## Mackie Village, Ury Estate, Stonehaven Data Structure Report (DSR) for Archaeological Evaluation Cameron Archaeology CA466

### Aberdeenshire Council Planning applications APP/2018/2227 and 2228



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#### Summary

From May 1st to May 3rd, 2019, an 8% archaeological evaluation (out of a targeted 7-10%) was carried out at the proposed site of Mackie Village, immediately NNW of Stonehaven, Aberdeenshire and located east of the A957 Slug Road/A90 intersection. The western portion of the soils strip area revealed the edge of the former sand and gravel operations, while the remainder of the site consisted of a mottled clay/loam subsoil with sporadic pockets of modern debris, such as rope and plastics, most likely from infill or levelling associated with the former quarry operation. No archaeological finds or features were noted and it is therefore recommended that no other archaeological mitigation is deemed necessary during the current planning application.

#### 1 BACKGROUND

- 1.1 The site (Illus 1) is located on the NE of Stonehaven on the SE side of the Ury Estate adjacent to the A90. It is at NGR NO8621087220, at 34-40m OD in the parish of Fetteresso.
- 1.2 The work was commissioned by Jonathon Milne. This evaluation report covers applications APP/2018/2227 and 2228 erection of dwellinghouses and flats which required a 7-10% archaeological evaluation (condition 1).
- 1.3 All the archaeological work was carried out in the context of Scottish Planning Policy (SPP) Planning Advice Note (PAN 2/2011) and Historic Environment Scotland's Policy Statement (HESPS) which state that archaeological remains should be regarded as part of the environment to be protected and managed.

#### 2 ARCHAEOLOGICAL BACKGROUND

- 2.1 There is 12 Scheduled Monuments (Illus 4) within 1km of the proposed development. Raedykes, Roman camp 600m NE of South Raedykes (HER NO89SW0002). The monument is the remains of a large Roman camp, built probably in the late first century AD during the early Roman occupation of NE Scotland, although construction during a later Roman campaign cannot be ruled out. It is visible as earthworks defining well-preserved sections of the rampart and defensive ditch. The rampart and ditch are visible on all four sides of the camp, except in the NW corner. The camp lies between 155m and 192m above sea level and includes the summit of Garrison Hill, which offers views down Glen Ury to the coast 5km to the SE at Stonehaven. The monument was first scheduled in 1972, but the documents did not meet modern standards; the present amendment rectifies this. The camp measures about 700m NNW-SSE by 960m transversely and encloses an area of about 38.9 ha. The rampart measures up to 5m in width and stands 0.8m in height, with the ditch measuring up to 4.3m wide and 1.3m deep. Four of the camp's original six tituli (mounds of earth that act as defences in front of the gates) survive as low mounds, with ditches surrounding the external facing. The camp is irregular in plan with an elongated NE corner, its shape being largely dictated by the local topography.
- 2.2 Findlayston, cairn, enclosure and field systems (HER NO88NW0012). The monument includes a burial cairn 22m across and 1.2m high, and enclosure measuring 19m x 17m across a slight bank with an entrance on its N side, parts of two trackways running approximately NNW/SSE across the edges of the low hill, about 110 cairns of a cairnfield containing 120 cairns, and parts of a later field system best preserved on the W flank of the hill. The polygonal area to be scheduled includes these features and an area in which activities associated with them may be expected to survive and measures up to 470m EW by up to 375m NS.
- 2.3 Glenton Hill ,house, enclosure and field system (NO88NW0017). The monument comprises parts of several field systems overlapping one another and includes 85 or more cairns of a local group of 125, 3 out of the 5 round houses known locally, an enclosure, lynchets and numerous field banks. One of the round houses and a cairn are in the corner of a c 30 year old plantation where trees grow sparsely. The structures not included in this proposal are in thickly grown parts of the plantation. The northernmost house has an internal diameter of 8m within a massive bank. It sits within a rectangular field measuring c 57m by 48m which appears to be part of a system of rectangular fields defined by strong banks up to 3m wide and 0.6 m high lying immediately W and NW of the plantation. The other two round houses in the area to be scheduled measure 6-7m across and their banks stand to no more than 0.3m. The enclosure measures 7.8m in diameter inside banks 0.4m high. It has entrances to NNE and SSW. The cairns measure between 3m and 6m across and vary up to about 0.7m high. In addition to the massive field banks referred to above there are traces of other banks, some very slight. The proposal specifically excludes the above-ground structure of the electricity pylon in the area.
- 2.4 White Hill, house and field system (NO89SE0013). The monument is in an area of heather moorland. It comprises two round houses, the larger measuring 8 m across internally within a bank up to 2.5m wide. The other, 125m to the SSE on the shoulder of the hill, measures c 6m across within a bank 1.5m wide and 0.2m high. There are low cairns round both houses, up to 4m across by 0.4m high in the vicinity of the larger house, and among them short lengths of stony bank.
- 2.5 Campstone Hill, ring cairns, cairns and field systems (NO89SW0003). The monument comprises 4 ring cairns. One is partially excavated; it is 15m in external and 4m in internal diameter and is surrounded by a low stone circle of which some 9 stones measuring up to 1m tall survive. The other three measure respectively about

