Report on Level 2 Standing Building Survey

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
SUMMARY

A Level 2 standing building survey was carried out on 11 February 2022. The U-shaped steading has been in use as a mill with extensive lade and millponds (all now infilled). There is evidence of the location of the waterwheel and apertures for connecting to interior mechanisms. There are hoppers within the central section of the mill suggesting that it was in use as a mill until recent times. The wings were both converted for animal use with concrete floors and walls, troughs and animal stalls and then areas of the WSW wing were in use as an office. Building 2 has a stone core of a building seen on the 3rd Edition OS map with a brick superstructure and Building 3 is a Dutch barn.

It is recommended that no further archaeological work is required during the current planning application.

1 INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 The site (Illus 1) is located on the N side of the B9005 W of Ellon. It is centred on NGR NJ9347031156, at 20-30m OD (Illus 1) and in the parish of Ellon.
- 1.2 The work was commissioned by Nick McLean, Annie Kenyon Architects. A planning application APP/2017/2718 is a requirement for a Level 2 standing building survey.
- 1.3 All the archaeological work was carried out in the context of Scottish Planning Policy (SPP) Planning Advice Note (PAN 2/2011) and Historic Environment Policy Scotland Statement (HEPS), which state that archaeological remains should be regarded as part of the environment to be protected and managed.



Illus 1 Location plan (Contains Ordnance Survey data © Crown copyright and database right 2022)


2 BACKGROUND

East Kinharrachie farmstead, still in agricultural use, depicted on historic OS maps (HER NJ93SW0080). It is shown on the 1st edition OS map (Illus 35) as a U-plan steading open to the south, with a T-plan north range extending north. To the north of the steading is a pond, and to the west is a T-plan building with attached garden enclosure. On the 2nd edition OS map (Illus 36) a rectangular-plan range has been added within the steading court. Current OS maps shows some minor additions to the steading, and the building within the court has been removed. The pond to the north has been infilled, with a small waterway still depicted on its site.

In 1512 Kinnarrocquhy was granted by Alexander Barclay, born about 1469 (Godsman 1958, 73). The farm of East Kinharrachie was 207 acres, on the Estate of Turnerhall and built around the 1860s (ibid, 169) and a shoemaker's shop stood in the courtyard (ibid). The Ordnance Survey Name Book (OSNB 1865-71) lists East Kinharrachie with Mr Alex Mair, Tenant, Mr Jamieson, factor for the estate of Ellon and Mr John Gray, Ellon. The farm is described as a fine substantial farmsteading situated about one mile west of Ellon Station, the property of John Turner, Esq, Turner Hall.

3 THE LEVEL 2 STANDING BUILDING SURVEY

A level 2 standing building survey was carried out on 11 February 2022. The day was mild and bright. Architects plans and elevations were checked and annotated and a photographic survey carried out. The NE corner of the Building 1 complex is not accessible due to collapse of roof and the first floor of Room 5 is wooden and considered unsafe but all other areas were accessible.

3.1 BUILDING 1

Building 1 is a U-plan structure open to the SSE with a T-plan NNW range extending to the NNW.

3.1.1 PHASE 1 Pre 1st Edition OS

In Phase 1 Building 1 is 31.65m NNW-SSE and 6.05m wide. The walls are 0.5m thick and constructed of granite rubble and fieldstones.

Room 1 at the SSE end of the WSW wing is 5.05x12m in size with cart door D23 on the WSW wall, D8 and W1 on the ENE wall (all blocked with breeze blocks in Phase 2; Illus 3). There is a breeze block partition wall forming the NNW wall of this room with modern door D25 into Room 2. Room 2 is a modern division 5.05x3.35 which was an office for the security company which most recently occupied the site. There is a door D22 and window W8 in the WSW wall. There is a breeze block division between Rooms 2 and 3 with no access. There are stone skewputts on the SSE gable (F25, F26). D1 is a rebuilt cart door in the SSE gable.

Room 3 is 5m x 14.3m with large cart door (D13) in the NNW gable, cart door dividing Room 3 from Room 4 (D28 blocked with breeze blocks in Phase 2) and a door D9 to the courtyard blocked with stone. There are stone skewputts on the NNW gable (F23, F24).

Room 4 is 3.9x13.4m in size with doors D2 and D3 to courtyard, D3 blocked with breeze blocks. D24 is an arched door between Rooms 4 and 5 and there is a series of six blocked apertures in the NNW wall (W13-W18; Illus 10); these are only visible from the exterior as large granite blocks with an infilled slit suggesting a series of small ventilation holes. The walls area concreted and there are concrete feeders on the NNW, WSW and SSE walls (F20). There are two large rooflights in the apex of the roof (W30 and W9).


