## **SUMMARY**

A Level 1 standing building survey was carried out on 14 March 2018. The farmhouse and C-shaped steading were probably built on the early-mid 19<sup>th</sup> century and then extensions added in Phase 2, prior to the Second Edition OS map (Illus 18). At that date there was a circular horse-mill attached to the SW of the steading. Later buildings and extensions were added up to the late 20<sup>th</sup> century.

It is recommended that no further archaeological work is required during the current planning applications.



# 1 INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 The site (Illus 1) is located on the E side of the B979 Netherley Road on the s side of Stranog Hill. It is centred on NGR NO 86537 95833, at 159-162m OD (Illus 1) and in the parish of Fetteresso.
- 1.2 The work was commissioned by Cameron Forbes. Two planning applications APP/2016/2336 and APP/2016/2337 for one and three dwellinghouses were approved by Aberdeenshire Council on 4 Oct 2016 and is a requirement for a Level 1 standing building survey.
- 1.3 All the archaeological work was carried out in the context of Scottish Planning Policy (SPP) Planning Advice Note (PAN 2/2011) and Scottish Historic Environment Scotland's Policy Statement (HESPS), which state that archaeological remains should be regarded as part of the environment to be protected and managed.



Illus 1 Location plan (Contains Ordnance Survey data © Crown copyright and database right 2018)

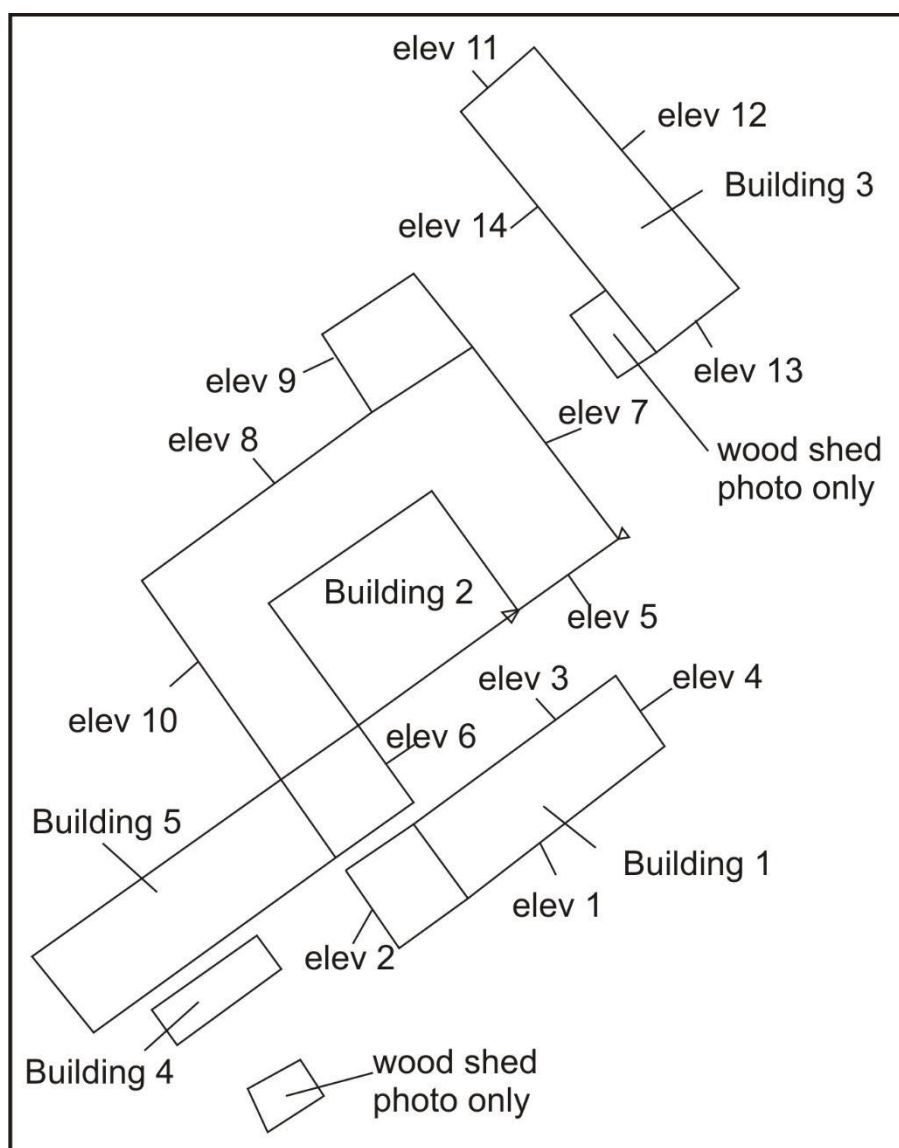


## 2 BACKGROUND

Whiteside is a 19<sup>th</sup>-century farmstead which is not on HES Pastmap or Aberdeenshire Council Sites and Monuments Record (HER). On the First Edition OS map (Illus 19) it is a C-shaped steading aligned NW-SE with a rectangular building at the open end of the C with garden to the SE and circular structure to the E. By the Second Edition OS map (Illus 20) the SW arm of the C-shaped steading has been extended and a building attached to the NW, a circular horse mill attached to the SW of this steading and a small building erected to the SE and the circular building is still extant and two small buildings constructed nearby to the NE of the garden.

