Land to North West of Seggieden Farm, Kennethmont, Huntly, AB54 4NW Report on Level 1 Standing Building Survey

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
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SUMMARY

A Level 1 standing building survey was carried out on 30 January 2017. The cottage was probably constructed in the early 19th century and has been used as farm worker's accommodation until it was left unoccupied about 30 years ago. The main building is one phase and the stone building which was attached the NE gable has largely been demolished leaving wall stubs and foundations only. A tin shed which housed a bathroom was added to the NE gable at a later date. It is recommended that no further archaeological work is required during the current planning application.

1 INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 The site (Illus 1) is located on the east side of the Kennethmont to Clatt road. It is centred on NGR NJ54469 28010, at 190-200m OD (Illus 1) and in the parish of Kennethmont.
- 1.2 The work was commissioned by Kayley and Ryan Dawson. A planning application APP/2016/2472 for Erection of Replacement Dwellinghouse was granted on 28.11.16 and there is a requirement for a Level 1 standing building survey (condition 3).
- 1.3 All the archaeological work was carried out in the context of Scottish Planning Policy (SPP) Planning Advice Note (PAN 2/2011) and Scottish Historic Environment Scotland's Policy Statement (HESPS), which state that archaeological remains should be regarded as part of the environment to be protected and managed.

2 BACKGROUND

The building is recorded as part of NMRS NJ52NW 137 farmstead (period unassigned); the area is labelled Muir of Seggieden on Roy's Military Survey of Scotland, 1747-55 (Illus 11). On the 1st Edition OS map (Illus 12) it is part of an L-shaped building; two sections of this building have since been demolished; there is also a small extension on the NW wall of the cottage which has since been demolished. The buildings are largely unchanged on the 2nd Edition OS map (Illus 13).


3 THE LEVEL 1 STANDING BUILDING SURVEY

A level 1 standing building survey was carried out on 30 January 2017. A photographic survey was carried out; there was no access to the first floor of the cottage because of the poor state of the roof and stairs. There was little access to the NW side of the cottage as there is a barbed wire fence 1m from the cottage wall. All other areas were accessible. A plan and elevations were drawn (Illus 2).

The two-storey cottage is 13.5m long and 5.15m wide (see cover). It is constructed of quarried grey (and a few pink) granite blocks with cherry cocking, the roof is of grey slate and the lintels and sills are granite. The lintels of W1 and W2 have several quarry drill marks (Illus 3). The main 'front' façade faces SE and there is a central door (D1) with flanking ground and first floor windows. There is a blocked window (W3) in the SW gable (Illus 4, 5) and after this was blocked the interior was converted into an alcove cupboard (F8) in Room 1 (Illus 6).

The building has two main reception rooms the full width of the house, Room 1 in the SW and Room 2 in the NE. Room 2 has a large fireplace on the NE wall (Illus 7) and a central alcove shelving in the centre of the SW wall flanked by doors to the hall (D6) and to Room 3 (D3). There is a room under the stairs (Room 3) with large sinks and a window to the NW.

Door 4 leads to the extension, now mainly corrugated iron construction with corrugated roof (Illus 8) but this would have been a stone extension and there are remains of this stone structure (F2, F3 and F4; Illus 9).



4 CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

A Level 1 standing building survey was carried out on 30 January 2017. The cottage was probably constructed in the early 19th century and has been used as farm worker's accommodation until it was left unoccupied about 30 years ago. The main building is one phase and the stone building which was attached the NE gable has largely been demolished leaving wall stubs and foundations only. A tin shed which housed a bathroom was added to the NE gable at a later date (Illus 10). It is recommended that no further archaeological work is required during the current planning application.




Illus 10 Phase plan showing Phase 2 corrugated iron shed and blocked window and alcove opening.

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

Illus 11 Roy Military Survey of Scotland, 1747-55 showing 'Muir of Seggieden' (copyright National Library of Scotland)