- 8.5, 7.5 and 10.2m in diameter. The latter is complex and multiperiod; it has remains of a fine stone circle round it about 14m in diameter. The cairns are much obscured by whin and may be larger. On the summit of Campstone Hill is a burial cairn about 6.5m across by 0.5m high. The monument also includes a possible house platform up to 7m across bounded on the downhill side by a 2m wide stony bank, up to 300 small clearance cairns, and numerous lengths of stony bank forming at least one field system. At the NW end of the area is an embanked hollow way and banks defining a further field system, of the pre-improvement period.
- 2.6 Newbigging, earthwork (NO88NW0022). The monument consists of a bank and ditch extending 180m ENE/WSW across part of a gentle ridge running up to Raedykes Hill. The bank measures up to 4.5m across by up to 1.2m high; the ditch is on its S side and is up to 4m broad by slightly over 1m deep. The bank and ditch control only the W side of the ridge although the E side appears little different, and they cannot in isolation have been a sound defence.
- 2.7 Cheynehill Wood,enclosures & field systems 750m N of Hillhead (NO88NW0083). The monument comprises two small circular enclosures, one of which measures 7m across within a bank up to 1.5m wide by 0.2m high and is probably a house while the other is 4m across within a 1m wide bank standing to 0.2m. The main feature of the area, however, is the set of banks and small clearance cairns. The banks appear in places to define roughly rectilinear fields but for the most part they are irregular and probably represent more a method of field clearance than definition of regular plots, although it may be that part of the apparent irregularity is due to diachronicity. At least 55 cairns, most measuring between 2m and 5m in diameter, are scattered over the area of the field system; two measure 6m in diameter.
- 2.8 Kirktown of Fetteresso, settlement (NO88NE0038). The monument consists of two separate areas. All of the remains display little or no surface relief, appearing in arable fields as marks in cereal crops. Experience shows that further remains will survive around and between the visible marks. The first part of the monument comprises the remains of an enclosed prehistoric settlement, defined by a narrow ditch enclosing an area 80m in diameter. The second part of the monument comprises the remains of an extensive unenclosed prehistoric visible as ring-ditches and solid circular marks (the sites of houses), a souterrain, a pit alignment and other associated features.
- 2.9 St Ciaran's Church, old parish church, Fetteresso (NO88NE0001). The monument consists of the remains of the former parish church of Fetteresso which was dedicated in 1246, and remained in use until the early 19th century. The ruined church is likely to overlie the remains of the church of St Ciaran. The church is situated in an old graveyard in the hamlet of Kirkton of Fetteresso. It was originally rectangular on plan and measures 26.6m E-W by 6.8m N-S, over walls 0.8m thick. The church underwent modification in the 17th century and a N projecting aisle was added in 1720. The walls of random rubble masonry stand to wallhead level. All the openings are blocked apart from a pointed-arched doorway in the N wall towards the W end. There have been three entrances and six windows in the S wall.
- 2.10 Cowie Line, pill box & anti-tank blocks 450m W of Ury House (NO88NE0088). The monument comprises the remains of a Type-22 pill box and other wartime defensive structures covering the southern end of the viaduct crossing the gorge of the Cowie Water, south of Ury Home Farm, and the older bridge below it. The pill box box is 6-sided, made of a mixture of granite, concrete and brick. There is a stanchion to attach a barbed wire entanglement. There are 5 concrete tank blocks: 2 at the S end of the viaduct and 3 blocking the S end of the older bridge below. There are traces of earthworks on the slope between the pill box and the Cowie Water. There are faint traces of further structures to the west of the pill box. There are two areas to be