## 3 THE LEVEL 1 STANDING BUILDING SURVEY

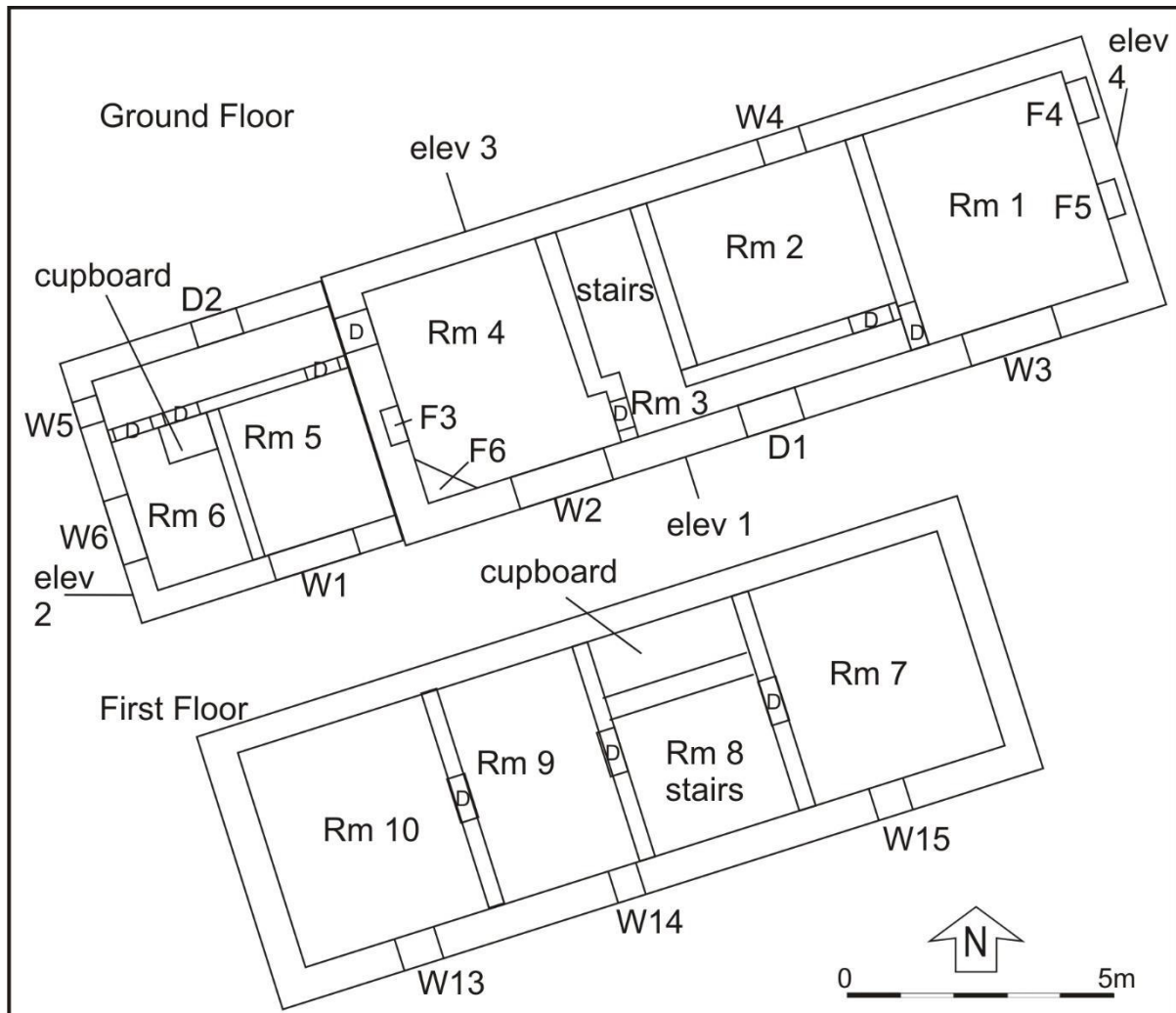
A level 1 standing building survey was carried out on 14 March 2018; the weather was bright but with very strong wind. Building 2 is in poor condition including the roofs and the interior was mostly excluded from this survey. The interior of the other buildings and exterior of all buildings was accessible. Architects plans were checked and annotated (Illus 2) and individual building plans and elevations drawn and a photographic survey undertaken.



