
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SUMMARY

A Level 1 standing building survey was carried out on 25 May 2015; the weather was clear and bright. All exterior walls were recorded photographically and architects plans were annotated and measurements taken and main elevations drawn. Some of the roofs were in poor condition and so there was limited access to the interior of the steading buildings. It is recommended that no further archaeological work is required during this current development.

1 INTRODUCTION


- 1.1 The site (Illus 1) is located on the south side of the A944 Aberdeen Alford road east of Alford. It is centred on NGR NJ 5926 1551, at 150-155m OD (Illus 1) and in the parish of Alford.
- 1.2 The work was commissioned by Martin Forbes, Scotia Homes. A planning application will be submitted to Aberdeenshire Council for a redevelopment for housing and Aberdeenshire Archaeology require a Level 1 standing building survey.
- 1.3 All the archaeological work was carried out in the context of Scottish Planning Policy (SPP) Planning Advice Note (PAN 2/2011) and Scottish Historic Environment Policy (SHEP), which state that archaeological remains should be regarded as part of the environment to be protected and managed.




Illus 1 Location plan (Contains Ordnance Survey data © Crown copyright and database right 2015)

2 THE LEVEL 1 STANDING BUILDING SURVEY

A level 1 standing building survey was carried out on 25 May 2015. Meikle Endovie/ Endowie (NMRS NJ51NE 109) is a 19th-century farmstead. All exterior and interior walls were photographed and client plans and elevations were annotated (Illus 2 and 3). The original farm buildings comprise a C-shaped steading (Rooms 1, 2 and 6) around a central courtyard with a parallel steading to the west (Room 3). The First Edition OS map (Illus 9) shows a horse mill adjacent to the north wall of Room 6 but there is now a lean-to granite shed in this location (Room 7) which had replaced the horse mill by the Second Edition OS (Illus 10). By the Second Edition there are buildings attached to the east of the steading but these were demolished and in a later period the courtyard was enclosed and converted into a cattle court and the west building was joined with the main building.

Room 1

Room 1 forms the east wall of the C-shaped steading (Illus 4); it is 5.7m wide and has a first floor window in the south gable and door on the south end of the east wall.

Room 2

Room 2 formed the west side of the C-shaped steading and was later enclosed in cattle courts on the west and east. It is 8.2m wide and constructed of granite rubble.

Room 3

Room 3 on the west of the complex is 6m wide and is constructed of granite rubble with granite quoins. There are small first floor gable windows (Illus 5).

Room 4

Room 4 is a modern cattle court created within the 19th-century C-shaped steading.

Room 5

Room 5 is a modern cattle court created between the 19th-century C-shaped steading and Room 3.

Room 6

Room 6 is the north wing of the C-shaped steading. It is constructed of granite rubble and has a cart door in the centre of the north wall (D1). It is 6.65m wide (Illus 6,7, 8).

Room 7

Room 7 is a granite rubble lean-to (Illus 7) on the north wall of Room 6 replacing the horse mill between the dates of the 1^{st} and 2^{nd} OS maps.

Room 8

Room 8 is a granite rubble bothy at the south end of the west wing built between the dates of the 1st and 2nd OS maps. It is 8.5m long and 6.05m wide.

Room 9

Room 9 is a modern shed on the west side of Room 3.

Room 10

Room 10 is the remains of a small structure on the south side of the courtyard of the 19th-century C-shaped steading which was later extended and formed the south wall of the cattle courts Rooms 4 and 5.

Room 11

Room 11 is a W-E granite rubble building on the south end of Room 3 visible on the First Edition OS map. It is 6.6m wide with a main door in the east gable.

3 RECOMMENDATIONS

A Level 1 standing building survey was carried out on 25 May 2015 and it is recommended that no further archaeological work is required during the current planning application.



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


