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SUMMARY

A Level 2 standing building survey was carried out on 15 December 2014 and 20 February 2015 and two phases of the mill were recorded. It is recommended that no further archaeological work is required during the current development.

1 INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 The site (Illus 1) is located on the SE side of Marykirk on the NE side of the Burn of Balmaleedy (Balmaleedie). It is centred on NGR NO 68972 65065, at 19-21m OD (Illus 1) and in the parish of Marykirk.
- 1.2 The work was commissioned by Louise Rae, A.B. Roger and Young Ltd, Brechin. An Aberdeenshire planning application APP/2014/3060 and Listed Building consent APP/2014/3064 for conversion of the mill for holiday lets was passed on 13.11.14 with an archaeology condition (condition 2) for a Level 2 standing building survey.
- 1.3 All the archaeological work was carried out in the context of Scottish Planning Policy (SPP) Planning Advice Note (PAN 2/2011) and Scottish Historic Environment Policy (SHEP), which state that archaeological remains should be regarded as part of the environment to be protected and managed.




Illus 1 Location plan (Contains Ordnance Survey data © Crown copyright and database right 2015)

2 THE LEVEL 2 STANDING BUILDING SURVEY

The site is occupied by the 19th-century Spear Mill farmhouse (NO66NE 39) Listed Category C and its associated unlisted steading (surveyed previously Cameron 2014) and the early 18th-century Spear Mill (NO66NE 49) Listed Category B (Geddes 2001, 43; Illus 2). A battle, said to have been fought between the laird of Aberluthnet (the old name for Marykirk), and the laird of Canterland and Balmaleedie (Burn of Balmaleedie), with their retainers. Their quarrel was over the siting of a mill now called Spear Mill because they fought with spears, 'but when this happened none can precisely tell.' (NMRS Canmore online NO66NE 1).

There are no early, pre-Ordnance Survey maps showing the Spearmilll (or Balmaleedie) and only a single record in The National Archives of Scotland for 1834 when a William Mowat, wood sawyer of Spearmill, Marykirk was accused of the 'crime of forgery' and 'uttering a forged writing' (AD14/34/321).

The Level 2 standing building survey of the Spear Mill took place on 15 December 2014 and 20 January 2015; the weather was clear and bright. All exterior walls were recorded photographically and architects plans were annotated and measurements taken. There was no access to the SW gable as the lade was not accessible. The interior of Room 2 was covered in a deep layer of mud from a recent flooding and there was limited access to this room and the floor in the upper room was in poor condition but the NE end was accessible whereas the SW end was boarded off and inaccessible.

The former mill building consists of two rooms, both of which have been converted for agricultural use many years previously. Room 1 at the NE end of the building is 4.75m NW-SE and 4.35m NE-SW internally and the walls are 0.6m thick. It is constructed of sandstone blocks and rubble with one large door (D18) in the NE gable. Room 2 (Illus 3) at the SW end is the earlier part of the structure and is 12.75m NE-SW and 4.7m NW-SE internally. There is a large door on the SE wall (D17) with sandstone arched lintel (Illus 5, 7) and two smaller doors in the NW wall (D15, D16).


There are small upper windows in the NW wall (W7 and W8), an upper aperture in the SE wall (W6) and two in the gable (W11 and W12). There is an upper door in the NE gable (D14) but this has been blocked when the Phase 2 room 1 was added.

The wheel (which has been removed) was situated at the SW gable the lower half of the gable is constructed of ashlar sandstone and the upper half from sandstone rubble. There is a circular aperture in the centre of this wall for the driveshaft (F1; Illus 9-11) and another circular blocked aperture adjacent (F12). There are small apertures adjacent to the wheel on the NW and SE walls (W4, W5, W9, W10, W13). There are at least 8 mason's marks (Illus 15, 16) on the sandstone ashlar of at least 7 designs. These are all based on an X.

The lade (F8) at the SW is extant but at least three buildings had originally been constructed on the SW side of the lade and these have since been demolished. The lade has recently been subjected to serious flooding.












Illus 15 Detail of section of ashlar sandstone SW gable with at least eight mason's marks (arrowed); facing NE




Illus 17 Alcove F5 with reused gravestone (left)




Illus 18 Alcove F5 with gravestone fragment










Illus 28 SW gable of mill (right) with lade F8 (centre) and SW embankment F10 (left) showing limited access to the NW gable; facing NW



Phase 1 probably dates to the early 18th century (Geddes 2001, 43), possibly 1738; during this phase it is probable that a small extension was located on the NE end of the building, represented by roof line F11. This room was probably a kiln, which may have burnt down or been replaced by a larger building, possibly when the building was converted for agricultural use. Room 1 was added prior to 1865 (Illus 16).