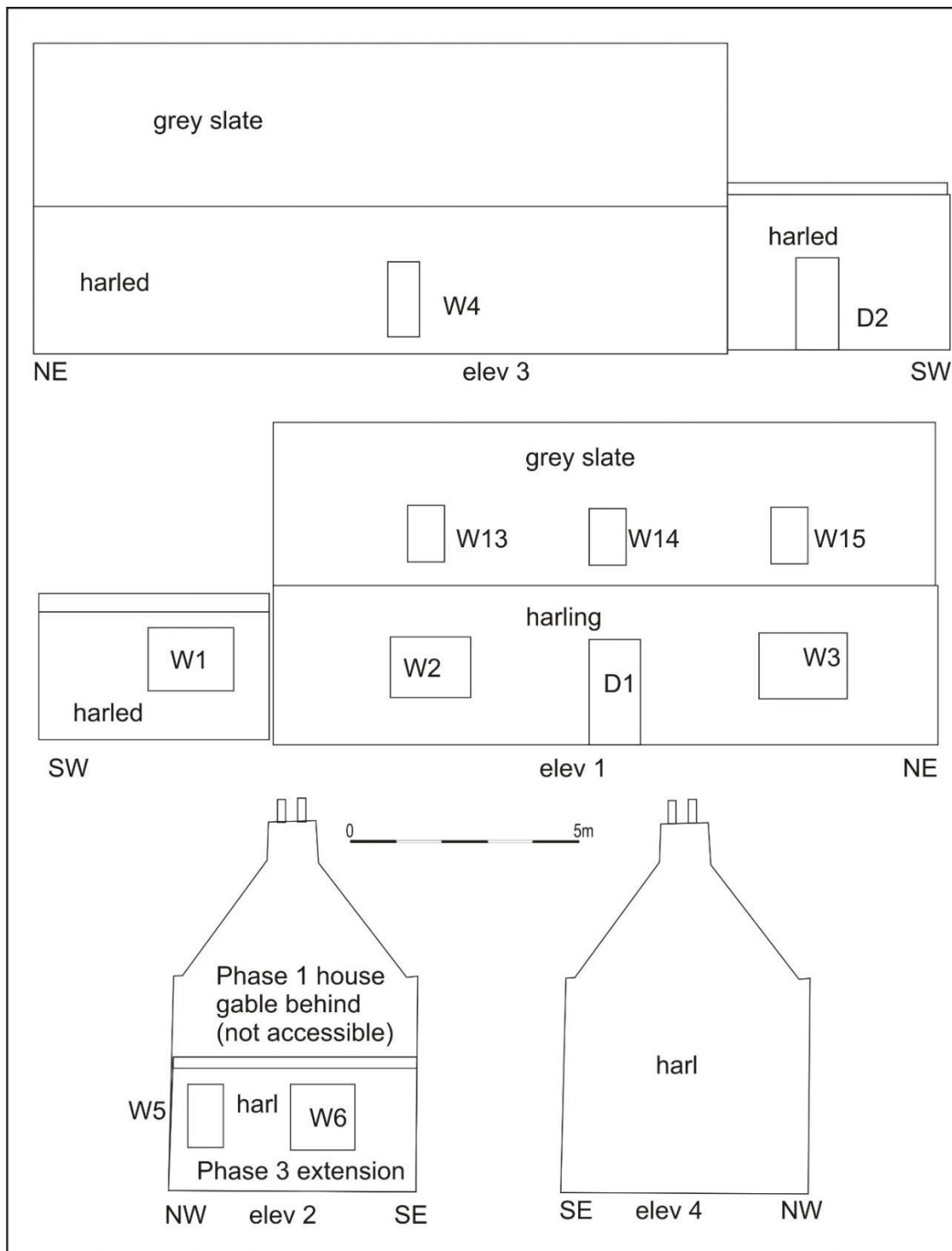
Illus 2 Buildings 1-5 annotated with building and elevation numbers used in this survey (from copyright Mackie Ramsay Taylor Architects)

### 3.1 Building 1

Building 1 is a farmhouse measuring 15m long and 5.2m wide constructed of granite; the building is harled but window W4 has granite sill, jambs and lintel. The building is two storey with the main façade on the SE with central door (D1) large windows in Rooms 12 (reception room) and Room 4 (former kitchen) and dormers in the attic rooms (Rooms 7, 8, 9). There is a new Phase 3 extension on the SW end (Rooms 5 and 6) with kitchen, bathroom and back door (D2).



Illus 3 Building 1 ground and first floor plans annotated with numbers used in this survey (from copyright Mackie Ramsay Taylor Architects)



