
Greyfriars (John Knox) Church, Broad St/Queen St, Aberdeen, AB10 1AP Report on Level 2 Standing Building Survey and Watching Brief

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SUMMARY


The standing building survey revealed that the church was built in 1903 in one phase as a standalone church and later joined to Marischal College façade. Room 1 the small hall at the SE end of the building has been added on to the main church building at a later date, after the 3rd Edition OS map of 1926 (Illus 31). The wooden panels which are an important part of the history of the City may have come from Old Greyfriars Church or possibly another church such as St Nicholas.

Examination of the three test pits did not reveal any finds or features, though sections of shattered sewage pipe (dry at time of opening) were noted in TP1 and TP2. All three test pits, with the exception of the more natural lower fill of TP3, appeared to consist of a mixture of natural and redeposited fills associated with the construction phase of Greyfriars Church. It is logical that the basement does not extend fully to abut Marischal College, given the substantial weight of this building, though the insertion of the Greyfriar foundations and retaining wall which forms the eastern half of TP2 and TP3 implies that these two areas were previously excavated during the initial construction of Greyfriars Church.

Further ground disturbance must be subject to an archaeological watching brief.

1 BACKGROUND

- 1.1 The site (Illus 1) is located on the N side of Broad Street between Marischal College and Queen Street. It is centred on NGR NJ94287 06433, at 20-25m OD in the parish of Aberdeen.
- 1.2 The work was commissioned by Steven Lawrence, TCD Architects for G1 Group PLC. An application 161489/DPP to Aberdeen City Council is pending. Aberdeenshire Council Archaeology Service (who cover Aberdeen City) require a Level 2 standing building survey and a watching brief on all ground disturbance.
- 1.3 All the archaeological work will be carried out in the context of Scottish Planning Policy (SPP) Planning Advice Note (PAN 2/2011) and Historic Environment Scotland's Policy Statement (HESPS) which state that archaeological remains should be regarded as part of the environment to be protected and managed.




Illus 1 Location plan (*Contains Ordnance Survey data* © *Crown copyright and database right 2017*)

2 ARCHAEOLOGICAL BACKGROUND

Greyfriars Church is Listed category A and was built in A Marshall Mackenzie in 2.1 1903. Perpendicular Gothic church with nave and single aisle and large, tall, crocketted and finialled, 3-stage square-plan entrance tower with angled buttresses and spire to W (Broad Street). Adjoining Marischal College. Large 16th century 7-light tracery window to chancel on E elevation incorporated from previous church. Grey Kenmay granite ashlar. String course, cill course, buttresses to 6-bay aisle at S (Queen Street). Deep-set rectangular and bipartite windows to S with splayed reveals. The tower entrance elevation to Broad Street with steps leading to central advanced pedimented entrance porch. Multi-panelled decorative 2-leaf timber entrance door. Very slender, tall, paired bipartite openings to 2nd stage. Top stage comprises paired tall and narrow perpendicular tracery windows mirrored to all elevations, surmounted by double-height slender crocketted and finialled parapet and needle spire. Predominantly multi-pane fixed leaded-pane windows, some with hoppers. Grey slates. Cast-iron rainwater goods. INTERIOR: whitewashed with ashlar dressings. 3-bay arcaded nave with clerestory to S. Simple open timber ribbed ceiling. Steep timber gallery at W. Possible 17th century carved timber choir stalls to E. Polished granite communion table and pulpit. Timber pews. Stained glass to E chancel window by Charles Earner Kempe. Integrally designed to form the crucial SW corner of the nationally important Marischal College (see separate listing) and by the same renowned local architect, A Marshall Mackenzie, this Church, with its impressive and imposing tower is an important building within the city centre and a defining landmark. Taking its cue from Marshall's celebrated Gothic addition to Marischal College, the Greyfriars John Knox Church is embellished with an array of finials and crockets. Refined work in granite only became possible after steam technology allowed for more sophisticated cutting techniques in the 1830s. A 16th century tracery window has been incorporated into the present church and now has stained glass by C E Kempe. It is likely that the carved timber choir stalls in the chancel also came from the previous church. The original Greyfriars Collegiate Church was built in 1532 by Franciscan monks and lay at right angles and to the North of the present church, along Broad Street. It was incorporated into Marischal College, which was founded in 1593 (Cameron forthcoming). The college was rebuilt between 1837-41 and further extended between 1893-97. It was this extension along Broad Street which caused the original collegiate Church to be demolished and after much negotiation between the Town Council, Church and University, Marshall Mackenzie built this replacement in the same Perpendicular Gothic Style as the college extension. It formed an integral part of the whole site (Listed Buildings online, HES; Gammie 1909, 25).

