STANDING BUILDING SURVEY, FARM STEADINGS, PITTODRIE HOUSE HOTEL, ABERDEENSHIRE, AB51 5HS





CAMERON ARCHAEOLOGY 17 December 2010

SUMMARY

A standing building survey was carried out on farm steadings at Pittodrie House Hotel prior to demolition of derelict buildings and conversion of part of the complex into timeshare facilities.

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
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1 INTRODUCTION


This report relates to Aberdeenshire Planning Application G/APP/2008/1823 which states that a Standing Building Survey must be carried out prior to the partial demolition and conversion of the steading to timeshare/holiday Units. The work was commissioned by Dougal Morgan, Managing Director, William Cowie, Chartered Architects, 6 & 7 Albyn Lane, Aberdeen AB10 6SZ on behalf of the client Macdonald Hotels and Resorts.

The site (NJ 69757 23976) lies in the grounds of Pittodrie House Hotel which lies between Oyne to the north-west and Chapel of Garioch to the east. It is in the Parish of Oyne and lies at 190m OD.

The standing building survey took place on 9 December 2010 and was carried out in the context of Scottish Planning Policy (SPP) Planning Advice Note 42 (PAN 42) and Scottish Historic Environment Policy (SHEP), which state that archaeological remains should be regarded as part of the environment to be protected and managed.



Ill 1 Location plan (Contains Ordnance Survey data © Crown copyright and database right 2010)




Ill 2 Extract from First Edition Ordnance Survey map (National Library of Scotland)

2 ARCHAEOLOGICAL BACKGROUND

Pittodrie House Hotel (NJ62SE 12) is a listed building. Its earliest date is suggested as 1490 AD but it mainly dates to the early 17th century. Later additions included a neo-Jacobean mansion complete with three-storey balustraded entrance tower to east and an ogee-capped tower on the south built by Archibald Simpson in 1841 (Shepherd 1994, 113). The house is now run as a hotel. Pittodrie Home Farm lies to the north of the House (NJ62SE 12.01; NJ 6977 2412).

3 THE STANDING BUILDING SURVEY

A standing building was carried out on 9th December 2010 (III 3). The snow was lying up to 1m deep on the site and banked up against the buildings and on the roofs. Some of the buildings were inaccessible either because of the snow (B5) or because they were in a state of collapse (B2, B3). B7 is in use as staff accommodation and was therefore not accessed. Buildings B6, B8 and B9 had been heavily modernised internally during the late 20th century.

Building 1 is 22 x 8m in size and is constructed mainly of coursed granite rubble with coursed granite blocks on the north gable. Its construction suggests that it is contemporary with Building 2. It has been altered to accomodate cows and has a large barn door on the north gable (III 5). Barns B1 and B2 were part of the Phase 2 steadings and may date from the 19th century. This building is to be retained in the new development and converted for timeshare accommodation.

Building 2 is 22 x 8m in size and is constructed of mainly of coursed granite rubble with coursed granite blocks on the north gable. Its construction suggests that it is contemporary with Building 1. It has been altered to accomodate cows and has a large barn door on the north gable (III 5). Barns B1 and B2 were part of the Phase 2 steadings and may date from the 19th century. It is to be demolished during the current development.

This modern shed was inaccessible during the survey as the roof and walls are in an advanced state of disrepair. It was built in the late 20th century and is to be demolished during the current development.

BUILDING 5

This building is 22 x 6m in size and built of semi-coursed granite blocks. It was probably part of the Phase 1 steading complex but has been extended and added to in recent times. A small extension from the east of this building can be seen on the 1867 OS map (III 2) which may have been part of the original layout but was probably demolished when Building 12 was constructed. A small granite rubble lean-to was also added to the north side (III 10). The lower walls have been cemented to allow for animal accomodation and the roof heightened in recent times (III 12). This building is to be retained in the new development and converted for timeshare accommodation.

This steading is $30 \times 6m$ wide and was part of the original steadings. They may date from the 18th century. They have a granite forestair in the centre of the

west wall to allow access to a door on the first floor of a gablet. Above this door is an old clock, now in poor condition. The building has been substantially modified in the late 19th or early 20th century to allow accommodation for cars and farm vehicles. This includes three pillars (III 14) constructed of large granite blocks on the north end of the west wall of the building to allow for the housing of farm vehicles. This building is to be retained in the new development and converted for timeshare accommodation.

III 16 Building 5 interior facing NE

This building is 30 x 6m in length and now forms staff accommodation. It was inaccessible during the survey but has been substantially altered in the 20th century. It is to be retained in the new development and converted for timeshare accommodation.



III 17 Building 7 facing north

This farmhouse is c 13 x 10m in size and has been substantially altered during the 19th and 20th centuries. This building is to be retained in the new development and converted for timeshare accommodation.



III 18 Farmhouse (Building 8) facing SW

This building is part of original steadings which was altered substantially to accommodate cars in the 20th century. It has a series of garage doors on its south side that accommodated the Laird's Rolls Royce cars (pers comm hotel staff) and there is a date of 1896 (III 19) above the garage door. This is probably the date of the alterations to this building. This building is to be retained in the new development and converted for timeshare accommodation.

Building 10 is 8 x 8m in size and is a portico built of wood attached on to the south side of garage building B9. It is to be demolished during the current development.

This granite rubble shed is $29 \times 6m$ in size. The interior has been substantially altered for the accomodation of cows and much of the exterior of the building was obscured by snow suring the survey. It is to be demolished during the current development.

Building 12 is a granite rubble built steading 25 x 8m in size. It is to be demolished during the current development.

COURTYARD 1

Walled courtyard between Buildings 1 and 2 (Ills 24, 25) is to be demolished during the current building works. A corral or paddock surrounded by a granite wall has been recorded at the north end of the courtyard.





4 CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

The standing building survey was hampered by ruinous buildings and snow. All the buildings were photographed in their current condition and a phase plan has been prepared (III 26).

Although some of the buildings are ruinous and were not fully accessible and all were covered with snow, the earlier phases of the building were thoroughly recorded and the buildings to be demolished were adequately recorded. It is recommended that no further work is required during the current development but the final decision remains with Moira Greig, Aberdeenshire Council.


