Wood - you will need lengths of timber, approx 75-100mm in diameter, that are as as possible for the upright posts of your roundhouse. You will also need plenty of thinner whities to weave in and out as wattling. Coppiced wood is ideal for this as it tends to grow nice and straight. Try contacting your local Wildlife Trusts to see if they have a source of coppiced wood on any of their reserves, or parents may by able to provide suitable lengths from

their gardens, it is worth asking around.
