SUMMARY

A Level 1 standing building survey was carried out on 17 July 2020. There is a 19th-century cottage and steading which appears to have been built in one phase. Much of the structure is inaccessible but recording took place of all accessible areas. It is recommended that no further archaeological work is required during the current planning application.

1 INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 The site (Illus 1) is located on the E side of Burnside of Kirkbuddo. It is centred on NGR NO49774 42219, at 150-155m OD (Illus 1) and in the parish of Inverarity.
- 1.2 The work was commissioned by Stephen Pirie of AB Roger & Young for Chris Ettershank. An Angus Council planning application 20/00201/FULL for demolition of the existing building requires this Level 1 standing building survey.
- 1.3 All the archaeological work was carried out in the context of Scottish Planning Policy (SPP) Planning Advice Note (PAN 2/2011) and Historic Environment Policy Scotland Statement (HEPS), which state that archaeological remains should be regarded as part of the environment to be protected and managed.

2 BACKGROUND


The building being surveyed is part of Burnside of Kirkbuddo farmstead (HER NO44SE0072); it is a rectangular building seen on the 1st, 2nd and 3rd Edition OS maps (Illus 9-11) with extensions on the NW and SE ends (now removed).

3 THE LEVEL 1 STANDING BUILDING SURVEY


A level 1 standing building survey was carried out on 17 July 2020. The undergrowth around the building is very overgrown and the stones walls are in poor condition. The central section of the building has had a corrugated metal roof which has slipped off the building and there is damage to the NE wall. There is access through one window but the floors are rotten and so no access was possible into the building. A photographic survey was carried out of all safe and accessible areas and architects plan and elevations checked and annotated (Illus 2-3).

The building is 26.7m long and 5.3m wide. It is constructed of quarried sandstone and was built in one phase. There are 4 rooms: Rooms 1 and 2 are not accessible and have a grey slate roof. Room 3 is mostly not accessible as the corrugated metal roof has slipped to the NE (Illus 7). Room 4 is 5.3 x 2.8m in size and is overgrown and unroofed. Room 1 has a rotten wooden floor and a fireplace on the NW wall under brick chimney F1. There is also a brick chimney above the gable between Rooms 1 and 2 and a stone chimney above the SE gable of Room 2. The chimney which had stood above the SE gable of Room 3 has now fallen. There is a stone standing proud from the NW wall of Room 4 (F4) but the room is completely overgrown with rubble on the floor and it is not possible to tell what this stone was associated with.

There are windows on the SW façade: W1 in Room 1 (Illus 4), W2 in Room 2 (Illus 5) and W4 (Illus 6) in Room 3 both blocked with stone and a possible blocked window W3 which has been infilled with brick and now forms the NW jamb of D2. D1 is inaccessible behind a rusted metal door and D3 may have been smaller but there is now no evidence of jambs on the SW wall of Room 4 (Illus 8).

4 CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS






