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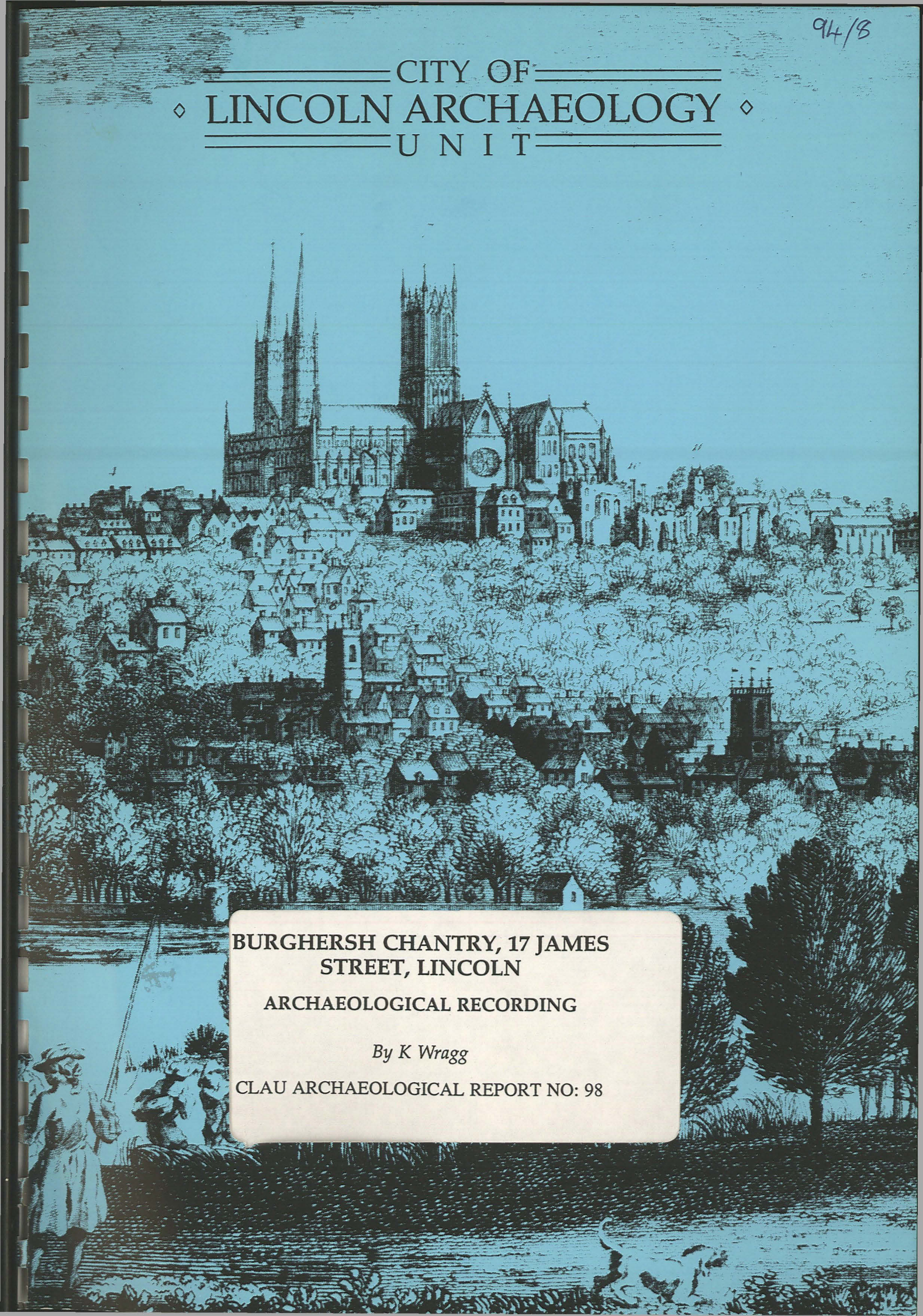

UNDERTAKEN FOR: Scorer and Hawkins Architects Associated, on behalf of the Dean & Chapter of Lincoln Cathedral.

