

#### SUMMARY

A watching brief was carried out on 20 May 2018 during the excavation of a trench for a new underground electric supply to a cottage and a shed. Although there is a possible souterrain known in the NE of the field (on the E side of the Dutch barn), no archaeological features were identified during the watching brief. Two flints and a sherd of medieval pottery were recovered and the excavation of the trench is now complete.

# **1 BACKGROUND**

- 1.1 The site (Illus 1) is located to the SE of Little Gight. It is at NGR NJ 83837 39918 (N end) NJ 84039 39632 (S end), at 45-65m OD in the parish of Fyvie.
- 1.2 The work was commissioned by SSE. Aberdeenshire Council Archaeology Service require a watching brief during the excavation of the cable trench.
- 1.3 The work was carried out in the context of Scottish Planning Policy (SPP) Planning Advice Note (PAN 2/2011) and Historic Environment Scotland's Policy Statement (HESPS) which state that archaeological remains should be regarded as part of the environment to be protected and managed.




Illus 1 Location plan (Contains Ordnance Survey data © Crown copyright and database right 2018)

# 2 ARCHAEOLOGICAL BACKGROUND

The Historic Environment Record (HER) and Canmore (HES) were consulted online within 1km of the proposed development.


- 2.1 There are no Scheduled Monuments within 1km of the proposed trench. There are several archaeological sites within the immediate vicinity of the trench. Immediately to the E of Little Gight, a souterrain (HER NJ83NW0011) was found c1869 then closed off; it was rediscovered in 1988 during ploughing when the plough dislodged a roof slab. A small excavation trench revealed walling on the E side and massive over slabs, the roofing apparently appears to be still in situ supported by walling (Shepherd, Barclay and Murray 1989, 19). A stony patch c3m in diameter lies 10m to NE. A spindle whorl (NJ83NW0025) was found in vicinity.
- 2.2 A number of flints have been found in field including thumbnail scrapers, suggesting a Mesolithic occupation site (HER NJ83NW0024); there is a particularly high concentration of microliths in an area to the SE.
- 2.3 Site of a now destroyed croft (HER NJ83NW0039) that is depicted as being roofless on the 1867 1st edition OS map (Illus 5). The map shows two rectangular buildings with an attached garden. By 1888 on the 2nd edition OS map (Illus 6) the buildings are once again roofed.
- 2.4 There is the remains of a sawmill at Little Gight (HER NJ83NW0023); one gable end and entry for shaft plus the wheel-pit is all that survives; mill race above stream (Shepherd 1989, 19).

## **3 THE WATCHING BRIEF**

A watching brief was carried out on 20 May 2018 (Illus 3) during the excavation of a trench for a new underground electric supply to a cottage and a shed. A 14 ton tracked machine with 0.5m toothless ditching bucket removed the topsoil along the full length of the trench (Illus 3). The topsoil was shallow at the N end of the trench and the underlying geology is rock. The centre of the trench is rusty brown sand and rock natural with topsoil up to 0.5m deep; two flints and a sherd of very abraded 13-14<sup>th</sup>-century East Coast redware (Illus 4) were recovered from the S end of this field. The S field had very shallow topsoil with numerous rocks and a rock subsoil; this field is on a steep slope and has not been ploughed often (if at all). No archaeological features were identified during the watching brief.




