

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SUMMARY

A Level 1 standing building survey was carried out on 2 September 2014. Blair was purchased by Mr Johnstone's father in 1960 and in the late 1960s the Phase 1 wheel and associated building was demolished and alterations to the buildings were carried out (Mr Johnstone pers comm). A grain silo was built on the site of the former wheel which was demolished just prior to this survey. In Phase 1 the farm had a horse mill (Illus 16) but this was demolished prior to the Second Edition OS. In Phase 2 the farm had a waterwheel with mill dam and sluice and these buildings were extant in the 1960s when the farm was modernised and the wheel removed and the mill dam and other structures were demolished and infilled. The north section of the building is to be demolished to allow for the two newbuild houses and the southern half to be converted. The buildings have been recorded and it is therefore recommended that no further work is required during this current planning application.

1 INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 The site (Illus 1) is located on the east side of the unnamed road running from the B979 to the NNW. It is centred on NGR NJ 84160 20560, at 120-125m OD.
- 1.2 The work was commissioned by Kirsten Will, William Lippe for Mr Edward Johnstone. An application to Aberdeenshire Council for the erection of two dwellinghouses 2014/2117 was passed on 1 August 2014 with an archaeology condition (condition 5) for a Level 1 Standing Building Survey.
- 1.3 All the archaeological work will be carried out in the context of Scottish Planning Policy (SPP) Planning Advice Note (PAN 2/2011) and Scottish Historic Environment Policy (SHEP), which state that archaeological remains should be regarded as part of the environment to be protected and managed.

2 THE LEVEL 1 STANDING BUILDING SURVEY

The standing building survey was carried out on 2 September 2014; the weather was warm and sunny. A photographic survey of all the elements of the building was carried out and existing plans of the parts of the building to be retained were annotated. Plans and elevations of all the buildings were drawn and annotated. Access to the buildings was good with very few areas obscured.

The steading is formed by four ranges around a central courtyard. The SW and SE facades are 41.20m long and the NW face is 43.75m. The NW range is 5.7m wide, the NE and SE ranges are 8.3m wide. The buildings are constructed using large granite fieldstones with cherry cocking and the lintels of squared granite blocks in Phases 1 and 2.


Phase 1

In Phase 1 the buildings around a central courtyard with a horse mill adjacent to the NW range. Windows W2, W3 and W4 (Illus 3-5) probably date to this period as well as other windows in that range. These apertures would probably have been associated with the horse mill seen on the First edition OS map dating to 1866 (Illus 16). The SW façade constructed of squared granite blocks (Illus 9 and cover) with cherry cocking with central cart door (Illus 11) was probably constructed in this phase.


Phase 2

In this phase the horse mill was demolished and a water wheel constructed. An associated lade and mill dam can be seen on the Second Edition of 1899 (Illus 16) but these structures have been infilled. A wall line surviving on the track west of the buildings, F1 (Illus 3, 7) is probably the remains of the east side of the mill lade. Rubble at the NW corner of the buildings is obscuring remains of the wheel and associated building but the scar of this building can be seen on the wall (Illus 4) and apertures W7 and W8 are probably from this phase. Possibly at the time the water wheel was installed, the NE range was moved north and as a result the courtyard was extended (Illus 16). The extension of the NW range can be seen in different stonework construction (Illus 4 and 5).

The father of the current owner purchased the farm in 1960 (for £27,000) and remembers the mill wheel in situ until the late 1960s when the farm was modernized and converted for use of cattle. On the site of the mill wheel a 1960s brick and concrete grain store was constructed and this was demolished shortly before the survey and the rubble remained in the area.



Illus 3 Plan showing current buildings





Phase 3


In Phase 3 the SE range was harled on the exterior and much of the interior covered with concrete when the buildings were upgraded in the 1960s. The courtyard was roofed in the 20th century and the cast iron pillars and roof supports are in situ (Illus 15). New apertures were created including large doors in the NW, SW and SW facades and older apertures blocked. The circular grain silo was constructed adjacent to Door 1 on the rubble from the waterwheel building and infilled lade and this was demolished just prior to this survey.




Illus 6 Interior wall of the NW range, north end




Illus 7 Wall F1 (foreground) with north end NW range in background and rubble mound (centre); facing SSE







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