scheduled. The western contains the pill box and other structures; it measures a maximum of 80m NW to SE by 22m transversely. The eastern area contains the tank blocks and the earthworks; it measures a maximum of 40m N to S by 35 m transversely.

- 2.11 Cowie Line, pill boxes & anti-tank blocks 200m SW-275m SE of Ury House (NO88NE0129). The monument comprises two Type-22 pill boxes, situated on high ground to the south of the Cowie Water, covering the bridge over the river SE of Ury House, and its approaches. The pill boxes are 6-sided, made of a mixture of granite, concrete and brick. The western pillbox has additional firing loops on two sides. There are also concrete tank blocks on both sides of the bridge and 6 fine examples to the NW of the western pill box on the south bank of the Cowie Water. To the west of the bridge the southern bank of the Cowie Water has been made vertical to provide a further obstacle. To the east of the bridge, in a wood, is a possible weapon pit.
- 2.12 The proposed development is within the estate of Ury House (NO88NE0104). remains of a designed landscape possibly dating back to the 1700s. The house is B Listed Country house by John Baird of Glasgow, 1855, with a wing added in 1884 by an unidentified architect. The gardens have a buttressed, stepped, channelled and rock-faced terrace wall. The house had an ice-house (NO88NE 32.15; Buxbaum 1992, 7). Immediately north of the current site is a circular cropmark (NO88NE0113 possibly representing the site of a small roundel of planted trees which are shown on the 1st and 2nd edition OS map is visible on vertical aerial photographs taken in 1977 and 1988.
- 2.13 At Redcloak (NO 8579 8716), 700m WSW of the west edge of the current site is a field system of pits, possible roundhouses and an unenclosed settlement identified as a cropmark on aerial photographs.
- 2.14 At Glen Ury WNW of the proposed site is an area of hut circles and clearance cairns (NO88NE 73) identified from aerial reconnaissance.
- 2.15 There is an earthwork or possible Roman camp (NO88NE 7) at Fetteresso Glebe. The evidence for the siting of this 'camp' seems to derive ultimately from Barclay's sketch-map of 1785 on which it is shown as a square with rounded corners, although it is mentioned as early as 1722 in Camden's Britannia. The Name Book authorities remember the site being called 'The Camp' about 1800 but the ground was already under cultivation and no remains were evident. Crawford thought the site too narrow for a Roman camp, or even a normal-sized Roman fort and suggested that it was probably a native fort (Barclay 1792, 566; Crawford 1949; Name Book 1865, 10,248; Jones 2011, 335). The area is now a housing estate.
- 2.16 A copper alloy ewer (NO88NE 11) was found at Glen Ury in 1857. A sketch by the surveyor shows this to be a medieval tripod ewer. It was found two feet below the surface and was broken by the finders but the pieces were preserved at Ury House (OS Name Book 10, 198).
- 2.17 St Ciaran's Well a chalybeate well (NO88NE 17) is near the distillery at the west end of Mineral Well Road, immediately below the Glenury railway viaduct. It is an elegant fountain of Peterhead granite into which once ran the water of chalybeate spring for many years famous for its health-giving properties. The fountain was built on the site of the old holy well of St Kieran which dried up when the supply was cut to build the fountain and it was impossible to find it again (Morris and Morris 1982, 122).
- 2.18 Industrial remains in the area include Glen Ury railway viaduct (NO88NE 60) 400m south of the current site (Hume 1977, 223) and Glen Ury Distillery founded c. 1836 by

Captain Barclay. A much altered group of buildings, of which the oldest is probably a 3-storey, 10-bay range of malting floors survive. There are twin detached kilns linked to the malting floors by gangways (ibid; NO88NE 59).

