# Former Andover School, Nursery Lane, Brechin, DD9 7DL Report on Level 1 Standing Building Survey

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#### SUMMARY


A Level 1 standing building survey was carried out on 21 February 2017. Architects plans and elevations were checked and annotated and a full photographic survey was carried out. At least 3 main phases of development of the buildings were recorded.

The building was originally constructed in 1859 and major additions added prior to 1901 and 1922 with other additions in the 20<sup>th</sup> century. The building is constructed in Gothic style from sandstone blocks with large windows and small fireplaces.

It is recommended that no further archaeological work is required during the current planning application.

# 1 INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 The site (Illus 1) is located on the west side of Nursery Lane, Brechin. It is centred on NGR NO 60257 59718, at 33-38m OD (Illus 1) and in the parish of Brechin.
- 1.2 The work was commissioned by Phil Rowson for Andover Developments Ltd. A planning application 15/01061/LBC for conversion of the former school into residential units was approved on 16.8.16 with a requirement for a Level 1 standing building survey (condition 1e).
- 1.3 All the archaeological work was carried out in the context of Scottish Planning Policy (SPP) Planning Advice Note (PAN 2/2011) and Scottish Historic Environment Scotland's Policy Statement (HESPS), which state that archaeological remains should be regarded as part of the environment to be protected and managed.

# 2 BACKGROUND

Andover Primary School formerly Tenements School and Smith's School (NMRS ref no NO65NW 80) is Listed Category B. It was designed by architect John Henderson in 1859. (Black 1839; Coutts 1889, Edwards 1902). It was built in 1859 due to the generosity of the brothers John and Peter Smith, and of John Dove, all natives of Brechin who emigrated to America. There they settled in Andover, Massachusetts where they became successful businessmen and benefactors. The school, originally known as the Tenements School, was "devoted to the instruction of the children of the labouring poor in the parish of Brechin". A great celebration was held to mark the laying of the foundation stone on 11 May, 1859. In 1905 the name changed to Andover School in honour of the Smith brothers. The School moved to the new building in Drumachlie Park in September 1998 (Andover Primary School Document for Parents; Angus Council).

The building is Gothic in style with long low asymmetrical gabled composition, rubble-built with chamfered openings. Single storey school; school south elevation is 6-bay, second from west projecting gabled bay with 4-light window and roof swept down on west over arched porch, pointed bipartites others transomed 2-light lancets rising into gablets, E gable 4 light window, all latticed above the transom. Schoolhouse has S gable front flush with tower 3-light window ground floor, 2-light at 1st. W front asymmetrical with projected centre gable with upper 2 light window corbelled chimney on right, 2-light windows in left-hand bay, that at 1st with gablet. Slated roof with broad eaves throughout (Historic Environment Scotland Listed Buildings online).

The First Edition OS (Illus 28) shows an H-shaped structure on the west side of the plot of land; the school is called 'Smith's School; and there is a small unroofed building north of the school in the NW corner of the playground and an unroofed enclosure on the centre of the north wall (see F17). There is a Bench Mark on the SE corner of the building (see F12).


By the Second Edition OS map (Illus 29) there has been an extension on the east side of the building and small buildings along the inside of the west and north boundary walls (including Buildings 3 and 4) and Building 2 has been constructed as a separate building on the east wall.

By the Third Edition OS map (Illus 30) a further extension has been built on to the north side of the building.


The school moved to new premises in 1998 and this building has been empty since.

## 3 THE LEVEL 1 STANDING BUILDING SURVEY


A Level 1 standing building survey was carried out on 21 February 2017. Architects plans and elevations were checked and annotated and a full photographic survey was carried out (Illus 3-5).




Illus 2 Plan showing Buildings 1, 2, 3 and 4 recorded during this survey (copyright A.D. Architecture and Design).

#### 3.1 BUILDING 1

This building was built in 3 three main phases. All are constructed of sandstone blocks with sandstone lintels, sills and quoins. Much of the sandstone has delaminated and some has been repaired with a skim of cement, stippled to blend in with the pockmarked tooled sandstone blocks. The Phase 1 and 2 structures are more badly affected by delamination than the Phase 3 structure (Phil Rowson, pers comm).

The building had been stripped of metalwork and pipes and the floorboards had been removed. There are narrow stone sleeper walls under all the floors and cast iron vents into each room through the external walls.

# 3.1.1 Phase 1

Phase 1 is 29.4m W-E and formed an H-shaped block (Illus 6). The S wall (see cover illus, top) and part of the E wall survive and the tower and Headmasters House (not included in this application) were attached to the W wall. The N wall was rebuilt when the Phase 2 structure added on to the N (Illus 7) but the features on that wall including alcove F8 and fireplace F7 (Illus 8) may be original to Phase 1. A large arched opening (later reduced in size D11) may also be original to Phase 1.

# 3.1.2 Phase 2

In Phase 2 a sandstone extension was added to the E end of the building and the N wall of the Phase 1 structure was rebuilt. The S façade has four tall windows under gablets (Illus 9) and is constructed of sandstone blocks similar to Phase 1. The south wall of Rooms 5 and 6 was originally an outside wall and has a large window (W36; Illus 13) which was originally the N wall of the building prior to the Phase 3 extension being built. A new N façade was built with new entrance doors in sandstone (Illus 10, 11). Fireplaces F6 and F7 may have been added in this phase or incorporated from the Phase 1 building. They have concrete surrounds with sandstone rubble infill with tile (Illus 12). Large arched and pointed windows brought much light into the Phase 2 rebuilding including W29 and W30 on the E wall of Room 7 (Illus 14) and W12 on the E wall of Room 9 (Illus 16).

A toilet block (Rooms 11 and 12) was added on to the E of the building, probably in Phase 2 or 3. It replaced the outside toilet block (Building 2).

# 3.1.3 Phase 3

A sandstone extension of two classrooms (Rooms 5 and 6; Illus 18, 19) was built on to the north of the building in Phase 3. It was 13.4m wide and each of the two rooms had an external door to the playground (D5 and D6) and a small fireplace with concrete surround (F9 and F10; Illus 20).

# 3.2 BUILDING 2

Building 2 is 2 x 4m in size and was a block of four outside toilets built by the 2<sup>nd</sup> Edition OS map (Phase 2). It has a sandstone rubble W and S walls and is built into the E school boundary wall. The N wall has four narrow doors with brick infill in between with concrete walls and floors (Illus 20).

#### 3.3 BUILDING 3

Building 3 is a sandstone blocks and rubble structure in the NW side of the school grounds (Illus 23). It has sandstone quoins and lintel and is 2.1m W0E and 4.4m N-S. It had one door on the E wall which has been infilled and formed into a smaller window. It appears on the maps on the 2<sup>nd</sup> edition OS map (Phase 2).

# 3.5 F17 small brick and stone enclosure

A small enclosure appears on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Edition OS map and this survives as a small triangular brick structure topped with a concrete cap.





# 4 CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS


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It is recommended that no further archaeological work is required during the current planning application.

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