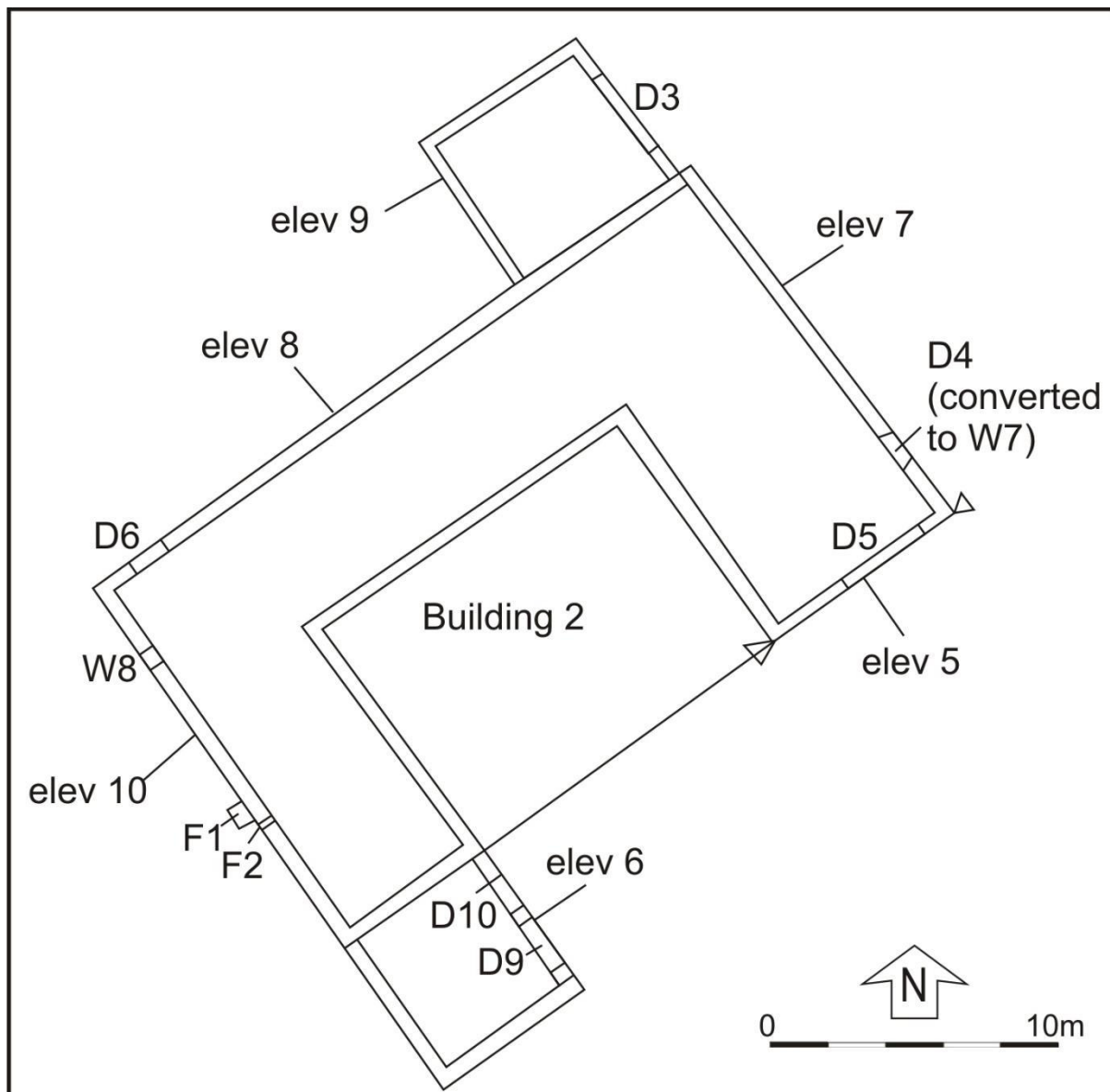
Illus 4 Building 1 elevations



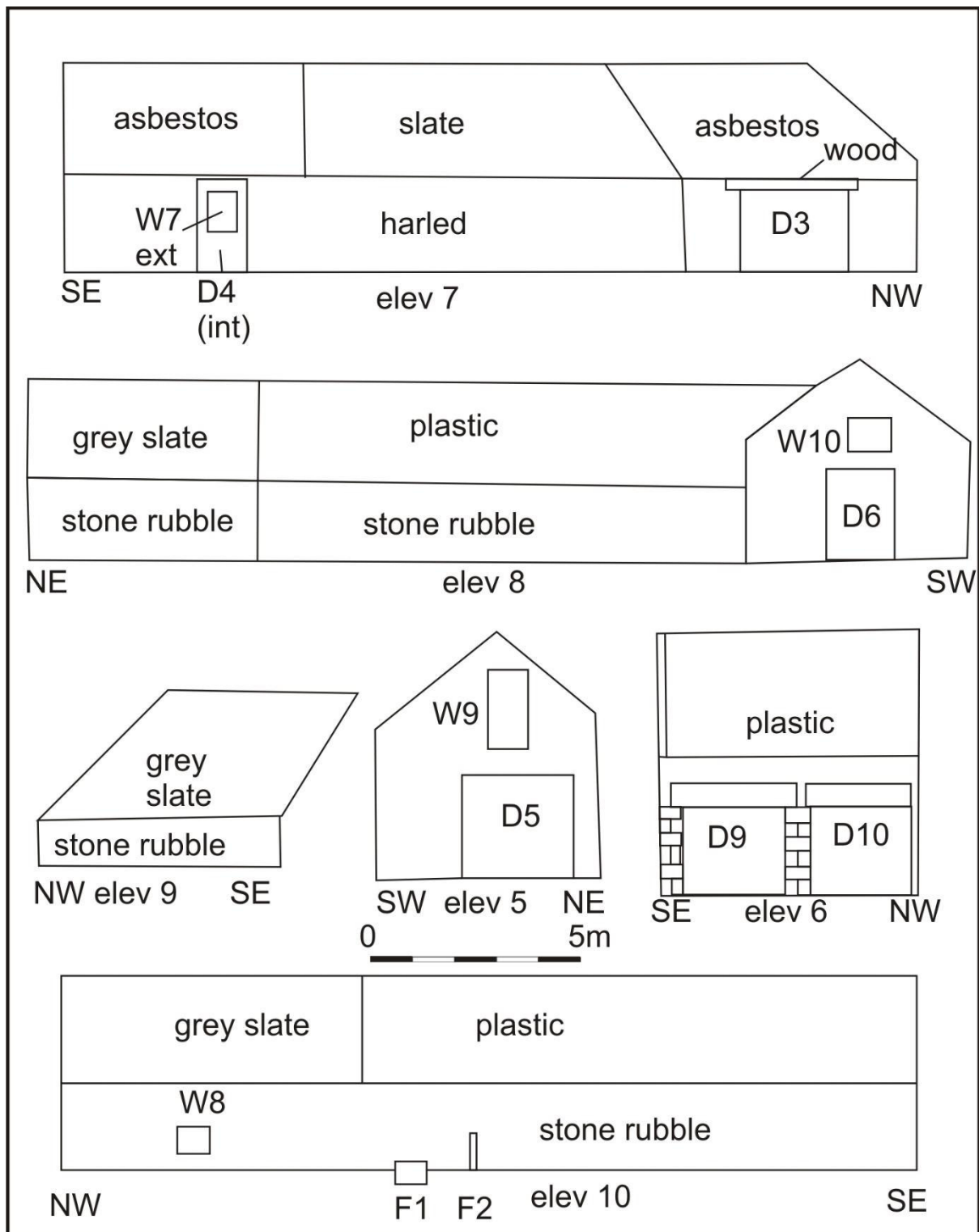
### 3.2 Building 2

Building 2 is a C-shaped steading 19.2m NW-SE and 21.6m SW-NE (Illus 7, 8). There was little access into the interior of the building. The building is constructed of fieldstone including granite, sandstone and quartz and the apertures are tooled granite. A cartshed with two large doors (D9 and D10; Illus 9) was added to the SE end of the SW wing in Phase 2 and a small building added to the NW end of the NE wing also in Phase 2 (Illus 10). The courtyard was enclosed in the late 20<sup>th</sup> century.

There was a circular horsemill on the SW side of this building on the OS maps (Illus 19,20); there is a stone block with metal fittings (F1) and a rectangular slit