- 2.19 The Aberdeen Western Peripheral route is due to terminate 200m east of the eastern side of the proposed development. Archaeological work has been carried out along the line of the route; AOC carried out a watching brief of trial pits in 2008 (NO89SE0089) but little of archaeological significance, CFA Archaeology have carried out an evaluation in 2013 of this section of the route and an excavation is ongoing at time of preparing this WSI (CFA forthcoming).
- 2.20 Ury or Urie appear on the 17<sup>th</sup>-century Blaeu (Illus 12) and Gordon (Illus 10) maps and Ury House on the 19<sup>th</sup>-century maps. The First Edition OS map (Illus 15) shows the area as farmland divided into several fields with an old field boundary still marked with a line of trees. These persist into the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> OS maps (Illus 16-17) and the track across the site from the road to the east was realigned between the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> OS maps. There was a band of trees running along the east edge of the site adjacent to the road.
- 2.21 An archaeological evaluation was carried out at the development immediately south of this proposed development and one pit was excavated; an early to middle Neolithic radiocarbon date of 3241-3140 cal BC was obtained for a sample of charcoal from the hearth (Cameron 2014;18; Illus 2). On the west side of Ury House, an evaluation by Cameron Archaeology at Blue Lodge in 2014 produced no archaeological finds or features (Lenfert, 2014; Illus 2). An evaluation followed by an excavation in 2017 at East Lodge (Cameron and Lenfert 2015, 18; Illus 2) uncovered the remains of three prehistoric circular structures with associated stone and pottery finds including a double sided cup and ring-marked stone of international importance.
- 2.22 The proposed development area has been lightly tree covered farm land from the early maps (Illus 3-5) and there is a small group of buildings to the W on Roy's military maps of the mid 18<sup>th</sup> century (Illus 6). It is lightly tree covered on the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> Edition OS maps (Illus 8-9).


#### 3 THE EVALUATION

The evaluation ran from May 3rd to May 5th, 2019. A total of 15 trenches were excavated within the 2.1ha project area using a 14-ton excavator with a 1.8m wide bladed bucket. A total of 930 linear meters was trenched, yielding 1674m² coverage, or 7.97% of the site. Trenching commenced in the western portion of the site, where it was quickly established that the west end of the trenches lie within the former sand and gravel pit. Therefore, the trenching in this area was spaced slightly wider than normal to allow a more in-depth view of potential intact subsoils to the east in trenched 4-15 (Illus 3).

Subsoils were predominately a mid- to dark-brown sandy loam with moderate sub-angular stony inclusions and frequent pockets of fine grit dispersed throughout. An additional band of relatively pure reddish-brown clay (Illus 4) was also encountered sporadically in Trenches 4-15. Closer investigation revealed that much of this was redeposited material lying on top of the original subsoils on occasion. Modern plastic debris and rope was encountered most frequently in Trenches 10-15, indicating that the site is almost entirely disturbed throughout.

#### 4 CONCLUSIONS

Despite the presence of significant amount of prehistoric archaeology within the general vicinity (Camera and Lenfert 2015), the soil disturbance level introduced by the former sand and gravel quarry operations would appear to have eliminated any intact archaeological features within the project area. Deeper spot test areas in each trench confirmed that the subsoils down to and below grade are disturbed and contain sporadic pieces of modern debris. It is therefore the author's opinion that no further archaeological mitigation is required under this planning application.

Illus 5 Pont map of Lower Deeside 1583-96 showing 'Kowy' (centre) but no reference to Ury (copyright National Library of Scotland).






