## Cross St/Frithside St/Mid St/Manse St, Fraserburgh, AB43 9JB <br> Report on Level 2 Standing Building Survey

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## SUMMARY

A Level 2 standing building survey was carried out on 17 May and 15 June 2017. Seven buildings were recorded. Architect's plans and elevation were checked and additional plans and elevations drawn of buildings in the interior of the proposed development including Buildings 4 and 6 .

Building 1 is the earliest structure being on the First Edition OS map, probably built as a shop on the ground floor and flats above. There is now a flat on the upper floor but it has been completely modernized; stone walls could be seen in areas where the asbestos contractor has removed the plasterboard.

Building 3 is an Art Deco 1927 garage constructed of concrete blocks; there is date stone on the gablet above the front east façade on Cross Street. It has a flat above and has been completely modernized. The previous owner of the garage has asked to keep the date stone when the building is demolished (Clarke Dalziel pers comm).

Buildings 2, 4 and 6 are on the Second Edition OS map. Building 2 has been heavily modernized and partially rebuilt as has the N wall of Building 4. Building 4 has a series of fireplaces on the south wall for small industrial use. Building 6 has three large cart doors on the N wall and may have been stables or workshops. The buildings have been modernized internally and the doors reduced in size at a later date.

It is recommended that no further archaeological work is required prior to the current development.
1.1 The site (Illus 1) is located on between Cross St, Mid St, Frithside St and Manse St. It is centred on NGR NJ99648 66939, at 10-15m OD (Illus 1) and in the parish of Fraserburgh.
1.2 The work was commissioned by Murray Restrup, Norr. A planning application APP/2016/3116 was approved on 10 April 2017 with a standard archaeology condition and there is a requirement for a Level 2 standing building survey.
1.3 All the archaeological work will be carried out in the context of Scottish Planning Policy (SPP) Planning Advice Note (PAN 2/2011) and Scottish Historic Environment Scotland's Policy Statement (HESPS), which state that archaeological remains should be regarded as part of the environment to be protected and managed.

The block of Fraserburgh between Cross St, Frithside St to the south, Manse Street to the W and Mid Street to the N was surrounded by buildings on the roadsides on the First Edition OS map (Illus 52). There was a parsonage in the side of the area and gardens on the interior with some unroofed garden buildings, none of which survive. By the Second Edition OS map (Illus 53) the gardens have been removed and buildings constructed in the centre of the area as well as long narrow buildings laid out NNW-SSE from the rear of the buildings on Frithside Street. By the Third Edition map several other buildings have been inserted into gap sites. The garage (Building 3) is listed on Historic Environment Scotland database (HES NJ96NE 267) but no other buildings are included on the HES database or the Aberdeenshire Sites and Monuments Record.

## 3 THE LEVEL 2 STANDING BUILDING SURVEY

A Level 2 standing building survey was carried out on 17 May and 15 June 2017. Seven buildings were recorded (Illus 2). Architect's plans and elevation were checked and additional plans and elevations drawn of building on the interior of the proposed development including Buildings 4 and 6 . A full interior and exterior photographic survey was carried out.

## BUILDING 1

Building 1 is located on the corner of Cross Street and Frrithside Street. It is a two-storey building 10 m long and 5 m wide and constructed of quarried granite blocks with cherry cocking. It has two large windows on the ground floor Cross Street frontage suggesting it was built as a shop (Illus 3, 4). There is a blocked window on the ground floor Frithside St wall (Illus 4, 8). The upper floor is a flat with three windows on the Cross St façade and windows on the corner on ground and first floor level. The interior has been completely modernized and stone walls can be seen in areas where the asbestos contractor has removed the plasterboard (Illus 9).

Building 1 is on the First Edition OS map where Building 1C also appears (Illus 9); this building has either been demolished and rebuilt or the roof has been removed and the walls harled giving it the appearance of a flat-roofed more recent extension.

Extensions (1A, B, C, E) to Building 1 probably date to the mid to late $20^{\text {th }}$ century (Illus 1012).