aperture 0.11m wide and 0.7m high (F2; see cover photo) which are probably associated with this construction. F2 is probably an aperture for connecting the horse-mill mechanism into the milling mechanism within the building.

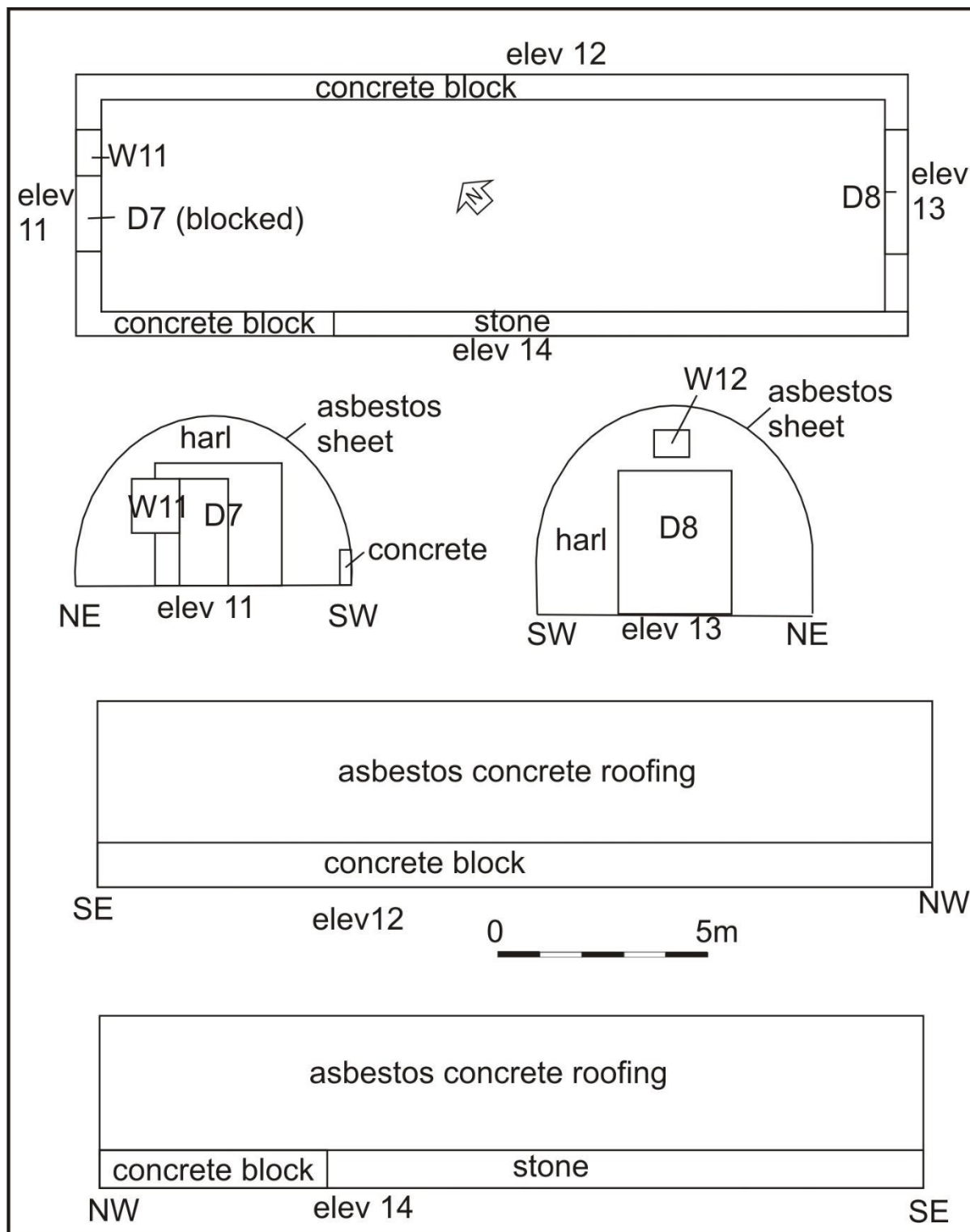

### 3.3 Building 3

Building 3 is a stone, concrete block and asbestos sheeting Nissen-type building (Illus 11, 12). It is 17.9m NW-SE and 5.7m NE-SW. The SE end of the SW wall is constructed of piled stones (Illus 13) on the interior and exterior but the remainder of the walls are concrete block (Illus 14). The roof is concrete asbestos corrugated roofing material. There is a door on the SE end and a small window in the NW wall; the NW wall had a larger door but this has been blocked and there is harling over the scar (Illus 15).

