

# **SUMMARY**


A Level 1 standing building survey was carried out on 11 September 2014. Several phases of buildings have been identified. It is recommended that no further archaeological work is required during the current planning application.

#### 1 INTRODUCTION


- 1.1 The site (Illus 1) is located on the NE side of the B9001 between Inverurie and Daviot. It is centred on NGR NJ 7625 2555, at 90-100 m OD.
- 1.2 The work was commissioned by Ian Duncan, Ian Duncan Architects for CR and KD Marshall. Aberdeenshire Council planning application 2013/1009 for conversion of the steading to form six dwellinghouses (Illus 2) was passed on 17.12.13 with archaeology condition (condition 3) for Level 1 standing building survey.
- 1.3 All the archaeological work will be carried out in the context of Scottish Planning Policy (SPP) Planning Advice Note (PAN 2/2011) and Scottish Historic Environment Policy (SHEP), which state that archaeological remains should be regarded as part of the environment to be protected and managed.

# 2 THE LEVEL 1 STANDING BUILDING SURVEY

The standing building survey was carried out on 11 September 2014; the weather was bright and sunny. A photographic record was made of the buildings and the plans and elevations supplied by Ian Duncan Architects were annotated. The stone buildings are all constructed of large granite fieldstones with granite quoins, sills and lintels. Hillhead of Lethenty (NJ72NE 174) is a 19<sup>th</sup>-century farmstead.

# Rooms 1 and 2

Rooms 1 and 2 are in poor condition with limited access to the interior. They are 13.6m long and 5.7m wide. They formed a separate building on the First Edition OS map (Illus 14).

They have two large cart doors 2.3m wide and 2.2m high (Doors D3 and D4). Room 1 was probably a bothy for the  $19^{th}$ -century farm and Room 2 the cartshed.

#### Room 3

The cottage (Room 3) is 12m long and 6.4m wide and constructed of large granite blocks with cherry cocking. It has been rebuilt since the Second Ordnance Survey maps when a small building was located at the SW corner of the farm, not attached to the adjacent cartshed.

#### Room 4

This is a modern wooden shed

#### Room 5

This forms the SW side of the open courtyard and is in a poor state of preservation. A horse mill was sited on the SW side of this building on the First Edition OS map and there is now no trace of this mill.

#### Room 6

Room 6 is a stone lean-to shed 5m long and 2.6m wide on the SW side of R8. It was built on the site of a larger building which itself had been built on the location of the horse mill.

#### Room 7

Room 7 is a long steading which has been converted for animal use and is overgrown and in poor condition. The gable is 7.8m wide and there are doors in each gable and access to the courtyard in the south wall and access to the mill Room 9 through the north wall.

#### Room 8

Room 8 is a modern building.

# Rooms 9 and 10 The Mill

Room 9 (ground floor) and Room 10 (upper floor) formed the mill of the farmer farm complex on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Edition OS map when a horse mill was sited on the NE side of the building. The upper floor is inaccessible due to the poor condition of the wooden floor. The ground floor room has a metal grain chute (F3) and a wooden chute (F4). The NE wall has a concrete and wood grain chute (F2), 0.18 x 0.18m in size and a fitting (F1) which consists of a section of concreted stone wall with two square concrete apertures 0.2 x 0.2m in size.

# Room 11


This is a modern concrete shed at the north of the complex.

#### Room 12


Room 12 is in poor condition and forms the NE arm of the C-shaped steading dating to before the First edition OS map and forms the NE side of the open courtyard. It is 10.8m long and 5.3m wide and constructed of large granite fieldstones the granite lintels and quoins. Window 11 in the SE gable has been converted from an upper door using a granite lintel and as a result there is a large crack down this wall. There are large stone foundation stones exposed at the SE corner of this building (Illus 11).


Illus 12 Annotated elevations (copyright Ian Duncan Architects)

#### 3 CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

A Level 1 standing building survey was carried out on 11 September 2014. Several phases of buildings have been identified. In Phase 1 there is a C-shaped steading with a horse mill on the SW side; several buildings seen on the First Edition OS map including the horse mill have been demolished. In the second phase mill building (Rooms 9 and 10) were built on the north of the C-shaped steading and a horse mill constructed on the NE side of this building. It is recommended that no further archaeological work is required during this planning application.