Greyfriars Church was built as a stand-alone structure and the frontage of Marischal College added (Illus 2).

- 2.2 Mesolithic activity has been found at several sites in the vicinity. Several hundred flints were recovered from earliest layers at the adjacent 16-18 Netherkirkgate/Guestrow site (Cameron 2001, 30; Illus 2 No 3) and at 12-26 Broad Street (Murray 1982, 26-27; Illus 2, No 6).
- 2.3 This site is at the centre of the medieval burgh of Aberdeen; Parson James Gordon's map of Aberdeen 1661 (Illus 3) shows that this area was well developed by this period. Substantial well-preserved medieval remains were found at several sites in the vicinity including Marischal College on the opposite of Broad Street (Cameron forthcoming) which slightly overlaps the current site. Marischal College is the site of the Franciscan friary and buildings and burials from this religious centre were excavated as well as the early buildings of Marischal College. During the work to convert the building to Aberdeen City Council headquarters the pavement between Broad Street and the SW frontage of the building was lifted and a watching brief carried out; the 19th to early 20th-century tenement building remains were recorded but nothing of an earlier date. Medieval sites have also been excavated at Gallowgate Middle School (Cameron 2001, 73-79), 43-57 Upperkirkgate/Flourmill Brae (Cameron 2001, 50-58), 16-18 Netherkirkgate (Cameron 2001, 28-37), 30-46 Upperkirkgate (Stones 2001, 60-69) and 42 St Paul Street (Murray 1982, 46-84).
- 2.4 Provost Skene's House was built in the 16th century, and is one of the Aberdeen's few surviving examples of early burgh architecture. The first reference to the plot of land was in 1545 when Alexander Knollis took possession of the site on Guestrow,

one of Aberdeen's principal streets at that time (Aberdeen City Council 1994, 3). Y 1661 (Ill0 the NE part of the site is occupied by houses on the south side of Broad/Bread Street, south of which Guestrow (Gwestraw) runs across the current site NW-SE and south of this another line of buildings which include What is now Provost Skene's House. South-west of these buildings are backlands running along the entire west edge of the site.

2.5 The proposed development site is represented on the First and Second Edition OS maps (Illus 3, 4) as a series of buildings along the queen Street frontage including one public house, and a public house on the frontage of Broad Street. There is a lane (Jopp's Court at the N edge of the development area. The church is *in situ* by the Third Edition OS map (Illus 5).

3 THE STANDING BUILDING SURVEY

A Level 2 standing building survey was carried out on 9th and 20th March 2017. Architects plans and elevations were checked and annotated and a full photographic survey was carried out. The main church building was constructed in one phase in 1903 and there have been small alterations to the internal layout since. The building is c 40m long and 17.5m wide. The tower is 9.5 x 9.5m in size and the Phase 2 extension on the Se end of the building is 8.75 x 7m in size.

3.1 Room 1 small hall

Room 1 is a small hall at the SE end of the church which appears to have been a Phase 2 addition (Illus 5). There is a porch on the SW wall with main door (D1) on the SW wall with pointed arch lintel; there are flanking windows W29 and W30 (1.5m high; 0.45m wide with modern stained glass; Illus 6) on the main hall. This addition is built using granite blocks to match the main church.