Building 5 is the concrete base of a ruined Dutch barn (Illus 17).

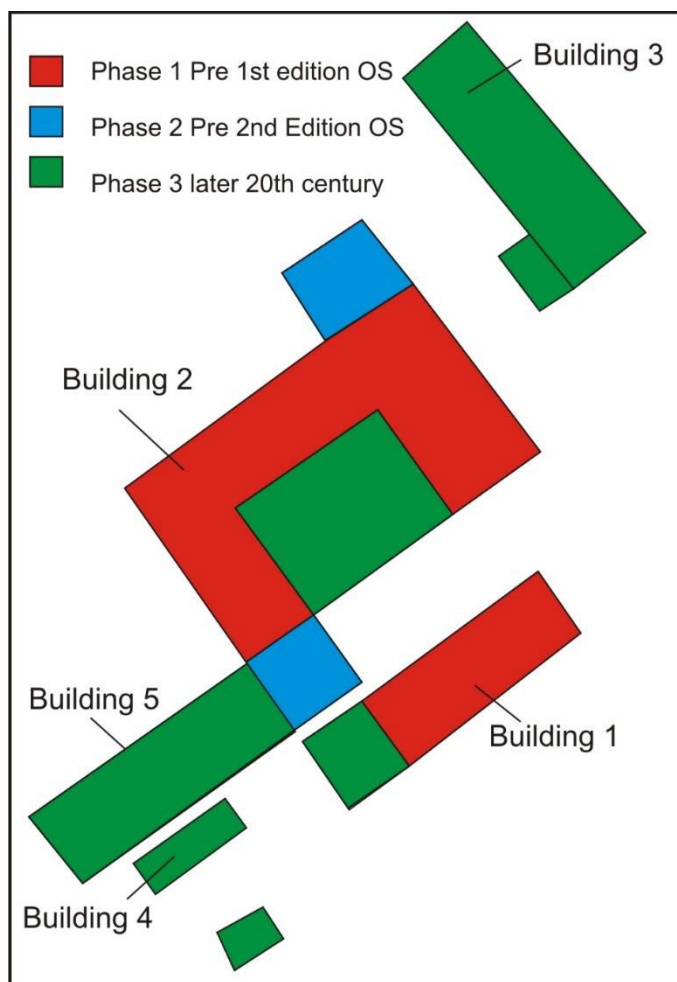


Illus 17 Building 4 (top) and concrete base of Building 5 (bottom); facing S

## 4 CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

A Level 1 standing building survey was carried out on 14 March 2018. The farmhouse and C-shaped steading were probably built on the early-mid 19<sup>th</sup> century and then extensions added in Phase 2, prior to the Second Edition OS map (Illus 18). Later buildings and extensions were added up to the late 20<sup>th</sup> century.

It is recommended that no further archaeological work is required during the current planning applications.

