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ABSTRACT

Pre-Construct Archaeology was commissioned by Woodhouse Landscapes on Behalf of Mr and Mrs A Cox, to carry out an archaeological watching brief on ground works for a Natural Swimming Pool at Odsey House, Guilden Morden, Cambridgeshire. The watching brief was undertaken on the 7th and 8th of January 2013. No archaeological features or artefacts were encountered, only a modern soakaway associated with the septic tank and a modern concrete pad for a garden feature were noted.

1 INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 A Brief for Archaeological Monitoring & Recording at Odsey House Natural Swimming Pool, Guilden Morden, Cambridgeshire, was issued by Dan McConnell of the Historic Environment Team, Cambridgeshire County Council.
- 1.2 This report details the working methods and results of an archaeological watching brief undertaken by Pre-Construct Archaeology Ltd (PCA). The programme was carried out according to a Written Scheme of Investigation (WSI) prepared for Woodhouse Landscapes by PCA (Hinman 2012). The fieldwork, undertaken on the 7th and 8th of January 2013 and was managed for PCA by Mark Hinman and supervised by Karl Hanson.
- 1.3 The study area centred on NGR TL 2953 3806 and covered approximately 200 square metres. The site lies northeast of the 18-Century Racing Lodge Odsey House, and is situated 0.12km to the northwest of the A505, 3.27km south-east of Ashwell and 6.71km southwest of Royston.
- 1.4 The Natural geology in this area is characterised by Holywell Nodular Chalk Formations with no noted superficial deposits in the location. It was noted that calcareous/neutral Boulder Clay with some Clay-with-Flints may be present overlying the Chalk, but these were not present in the area opened.

2 ARCHAEOLOGICAL AND HISTORICAL BACKGROUND

- 2.1 The site lies on the Cambridgeshire/Hertfordshire county boundary and the line of the lcknield Way runs through the grounds of the house.
- Odsey Grange, formerly the Jockey house was built circa 1705¹. Odsey House and stables were built and owned by the Second and Third Dukes of Devonshire as part of a racing establishment the Dukes owned. Odsey Grange could be buildings mention by Thos. Fountaine and John Duckett, of Lincoln's Inn before 1705 has buildings "newly erected for race-horses", and the sale of property to Robert Chester (VCH Vol. VIII p97).

3 METHODOLOGY

- 3.1 All aspects of the programme were conducted in accordance with the Institute for Archaeologists' code of conduct and the Standards and guidance for Archaeological Field Evaluations (2008). Field techniques and guidance are detailed within the PCA fieldwork induction manual, (Taylor and Brown 2009).
- 3.2 An archaeological watching brief, covering the footprint for the building of a natural swimming pool was undertaken. The swimming pool footprint was excavated to a depth of between 0.30m-0.40m onto the natural Chalk, using a 360° with a 2m wide toothless bucket.

4 RESULTS

- 4.1 The only features present within the footprint were a soakaway associated with the modern septic tank and a concrete pad for a modern garden feature.
- 4.2 No archaeological features or finds were identified within this area.

5 INTERPRETATION AND CONCLUSIONS

No archaeological features or artefacts were encountered during the groundworks, a modern soakaway for the septic tank and a modern concrete pad for a garden feature were noted. The garden appeared to have been subject to terracing during earlier landscaping of the site.
