suggests that they were all produced in the city, probably at the tile house situated behind the church of St Botolph at the southern end of the Wigford suburb (2003).

All the fragments probably come from flat roof tiles and one, from C1010, has mortar attached and was clearly used, either in walling or roofing. The two LSWA fragments are both abraded which might suggest that they are earlier than the remainder.

The Tilehouse was operating from the mid 12<sup>th</sup> century into the 16<sup>th</sup> century.

## **Clay Tobacco Pipes**

Ten fragments of clay tobacco pipe were recovered. All were featureless stem fragments whose stem bore diameters suggest an 18<sup>th</sup> to 19<sup>th</sup> century date.

#### **Pottery**

#### Medieval

Eighteen sherds of medieval pottery were recovered. Two of these are shelly wares which probably did not continue in use into the 13<sup>th</sup> century (LEMS – Lincoln Early Medieval Shelly ware - and LFS – Lincoln Fine-Shelled ware). The remainder consist of sherds of LSWA from a variety of vessel types (all varieties of jug or pipkin). the latest types present date to the early 13<sup>th</sup> century. A single sherd of an unknown medieval ware bowl, probably of local origin (MEDLOC) was present.

#### Post-medieval

Two sherds of post-medieval blackware, both of Staffordshire type (ie made from mixed lightand red-firing Coal Measure clays) are either of post-medieval or early modern date.

# Early Modern

Two sherds of Nottingham stoneware (NOTS) are probably of later 18<sup>th</sup> century date and one sherd of buff ware is of early 19<sup>th</sup> century or later date (NCBW).

## Assessment

#### Intervention 1

Intervention 1 was dug to investigate a blocked opening on the west side of the tower. Two deposits produced finds considered here. C1005 was a buried soil assumed to be contemporary with foundation F2, although its direct relationship was removed by a 19<sup>th</sup>-century drain. This produced fragments of flat roof tile and pottery which as a group probably date to the early 13<sup>th</sup> century. This soil was covered by topsoil C1000 which produced finds which provide a TPQ of early 18<sup>th</sup>-century.

#### **Intervention 2**

Intervention 2 was dug to investigate a blocked opening on the east side of the tower. A stair head was found which led out of the tower, on the outside of the curtain wall. This was blocked and the blocking, C1010, produced pottery and tile consistent with an early 13<sup>th</sup> century or later date for the blocking. Topsoil in this trench, C1006, produced a mixture of medieval, post-medieval and early modern finds.

#### Retention

The finds should be retained for possible future re-examination.

#### **Further work**

No further work is recommended.
