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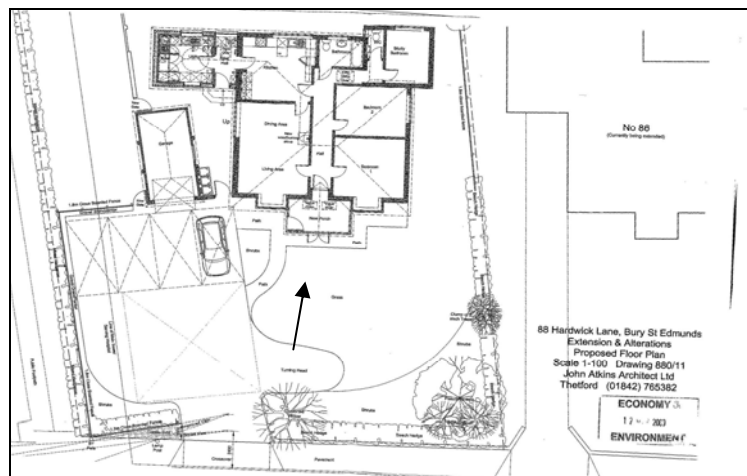

<b>SUMMARY OF FIELDWORK RESULTS:</b> (See also Fig) As the foundation raft for the front extension was only 200mm deep with a 350mm toe round the edge and therefore remained in a mid brown sandy subsoil and was too shallow to reveal any archaeological deposits if present.	
<b>Conclusion:</b> As noted above the ground disturbance was too shallow to reveal anything of interest, the larger side extension will be constructed at a later date.