This project was prompted by a condition of Scheduled Monument Consent relating to alterations at the above property. The S.M.C. required archaeological attendance and recording during small scale groundworks to provide altered and improved drainage arrangements for a kitchen waste outlet. The C.L.A.U. was commissioned by Scorer and Hawkins Architects Associated, on behalf of the Dean and Chapter of Lincoln Cathedral, to carry out the necessary archaeological work during March 1994.

Groundworks consisted of a small linear trench, measuring approximately 2.0m (N-S) x 1.0m (E-W) x 1.0m (depth), hand excavated to reveal existing drainage pipes and gullies immediately to the south of the kitchen wall, at the south east corner of the property.

No archaeological features were present, with the majority of the area appearing to have been heavily disturbed by previous modern drainage arrangements. Only two deposits were recorded together with the remains of a brick, concrete and limestone drainage gully. The earliest of the deposits sealed the drainage gully and consisted of a moderately compacted mid brown slightly clayey silt, containing only small flecks of limestone and possible charcoal pieces. This layer was then itself overlain by a moderately compacted mid grey-brown earth containing moderate amounts of irregular limestone pieces, modern brick fragments, tile fragments, broken pieces of drainpipe and lenses of dark brown/black ashy earth which formed the surface layer/topsoil for this part of the property.

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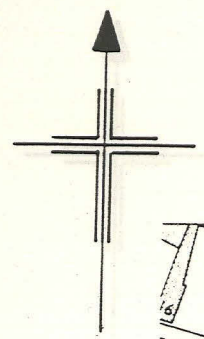