3.2 Room 2 safe room

This small room on the NE side of the lower ground floor contained a safe. There are no external walls.

3.3 Room 3 kitchen

Rooms 3 and 5 are adjoining and have large windows on the SE wall (W32, W33; 1.9m wide and 1.55m high; Illus 7). The room has been the kitchen in the lower ground floor and there are fus boxes built inot a cupboard in the NE wall.

3.4 Room 4 switch room

Room 4 is a small room with no outside walls which contains switch gear. There is a wooden trap door in the floor which shows access to an underfloor space.

3.5 Room 5 kitchen

Rooms 3 and 5 are adjoining and have large windows on the SE wall (W32, W33). The room has been the kitchen in the lower ground floor and there is a cupboard in the SW wall (F29).

3.6 Room 6 Lower ground floor corridor

The lower ground floor corridor leads from the ground floor down steps at the NE of the building to the SW wall (Illus 8). The NW wall of the corridor bisects W15 on the SW wall suggesting this corridor has been inserted at a date after the construction of the church. On the NW wall there are doors to access the large hall (Room 8; D12, D13) and a door to the ladies toilet (D14). On the SE side there are doors to access Rooms 3 and 5 (D9, D10) and the corridor takes a dog leg at the SW end to access D2 and gent toilets through D16. The corridor is wood panelled and there are iron tubular radiators throughout.

3.7 Room 7A and 7B Ladies and Gents toilets, lower ground floor

These toilets appear to have been built in a second phase of development of the building. The ladies toilet bisects W15 on the SW wall (Illus 10) and the gent toilet cubicles bisect W31 on the SE wall (Illus 9).

3.8 Room 8 Large Hall, Lower Ground Floor

Room 8 is the large hall under the church (Illus 11). It has large windows on the SW wall (W10-W16; 1.65m high and 1.25m wide). There is s stage at the NW end of the room and doors to the corridor on the SE wall.

3.9 Room 9 Minister's robing room

On the first floor adjacent to the main church (Room 10) there is a ministers robing room with small toilet cubicle and wardrobe. There are windows (W35, W36) on the SE wall of this room and a door linking directly to the choir area of the church (D18).

3.10 Room 10 Main church

This is the main room of the church (Illus 18). There is a single aisle on the SW side divided from the main church by sandstone archways (F23, 24, 25) on sandstone piers (F17, 18). The NE wall has a series of decorative archways (F20, 21, 22) and piers (F15, 16) as this wall is the junction between Marischal College and this church. It is possible that when the church was built there was a door in this wall to allow access between the College and church but there is now no evidence if this was the case. On the SE wall is a large 7-light sandstone tracery window which was incorporated from the SE wall of the medieval Greyfriars Church (W34; Illus 13, 14, 15).

There are small half height pointed buttresses (F3, F5, F7; Illus 12; 16) and larger full height buttresses on the exterior of the SW wall (F2, F4, F6, F8, F9). The windows on the SW wall all have stained glass tell the story of the Greyfriars; they are 1.78m high and 0.76m wide and have sandstone mouldings and scalloped ogee lintel (Illus 17).

On the SE wall under window W34 are a series of wooden panels on the NE, SE and SW wall around the area of the altar (F12; Illus 19, 20). These are carved with names, initials and dates in the late 17th and early 18th centuries. The panels are typically 45cm high and 43cm wide and are incorporated in door D18 between the church and the ministers robing room (Illus 19) but also in the door (D3) and in the SE edge of the Gallery (see below). Some of the script is poorly executed and all are male names. It has been suggested that these are apprentice pieces (Jane Geddes pers comm) and may have been relocated from the old Greyfriars Church or St Nicholas (possibly after the fire of 1874). There is also a series of wood panels in St Nicholas Church.