## Room 1A

Room 1 A is $10 \times 8 \mathrm{~m}$ in size and forms the front room of a shop added to the W side of Building 1 in the mid to late $20^{\text {th }}$ century. There is a large shop window (W10) on the $S$ façade. Ground floor. Phase 2.

Room 1B
Room 1B is a $6 \times 7.5 \mathrm{~m}$ extension to the shop 1 A on the N side. Ground floor. Phase 2.
Room 1C is a $4 \times 7.5 \mathrm{~m}$ office on the E side of Room 1B. Ground floor. Phase 2.
Room 1D

Room 1D is in Phase 1 of the building and is an office $5 \times 10 \mathrm{~m}$ in size subdivided withy partitions. There are windows W2, W6, W7 and W8 (all blocked) on the E wall. Ground floor. Phase 1.

Room 1E
Room 1E is a small office $5 \times 4 \mathrm{~m}$ in size at the NE side of the building with one window W9 (blocked) on the E wall. Ground floor. Phase 2.

Room 1F
Room 1 F is $5 \times 6.2 \mathrm{~m}$ in size and is a living room with large windows on the $S$ (W36) and W (W37) walls. It has been added on to the Phase 1 section of the building with steps down into the older part of the building from this room. First floor. Phase 2.

Room 1G
Room 1G is a living room on the corner of Frithside St and Cross St with windows (W1 and W3) overlooking the street. First floor. Phase 1.

Room 1H
Room 1 H is a bathroom $3.6 \times 1.9 \mathrm{~m}$ in size with a window (W4) in the E wall.First floor. Phase 1.

Room 11
Room 1I is a bedroom $3.6 \times 3.7 \mathrm{~m}$ in size with a window on the E wall (W5). First floor. Phase 1.

## Room 1 J

Room 1 J is a bedroom $3.7 \times 4.3 \mathrm{~m}$ in size with a window on the E wall (W8). First floor. Phase 2.

Room 1K

Room 1 K is a corridor 6.6 m long and 1.2 m wide off which all the doors to Rooms $1 \mathrm{H}, 1 \mathrm{l}$ and 1 J lead. First floor. Phase 1.

## BUILDING 2

Building 2 is oriented NNW-SSE in the centre of the site (Illus 13-16); it is 23 m long and 5 m wide. It is on the Second Edition OS map but has been partially rebuilt. It is a stone rubble building but has been altered using concrete blocks in the E wall (Illus 11). The stone wall of Building 6 can be seen on the interior where Building 2 has been added on after the construction of Building 6 (Illus 12). The original building may have been single storey but the building has been extended in height with metal paneling and asbestos concrete roofing (Illus 11).

## Room 2A

Room on the $S$ end of the building with concrete block stairs in SE corner. Divided from other rooms with wooden partitions. Ground floor.

Room 2B
Small room in centre of building. Divided from other rooms with wooden partitions. Ground floor.

Room 2C
Small room in centre of building. Divided from other rooms with wooden partitions. Ground floor.

Room 2D
Small room in centre of building. Divided from other rooms with wooden partitions. Ground floor.

Room 2E
Room at N end of building. Divided from other rooms with wooden partitions. Ground floor.
Room 2H
Wood paneled room at S end of building with concrete block stairs in SE corner. Divided from Room 21 with wooden partition. First floor.

Room 21
Wood paneled room at N end of building. Divided from Room 2 H with wooden partition. First floor.

## BUILDING 3

Building 3 is a former garage 12 m wide and 15 m deep constructed of concrete blocks (Illus 17-24). It is two storey with large windows (now covered) on the ground floor Cross Street
façade (W30, W31, W32) and smaller windows above (W27, W28, W30). There is a small blocked door on the N wall (Illus 16). The building has been extensively modernized and the ground floor was used as a shop and the upper floor as a flat. There is a 1927 date stone in the gablet on the E facade (llus 20, 21). There has been a large door on the $S$ wall which would have allowed access to the forecourt (Illus 23). The garage forecourt structures and petrol tanks have been recently removed.

The concrete blocks used in the construction can be seen on the first floor level where asbestos contractors have removed plasterboard (Illus 24).