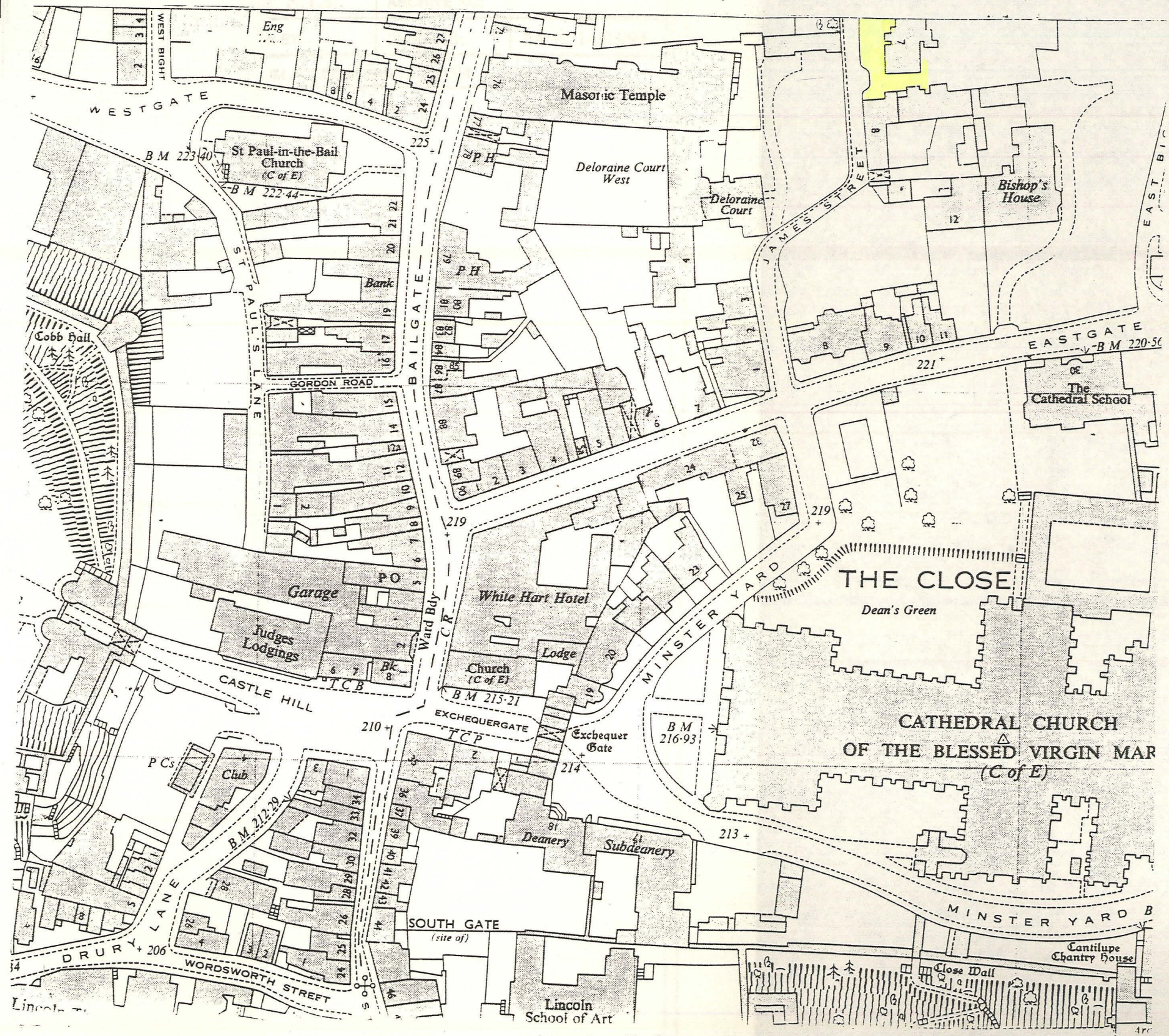

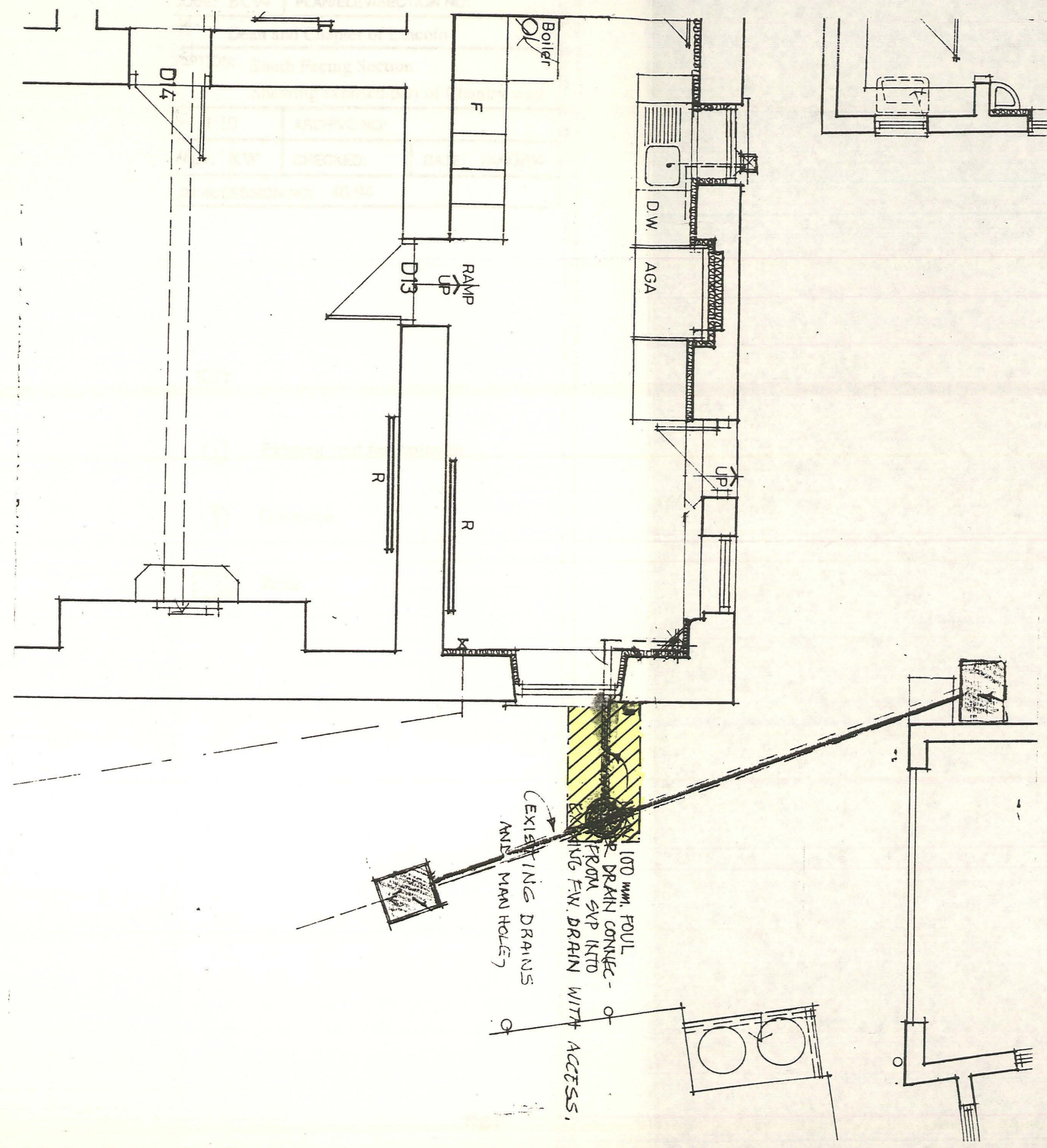
