

SUMMARY

A Level 1 standing building survey was carried out on 12 November 2015. The original Cshaped steading and separate bothy to the SE pre-date the First Edition OS map and there have been extensions to the stone building prior to the Second Edition as well as further additions, some of which have subsequently been demolished, in the 20th century. It is recommended that no further archaeological work is required during the current planning application.

1 INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 The site (Illus 1) is located on the W side of the B road from Old Leslie to Kennethmont between Lazyfold and Duncanstone. It is centred on NGR NJ57382664, at 200-210m OD (Illus 1) and in the parish of Leslie (Gordon).
- 1.2 The work was commissioned by Alison Skinner, Lazyfold. A planning application APP/2015/1080 was passed by Aberdeenshire Council on 28.10.15 for erection of three houses and there is a requirement for a Level 1 standing building survey.
- 1.3 All the archaeological work was carried out in the context of Scottish Planning Policy (SPP) Planning Advice Note (PAN 2/2011) and Scottish Historic Environment Policy (SHEP), which state that archaeological remains should be regarded as part of the environment to be protected and managed.

2 BACKGROUND

Mains of Duncanstone farmstead (Canmore NJ52NE 149) appears on the First Edition OS map (Illus 17) as a C-shaped steading on a WSW-ENE orientation with a small separate building partially closing the open side of the central courtyard and a small bothy to the SE. There are small extensions off the N and W exterior walls and a small outbuilding within the courtyard. By the Second Edition OS map (Illus 18) the steading has been extended to the E and Room 8 added to the n end of the bothy building. A horse mill has been added to the W end of the S wall of the main steading building.

3 THE LEVEL 1 STANDING BUILDING SURVEY


A Level 1 standing building survey was carried out on 12 November 2015. An architects plan was utilized and all elevations drawn.

Phase 1


Phase 1 consisted of a C-shaped steading (Rooms 2, 3, 4 and 7) around a central courtyard and a bothy to the SE. The buildings are constructed of blocks of pink and grey granite blocks with cherry cocking. The roofs are slate and the lintels and sills are mainly granite with wood on the interiors. The N wing of the steading is 19m long and 5.1m wide. The E end consists of a cottage (Illus 5, Rooms 3 and 4) with a cold store/pantry on the exterior of the N wall (Illus 6, 7; Room 1). There was no access to the interior of this room but the room was accessed by steps into the partially underground structure and there is a stone shelf *in situ* (Illus 7). This building is 3.3m long and 2.3m wide.

The W arm of the steading is 28m long and 5.1m wide. It has a series of blocked doors and windows on the W wall (eg W13; Illus 8), presumably when the modern dutch barn was added to the W. The S arm of the steading was 23m long and 5.4m wide. A series of doors and windows on the S wall are still open (eg W16; Illus 9) but the level of the ground on the exterior has been increased and some of these are not clearly visible from the exterior.


To the SE is a small separate building consisting of Rooms 8, 9, and 10 and partially demolished structure Room 11 which does not appear on the OS maps and may have been an unroofed enclosure.

Phase 2

In Phase 2 an extension was built on to the E end of the N wing of the steading (Room 5; Illus 14, 15) which was an extra domestic accommodation and an extension on the E end of the S wing of the steading appears to have been extra agricultural building.


A horse mill was added to the S side of this wall on the 2nd Edition OS map and the apertures W14 and W15 may be associated with this structure. The ground level has been raised in the area of the horse mill and these apertures are partially obscured.

Later additions

The W side of the courtyard was enclosed in the mid 20th century and a Dutch barn added to the W side of the farm, attached to the exterior W wall of Room 7. A porch was added outside D1 and later removed. There is no access to Room 1, the cold store, as the room adjacent has been wood paneled and these cottages have been modernised. The steading buildings have been modified for animal use with some interior walls concreted.

4 CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

A Level 1 standing building survey was carried out on 12 November 2015. The original Cshaped steading and separate bothy to the SE pre-date the First Edition OS map and there have been extensions to the stone building prior to the Second Edition as well as further additions, some of which have since been demolished, in the 20th century.




Illus 16 Phase plan showing main phases of development