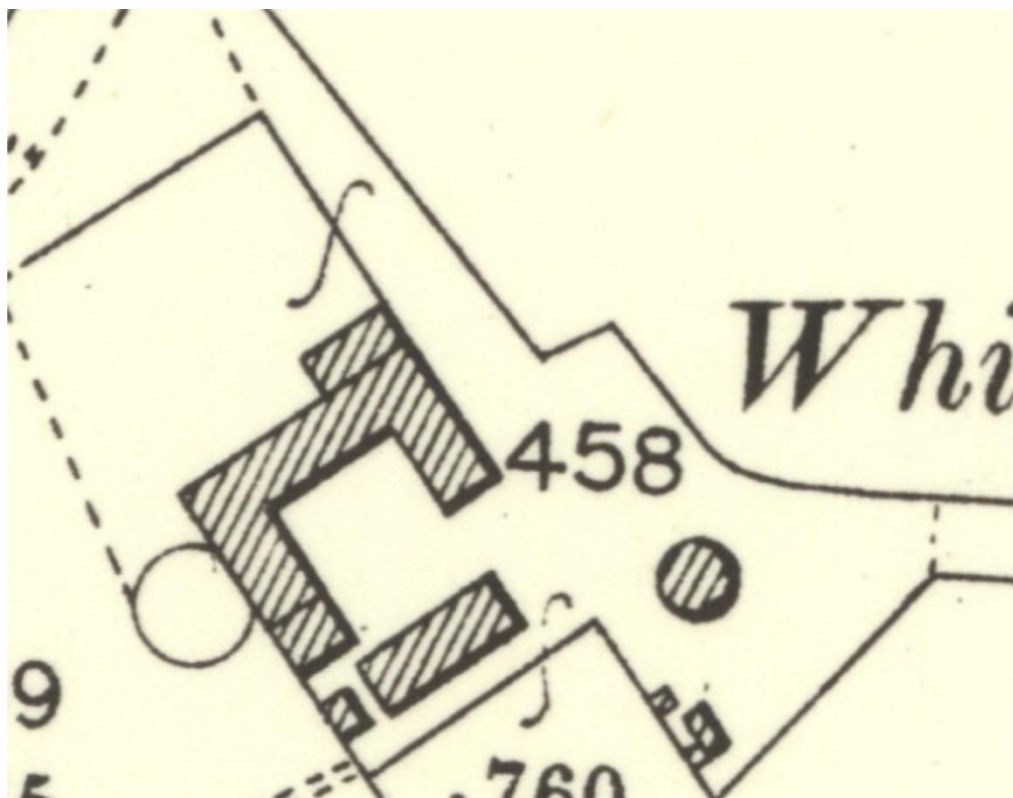

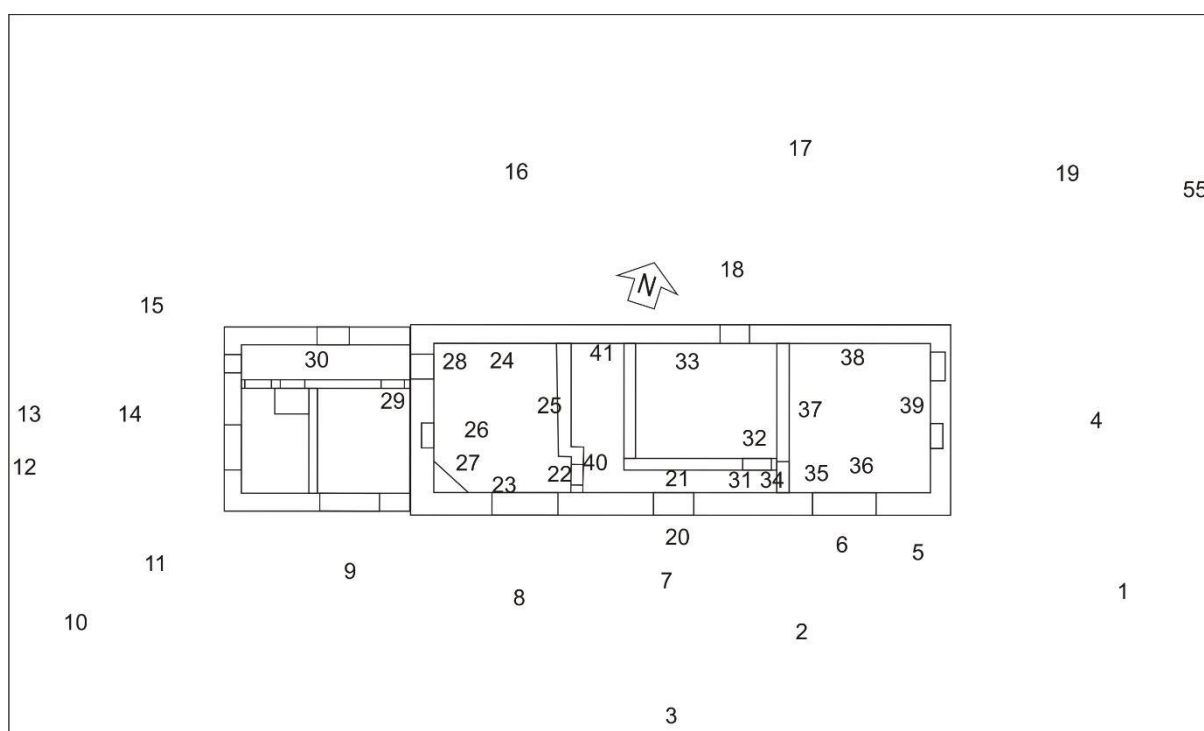

