

ADDENDUM II to FINAL REPORT*

Material Relocated Offsite, March 2012
- post 'Cattewater Wreck Archive Project'

Our records indicate that a batch of Cattewater Wreck material was sent to the Archaeological Research Centre at the National Maritime Museum, for conservation and analysis, in 1979.

Email correspondence and telephone conversations with Gillian Hutchinson, in February / March 2012, have confirmed that the bulk of these finds are still with the National Maritime Museum. Plymouth City Museum and Art Gallery have requested *repatriation* to the Cattewater Wreck Archive.

The following items are still with the National Maritime Museum at July 2012. The items are listed here giving both the NMM Sample Number and the CW Finds Number.

Three Fully Conserved Objects:

5292 Bucket lid (CW78 363)

Half of turned elm bucket lid, 2 perforations for ?rope handle. 3 small nail shafts in one side. D 13.5cm

5293 Wooden plug (CW78 336)

Large alder bung. Some bark still present on longitudinal surface. Max D 8.8cm

5294 Parrel truck (CW78 312)

Parrell truck ball, ash, lathe turned & perforation has slight central restriction.

7165° Large splinter of wood (outer plank SW no 106) - *sent to Belfast*

7166 Wood (frame 76)

7180° Black sticky substance from inside barrel (CW78 426)

7181 Fabric/rope - poss sailcloth (CW78 261)

7184 Stones, shells, sand, wood, fragments (dry) (CW78 323)

7185° Soil (dry) (CW78 325)
