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# Faldingworth Water Mains Faldingworth and Snarford Replacement Mains Archaeological Watching Brief

#### Summary

Monitoring of small trenches in Faldingworth for a new main found no evidence for archaeological deposits or features.

#### Introduction

Lindsey Archaeological Services (LAS) was commissioned by Anglian Water Services Ltd in December 2000 to conduct an archaeological watching brief during directional drilling for a replacement water main in Snarford and Faldingworth, Lincs. (Fig. 1). This process involved small access trenches at intervals of 50-100m, with the remainder of the pipe laid by moling underground. Monitoring of specific sections had been requested by the County Archaeological Officer in a letter to the Conservation Section of Anglian Water Services Ltd, dated 26th October 2000. Monitoring at Faldingworth by Geoff Tann took place on January 23rd 2001. Works at Snarford took place without notification to LAS, and arrangements to inspect the reconnection holes were unsuccessful.

#### Archaeological Background

Prehistoric and Romano-British finds have been reported from land beside Stocks Lane, Faldingworth. At Snarford, a larger medieval settlement extends below the present farm and farm house, and earthworks of the individual building sites survived until levelling in the 1950s. Part of a Roman glass vessel was found in 1999 during development behind Hall Farm House (Tann, G. 1999 Snarford, Hall Farm: Archaeological Watching Brief during Groundworks for an Extension to the Farmhouse. LAS Report No. 342, January 1999).

#### The Watching Brief

Numbers were assigned to the monitored trenches by LAS for recording purposes, and are marked on Fig. 2.

#### Stocks Lane, Faldingworth

Two small access trenches were inspected in Faldingworth. In Stocks Lane 1, the trench at the western edge of the road was partly obscured by surplus water from the moling technique (Pl. 1). The modern road surface appeared to have been laid over undisturbed natural deposits.

At the junction of Stocks Lane and the road to Spridlington 2, the thick tarmac layer covered a red/brown sandy clay layer (Pls. 2 and 3).

#### Conclusion

Despite the close proximity of known archaeological features to the monitored sections of this scheme, no archaeological remains were found.




Fig. 1 Location of Faldingworth and Snarford, showing the specified sections of the scheme (C based on the Ordnance Survey 1:25,000 map, Sheet TF 08. © Crown Copyright, reproduced at reduced scale with the permission of the Controller of HMSO. LAS Licence No. AL 50424A).




Fig. 2 Stocks Lane, Faldingworth, showing the position of the two monitored trenches (based on an enlarged scale extract of a plan supplied by Anglian Water Services Ltd, dwg. no. WAT-03011/1).