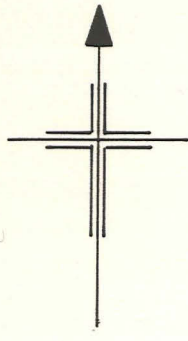
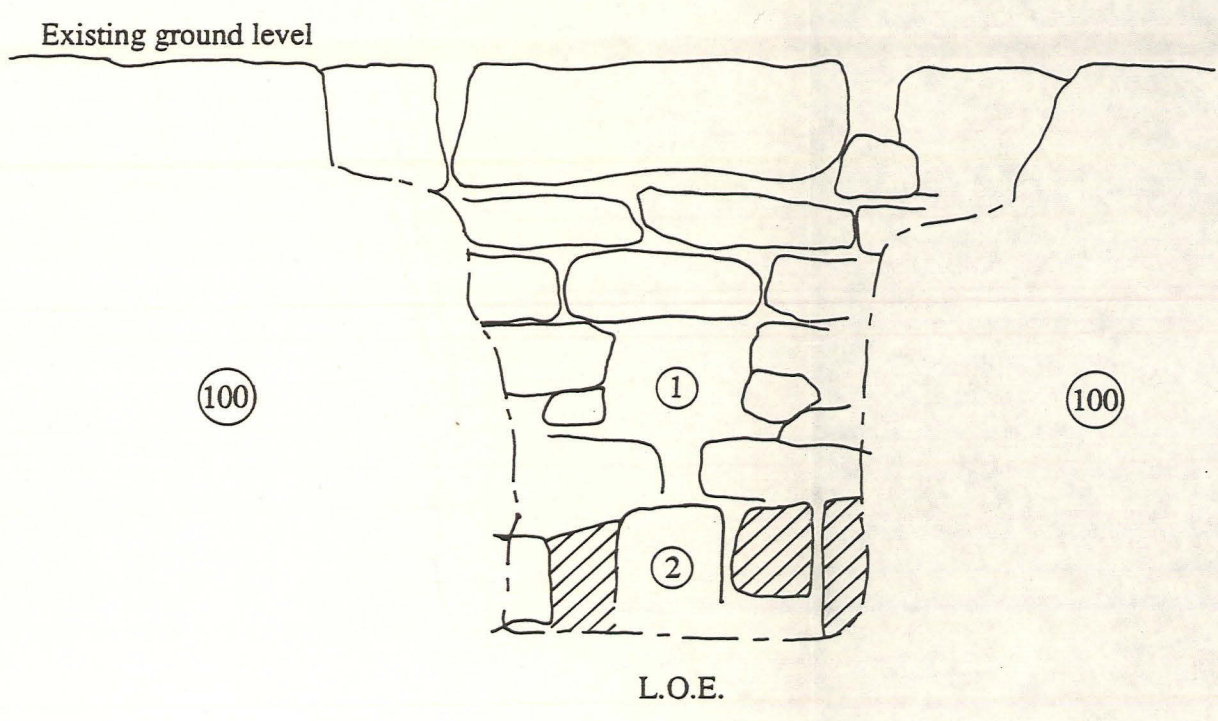
