# Petersfield, Insch, Aberdeenshire, AB52 6LN Report on the Standing Building Survey



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### **SUMMARY**

A standing building photographic survey was carried out on 19 November 2012 and it is recommended that no further work is required during this development.

### 1 INTRODUCTION


A standing building photographic survey was carried out on 19 November 2012. The site is in Insch parish, the NGR for the site is NJ 60412 28917 and it lies at 200-210m OD. The work was commissioned by Douglas MacMillan and is in response to Aberdeenshire Council planning application APP/2009/4148 for Conversion of Domestic Store to Dwellinghouse; an archaeology condition was applied to allow a photographic survey to be carried out prior to redevelopment.

### 2 ARCHAEOLOGICAL BACKGROUND

The adjacent farm of Oldtown is on Roy's mid 18th century map which shows a small settlement in the area (Illus 2)

The OS 1st edition map shows Petersfield as a C-shaped steading, open to the southeast. The layout remains largely unchanged on the OS 2nd edition map, with an addition of a building on the southern side of the courtyard (Illus 9).


The farmstead (NMRS no NJ62NW 172) is detailed in a sales brochure of 4 October 1932 of parts of Balquhain Estate which provides particulars of Oldtown Farm (lot 35, p. 27) including details of the farmhouse and the steading. The house comprised a kitchen, a milk house and seven other rooms. The steading comprised a barn with loft, two stables for a total of nine horses, four byres for a total of forty-seven cattle, a turnip house and a turnip room, a boiler house, a man's room, a garage, a coal store and a fowl house. In 1932 the farm was let to Messrs Duthie and Reid; at that time the size of the farm was about 151 acres (61.1ha) and its rent was £168 per annum. There is no mention of Petersfield or of a mill in these documents.

### 3 THE STANDING BUILDING PHOTOGRAPHIC SURVEY

A standing building survey was carried out on 19 November 2012 and was carried out in the context of Scottish Planning Policy (SPP) Planning Advice Note (PAN 2/2011) and Scottish Historic Environment Policy (SHEP), which state that archaeological remains should be regarded as part of the environment to be protected and managed.

Although some restoration work has already started on the building which has been damaged by years of inclement weather, the main structural elements surviving have been recorded. Four rooms survive (Illus 3) including Room 1 which is partly rebuilt in wood, Room 2 with a wooden door at the SE end and Rooms 3 and 4 which have been partially rebuilt. The buildings are all of black, grey and pink granite fieldstones which have been roughly dressed; there is cherry cocking throughout. All the doors are 1.1m wide and the lintels are all of pink granite except W4 which is of wood. These buildings appear to have been built in one phase and are probably mid 19th century in date.

Room 2 has operated as a mill with small apertures W1 and W2 allowing the drive shaft mechanism to enter the building. There is a stone platform adjacent to these apertures but no access is possible to the interior of this building to inspect the floor. Small windows (W5 and W6) were usually provided to allow a little ventilation into a room whilst keeping out the worst of the weather.



Illus 3 Plan showing main features recorded in this standing building survey with First Edition Ordnance survey inset showing surviving remains







### 4 CONCLUSIONS

The building appears to have been a mill and the First and Second Edition Ordnance Survey map shows a mill pond, sluice and well immediately to the NW of these buildings. A literature search reveals nothing about this mill under the name Petersfield and little about neighbouring Oldtown.