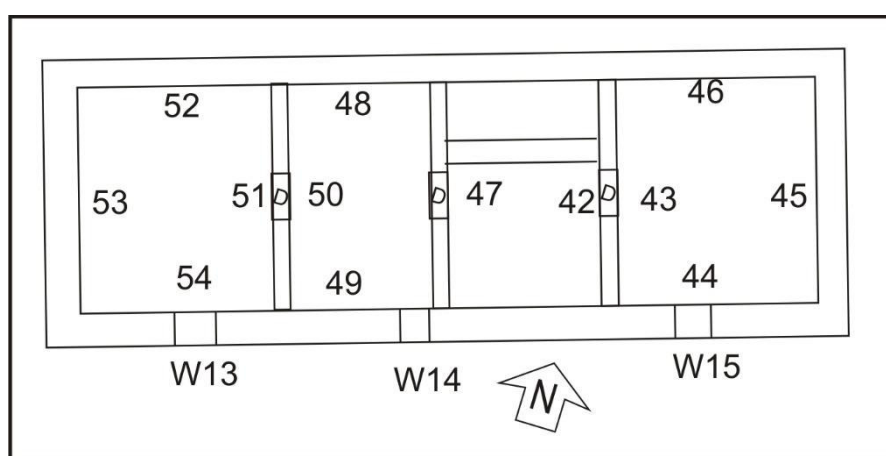

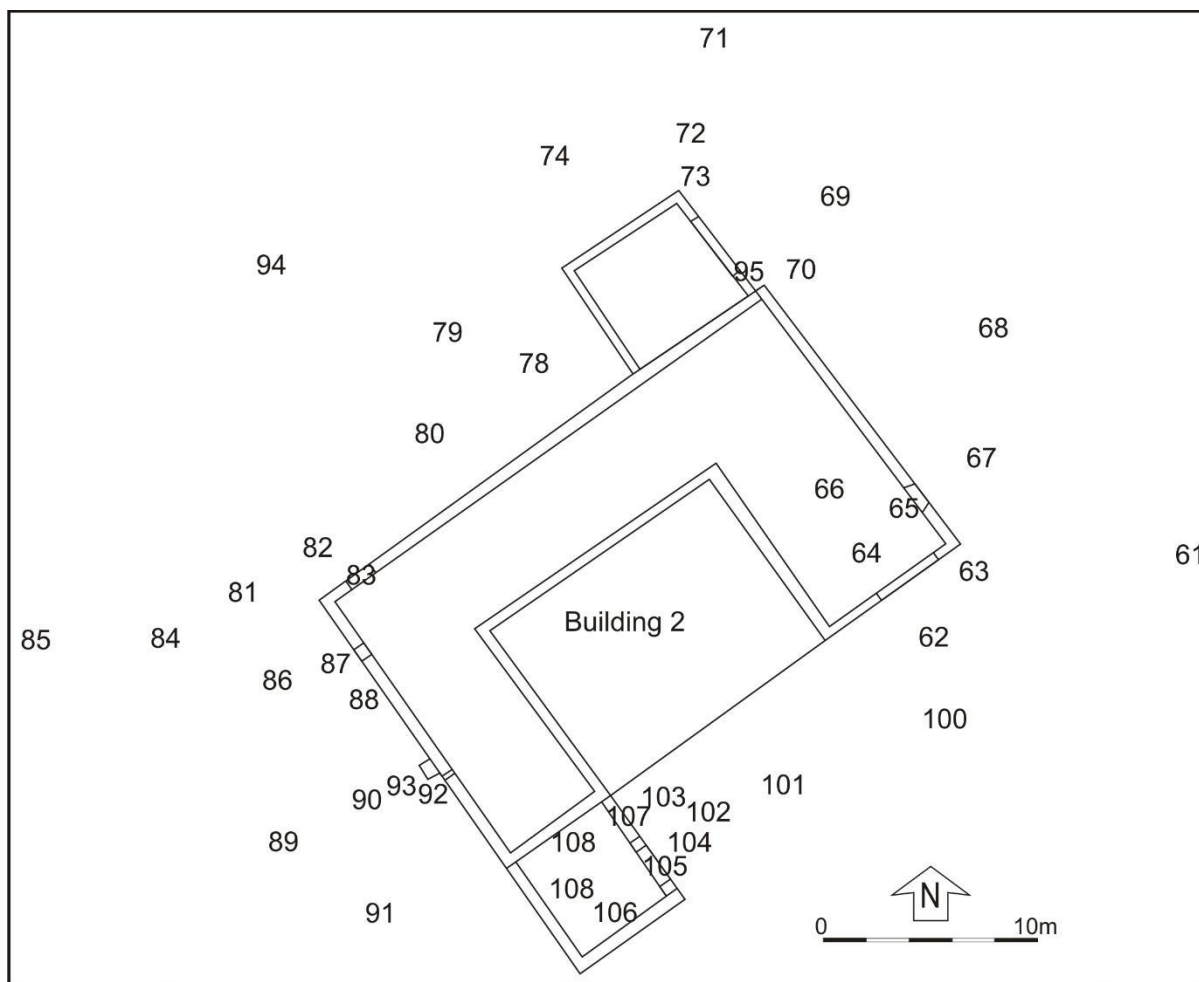

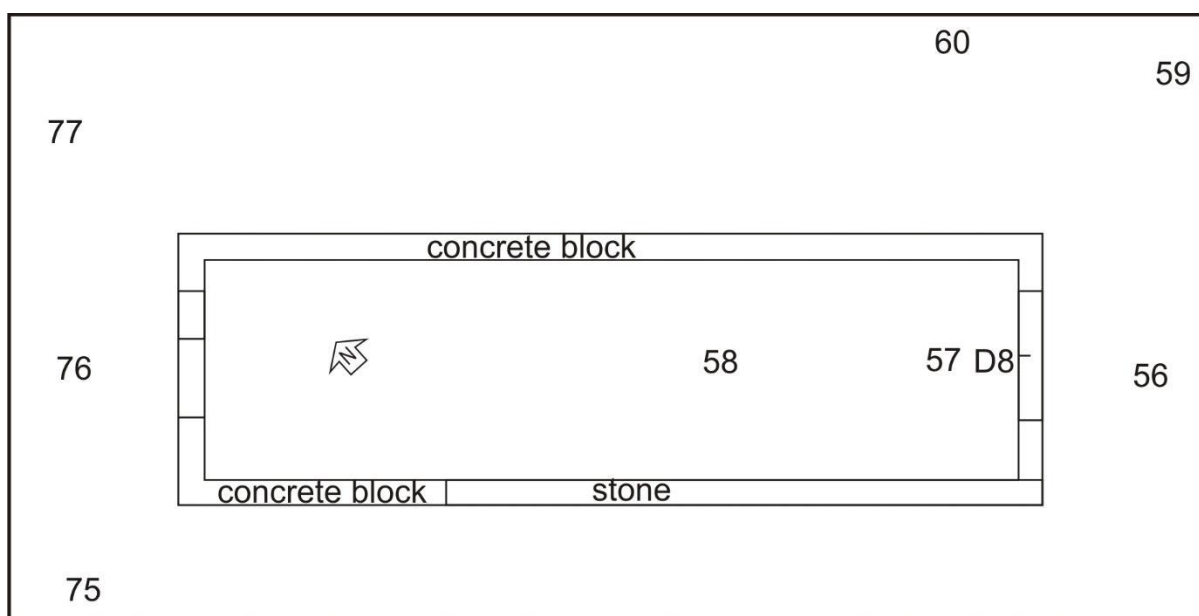