Room 5 is 23m long (although the NNW section is not accessible) and 5.63m wide. Room 5 was the main milling area. There is a cart door in the NNW wall D27 (Illus 9) with W28 above and a possible further window remaining as a lintel or sill only (W29). A cart door between Rooms 5 and 6 (D26) has been infilled with breeze blocks and there is an arched door between Rooms 4 and 5 (D24) and an external window on the WSW wall W4 (also infilled with breeze blocks). There is a large modern door D20 on the WSW wall and first floor windows also on this wall W2 and W3 both infilled as well as three on the ENE wall first floor (W25, W26, W27). The floor at the NNW end of the room is concrete but is collapsing allowing no access. The ENE wall displays evidence of being the location of the waterwheel. There is an infilled lade (F3; Illus 11, 12) on the exterior of the ENE of this room and apertures F9, F10, F11, F16 and F13 are all associated with wheel mechanisms travelling through this wall to power milling machinery on the interior; all those mechanisms have been removed (Illus 7, 8). There is an area of stone blocks (F12) which is the most likely location of the wheel pit. There is a concrete scar F15 and beam slots F14 where the roof of the wheelhouse has been removed – the building can be seen on the 1st, 2nd and 3rd Edition OS maps (Illus 35-7).

The SSE end of the room has been rebuilt in Phase 3 (see below). There are two wooden hoppers (F4 Illus 20 and F7 Illus 22), a metal hopper (F5; Illus 21), wooden column F18 supporting the roof and wooden stairs to the first floor (F6, no access).


There is no access to Room 6 as the roof has collapsed and it is possible that this was actually two rooms. Visible on the exterior of the NNW wall there is a series of six blocked apertures in the NNW wall (W19-W24); these are only visible from the exterior as large granite blocks with an infilled slit suggesting a series of small ventilation holes. There are two doors to the courtyard on the SSE wall (D5 and D6) both blocked with breeze blocks and an open door in the corner of the courtyard D10. On the NNW gable is a cart door D12 (Illus 5) with stone mouldings and a lintel or sill above (W35). There are stone skewputts on the NNW gable (F21, F22; Illus 6). There are two large rooflights in the apex of the roof (W10 and W11).

Room 7 in the ENE wing is 5m wide and 17.93m long and is divided from Room 6 with a breeze block wall. The ENE walls of Rooms 6 and 7 have a series of doors infilled with breeze blocks – D19, D18, D15 and cart doors D17 and D16 and also window W31; Illus 4. Room 7 has a large cart door (D1) in the SSE gable but this has been altered in the 20th century with breeze blocks. There is D11 and windows W6 and W7 as well as fireplace F19 on the WSW wall, all filled with breeze blocks except D11. The SSE end of the ENE wall shows scars in the plaster (F8) where five animal stalls were sited which have been removed indicating housing for animals. There is a modern cart door on the SSE gable (D7).


At the SSE of the courtyard is a dividing wall with gateposts F1 and F2 (Illus 13) and an exterior concrete water trough F17.




Illus 3 Building 1 ground floor plan annotated with numbers used in this survey (copyright Annie Kenyon Architects)

3.1.2 PHASE 2 Early-mid 20th century

In Phase 2 many apertures were blocked and rooms partition with breeze block walls.

Room 1 SSE gable was rebuilt (Illus 14) as were the SSE gable of Room 7 and the NNW gable of Room 3. In Room 5 concrete walls and concrete feed troughs were constructed (F20; Illus 3) as most of the rooms were concreted to allow for animal use. Room 7 WSW wall blocked window W6 (Illus 16) when the room went into animal use and on the ENE wall are scars for animal stall F8 (Illus 17) and on the ENE wall blocked cart doors D16, D17 (Illus 18).

3.1.2 PHASE 3 Post 1924 (3rd Edition OS map)

The SSE end of Room 5 has been rebuilt in concrete (Illus 19); this is probably due to the demolition of buildings seen within the courtyard on the 3rd Edition OS map (Illus 37) attached to this façade. When these buildings were demolished it's likely that this required

rebuilding to create a pleasing SSE façade. This includes D4, W12 and first floor window W5.




Illus 26 Room 5 wooden hopper F7 with wooden chute; facing NNW

3.2 BUILDING 2

3.2.1 PHASE 1


Building 2 (Illus 27) is 17.25m long and 7.68m wide with a Phase 1 fieldstone rubble core (Illus 30). The stone building was constructed between 1899 and 1924; there is a scar in the SE corner where a garden wall was demolished. The ENE wall has a gap 3.33m wide between the stone core and this may have represented a door (D30). No other Phase 1 apertures survive.



3.2.2 PHASE 2

A red brick building was constructed after 1924 on the Phase 1 stone foundation; the wall is ne brick thick 0.23m thick. It is a single storey and one room 17.25m long and 7.68m wide. There is a main door (D29) in the centre of the SSE wall; it is 2.93m wide and 2.4m high and has a caravan wedged in it. There is a small door on the SSE wall (D14) and small windows on the same wall W32 and W34. There is a window on the ENE wall (W33) and the building has an earthen floor. The roof is asbestos cement corrugated roofing and the windows are metal framed.

3.3 BUILDING 3

Building 3 is a Dutch barn 5.84m wide, 4.2m high and 29.19m long. Cast iron I beams are set on concrete block foundations 0.46x0.44x0.33m high. The I-beams and 0.15x0.08m in size and the roof is arched corrugated metal. The building has an earthen floor.




Illus 33 Building 3; facing NW

Building 2 has a stone core of a building seen on the 3rd Edition OS map with a brick superstructure and Building 3 is a Dutch barn.

It is recommended that no further archaeological work is required during the current planning application.