Room 3A
Max 7.8 m wide and 5 m long L -shaped living room /kitchen 2with windows on the E wall (WS28 and W29). First floor flat.

Room 3B
Bedroom $4 \times 4 \mathrm{~m}$ in size with window W27 on E wall. First floor flat.

Room 3C
Walk in wardrobe/storeroom $1.2 \times 4 \mathrm{~m}$ in size. First floor flat.
Room 3D
Bathroom $1.4 \times 2 \mathrm{~m}$ in size with window on N wall. First floor flat.

Room 3E
Corridor 1 max 1.3 m wide from concrete stairs at W side of property through to Room 3A. First floor flat.

Room 3F
Former main room of garage $7.6 \times 7.7 \mathrm{~m}$ in size with large windows on E façade (W30, 31, 32) now blocked. The room is not partitioned and is full of shelving and rubbish. Ground floor.

Room 3G
Corridor in converted garage building 1.2 m wide. Ground floor.

Room 3H
Small room with fire doors on both S and N walls and access to flat above. Ground floor.

Room 31
4.5 m wide office/storeroom on W side of corridor 3G. No windows, building 4 abuts the W wall of this room. Ground floor.

Room 3J
4 m wide toilets/kitchen on W side of corridor 3G. No windows, building 4 abuts the W wall of this room. Ground floor.

Room 3K
3.4 m wide office on W side of corridor 3 G . No windows, building 4 abuts the W wall of this room. Ground floor.

## BUILDING 4

Building 4 is 16 m W-E and 10.5 m N -S (Illus 25). It has been constructed of granite rubble but the N wall has been rebuilt in the middle of the $20^{\text {th }}$ century using concrete blocks and internal buttresses (Illus 25-28). The exterior of this wall is harled (Illus 27).

The interior of the $S$ wall has four fireplaces (Illus 29-31) built into the upper level of the wall (F12-16). The fireplaces are constructed of red brick and stone lintel and are 1.3 m wide and 1.8 m high. It was originally two storeys and these fireplaces are on the first floor level. They have probably been within small upper rooms, possibly living accommodation and the walls of these rooms have been removed and the interior walls whitewashed removing all evidence of them.

The W wall of the building has a double gable (Illus 26); the S one is built in stone, the N one in brick and then the N wall of the building was then rebuilt in concrete block. The building has then been reroofed in metal and asbestos cement roofing.

## BUILDING 5

Building 5 is a small harled shed added on to the N wall of Building 4 (Illus 233. It has a garage door on the W wall and a small access door on the N wall.

## BUILDING 6

Building 6 is 19 m long and 7.5 m wide (Illus $34-35$ ) and constructed of granite blocks with cherry cocking. It is single storey and has three cart doors on the N façade facing into the courtyard (D4, D5, D6 (Illus 36-39) and smaller windows. The building is now divided into three units, each modernized for more recent use. The large doors have been reduced in size with concrete inserts. This building may have been stables. There is a blocked window in the W gable but this is not accessible as it is within an electricity sub-station (Illus 40) and is not visible on the interior as this end of the building has wood paneling throughout. There is a wooden stair within the building and an upper floor which was not accessed due to the poor state of the wood. The wooden room partitions were inserted after the blocking and reducing in size of the doors on the N wall as they partially cover the blocked apertures. The previous room dividers are not now visible.

## Room 6A

Room 6 A is $7.9 \times$ (max) 5.8 m . the floor is made from granite cassies (E end, concrete in the centre and concrete blocks at the W end). It is divided from other rooms with wooden partitions. Phase 2 partitioning after doors blocked and resized. There are wooden stairs to the first floor from this room but the wood is rotten and there is no access.

## Room 6B

Room 6B is $2.6 \times 3.5 \mathrm{~m}$ in size and has a hatch through to Room 6A and a door ro 6C. There is a window in the N wall (W33). It is divided from other rooms with wooden partitions.

Room 6C

Room 6C is $3.5 \times 7.6 \mathrm{~m}$ in size and has a wooden floor (laid on top of concrete). There are wooden stairs to the first floor from this room but the wood is rotten and there is no access. It is divided from other rooms with wooden partitions.

Room 6D
Room 6D is $3.3 \times 7.6 \mathrm{~m}$ in size with a wooden floor; the walls of this window partially cover D6 which has been reduced in size when this building was converted into small rooms. It is divided from other rooms with wooden partitions.

Room 6E
Room 6 E is $3.8 \times 7.6 \mathrm{~m}$ in size and there is a blocked window (W34) in the N wall; the room is lined with shelves. It is divided from other rooms with wooden partitions.

## BUILDING 7

Building 7 is a mid $20^{\text {th }}$-century granite block building single storey on the corner of Manse Street and Mid Street (Illus 41-50). It is 14 m long and 8 m wide with extensions on the S side of the building. It is now Aberdeenshire Council offices. There are windows on the N and W facades and doors on both facades. It includes Rooms 7A-7E.

## Room 7A

Room 7A is the reception and waiting room for Aberdeenshire Council finance and is a maximum of 9.2 m long and 4.05 m wide. There is a counter at the S end and an interview room (7C) has been built into this room. There are windows on the N and W wall (W17-24). In Phase 1 building.

Room 7B
S of Room 7A is an office and counters for staff in Finance. It is a maximum of 9.2 m long and 4.8 m wide and has a central wood partition. There are windows on the w wall (W23-26) and Door D9. In Phase 1 building.

Room 7C
Small Interview Room built between Rooms 7A and 7B 2.3m wide and 4m long. In Phase 1 building.

Room 7D
Room 7D is an office for Aberdeenshire Council housing and is $4.6 \times 3.4 \mathrm{~m}$ in size. There are windows on the N wall (W14-16) and a counter for members of the public on the W wall. There is a door through the original E wall of the Phase 1 building (to Room 7l) showing the wall is 0.8 m thick. In Phase 1 building.

Room 7E
This is a corridor through the Phase 1 building from Room 7A into the offices and through to the rear of the building. In Phase 1 building.

Building 7A is a modern extension (Illlus 48) on the E side of Building 7 and is also used by Aberdeenshire Council. It includes Rooms 7l-7P. There are also wooden and concrete harled extensions on the S side of the building including Rooms $7 \mathrm{~F}, \mathrm{G}$ and H .

Room 7F
Kitchen $2 \times 2.8 \mathrm{~m}$ in size in a wood and concrete shed attached to the S of the building. Window in $S$ wall. Phase $2 / 3$.

Room 7G
Storeroom $2.5 \times 3.2 \mathrm{~m}$ in size in a wood and concrete shed attached to the S of the building.
Phase 2/3. Door in S wall.

Room 7H
Office $2.3 \times 3.4 \mathrm{~m}$ in size. In concrete harled extension on $S$ of building. Phase $2 / 3$.

## Room 71

Office on N side of building $5.2 \times 4.4 \mathrm{~m}$ in size with windows on N wall (W13). Door through to Phase 1 Room 7D. Phase 2 extension.

Room 7J
Office on N side of building $5.3 \times 5.5 \mathrm{~m}$ in size with windows on N wall (W12). Phase 2 extension.

Room 7K
Corridor through Phase 2 building with offices 7 I and 7 J to N and Offices 7 O and P and toilets, switch room and filing room (7L, M, N) to the S. Phase 2 extension.

## Room 7L

Small filing room S side corridor $7 \mathrm{~K}, 2.5 \times 1.5 \mathrm{~m}$. Phase 2 extension.

Room 7M
Small switch room S side corridor $7 \mathrm{~K}, 2.2 \times 1.5 \mathrm{~m}$. Phase 2 extension.

Room 7N
Toilets S side corridor $7 \mathrm{~K} \max 4 \times 6 \mathrm{~m}$ including corridor. Phase 2 extension.

Room 70
Office $2.8 \times 4.4 \mathrm{~m}$ in size with window on S wall and corridor 7 K on N side. Phase 2 extension.

Room 7P
Office $2.8 \times 4.4 \mathrm{~m}$ in size with window on S wall and corridor 7 K on N side. Phase 2 extension.
