Period 1: Geology and topography

Open Area 601

Open Area 601 produced a *nummus* of Constantine the Great <1>, minted in Trier in AD 311 and a corner fragment of ceramic weight <8> dating to the Late Iron Age. Both came from group 2.

Period 6: Late Roman (c AD 200-400)

A copper alloy pin <7> with a globular head was recovered from context [232] (group 134). It is in poor condition and in several pieces. It is probably Roman in date. A fragment of ceramic weight <9> with the remains of a perforation was found in group 133.

Period 7: Indeterminate Roman (c AD 40-400)

Context [136] (group 60) produced several fragments of ceramic weight <10>, some with the remains of perforation. Small pieces of rotary quern <11> <14> were also found, with the latter being Roman in date.