3.11 Room 11 side room next to choir

This side room is accessed through archways F19 from the choir area and F26 from the S aisle.

3.12 Room 12 inner entrance hall

This inner entrance hall is accessed from the entrance hall though D20 and D19 lead into the church. There is a window of the SW wall (W2) and on the NE wall (W39) both 2m high and 1.45m wide.

3.13 Room 13 outer entrance hall/Room 14

This entrance hall has a window (W1; 1.5m wide, 2.15m high) on the SW wall D3 on the NW wall, the main door leading down steps to Broad Street. The door is made from reused wooden panels (Illus 21, 22) and there is a dated keystone (1901; Illus 23) on the exterior (Illus 23). There are stairs in the N corner of the room to the first floor gallery F32. There is a small Room 14 on the NE of this room and there is an under stair cupboard and a window (W40) to the NE. There is a stone plaque in the W corner (Illus 24).



4 THE WATCHING BRIEF

On March 8th, 2017, an archaeological watching brief took place within Greyfriars Church, involving the excavation of three test pits (TP1-TP3; Illus 25) to ascertain the structural integrity of the underlying substrate for engineering purposes. No archaeological finds or features were noted.

The first pit (TP1; Illus 25, 26) was hand-excavated and was located in the basement in an offset mid-point location towards Queen Street to the east. TP1 measured 1.2m in overall length by 0.55m in width, and reached a maximum depth c. 0.75m. Fill consisted of a mid-brown sandy-clay containing moderate amounts of small stones, gravel and drain tile, along with remnants of bitumen used to waterproof the sub-flooring.

It should be noted the basement area only extends below the eastern half of the church proper. The western half below ground level (i.e. the church) appeared as a mixture of imported and natural fills adjacent to Marischal College which predates Greyfriars. It is assumed the basement did not extend any further due to structural concerns related to the substantial weight-bearing foundations of Marischal College.

TP2 (Illus 27) and TP3 (Illus 28) were located below the sub-flooring on the ground level within the western half of the church itself, adjacent to the eastern wall of Marischal College (Illus 25). TP2 measured approximately 1.5m in width by 2.0m in length and reached a maximum depth of some 1.6m. It was bordered on the eastern side by a partial retaining wall, implying that this area had been previously partially excavated during construction. Fill consisted of a sandy-silt interspersed with stone and small cobbles. The fill, as to be expected in such an environment, was extremely dry and powdery after lying protected from the elements and moisture for over a century.

Test Pit 3 (TP3) was located in the SW corner of the project area, on the right as one enters the church. Dimensions were 2.0m wide by 2.8m in length, and reached a maximum depth of c.2.4m. It also bordered the same foundation/retaining wall to the east as TP2. The foundations of Greyfriars were exposed and revealed to stop short of the full depth of those at neighbouring Marischal College. Work was halted at this point. Similar to TP2, fill consisted of a fine, dusty sandy-silt, also interspersed with stones and small cobbles, though at depths below c1.5m, it transitioned into a wetter, more compact fill. No finds or features were noted.

5 CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

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










Illus 32 Lower ground floor annotated with numbers used in this survey (copyright TCD Architects)




Illus 33 Ground floor plan annotated with numbers used in this survey and showing locations of sections AA and CC (copyright TCD Architects)




Illus 34First floor plan annotated with numbers used in this survey (copyright TCD Architects)




Illus 35 Second floor plan annotated with numbers used in this survey (copyright TCD Architects)




Illus 36 NE elevation annotated with numbers used in this survey (copyright TCD Architects)




Illus 37 NW elevation annotated with numbers used in this survey (copyright TCD Architects)




Illus 38 SE elevation annotated with numbers used in this survey (copyright TCD Architects)




Illus 40 Section AA annotated with numbers used in this survey (copyright TCD Architects)




Illus 41 Section CC annotated with numbers used in this survey (copyright TCD Architects)


