1 NON-TECHNICAL SUMMARY

Pre-Construct Archaeology Ltd was appointed by CFW Architects, on behalf of Mrs C Burns, to carry out an archaeological watching brief at El Rancho, Baring Road, Winchester, Hampshire. The site is the subject of a development to extend the existing property.

The watching brief was conducted in four visits between the 11th June and 15th July 2015. Visits coincided with partial demolition and clearance of the existing house and excavation of new strip foundations north, east and south of the house.

The new foundation trenches revealed natural chalk and chalk rubble filled disturbance on the south side of the house beneath 0.4m of made ground and garden soil and on the north side of the house beneath c. 1.5m of made ground and garden soil. New foundation trenches for the extended east end of the house revealed natural chalk at c. 1m below ground level and beneath made ground comprising chalk rubble. No archaeological features, deposits or finds were recorded.

It is concluded that the existing house was built over steeply sloping ground and disturbance that has cut away the natural slope. The site appears to retain no archaeological resource potential.

2 INTRODUCTION

2.1 Project Background

- 2.1.1 Pre-Construct Archaeology Ltd (PCA) was appointed by CFW Architects on behalf of Mrs C Burns, to carry out an archaeological watching brief at El Rancho, Baring Road, Winchester, Hampshire, hereafter 'the site' (**Figure 1**). The site is the subject of a development to extend to the existing property.
- 2.1.2 The archaeological watching brief and subsequent reporting were required as conditions 4 and 5 of planning permission for the development of the site granted by the Local Planning Authority Winchester City Council (planning ref. 15/00102/FUL). The conditions are based on the advice of the Council's Historic Environment Officer (HEO) and reflect the potential of the site to contain archaeological resources that may be put at risk by the development.
- 2.1.3 Planning condition 4 states: 'No development/demolition or site preparation shall take place until the applicant or their agents or successors in title has secured the implementation of a programme of archaeological mitigation work in accordance with a Written Scheme of Investigation that has been submitted to and approved by the Local Planning Authority in writing. The Written Scheme of Investigation shall include:
 - An assessment of significance and research questions
 - The programme and methodology of site investigation and recording
 - Provision for post investigation assessment, reporting and dissemination
 - Provision to be made for deposition of the analysis and records of the site investigation (archive)
- 2.1.4 Planning condition 5 states: 'Following completion of all archaeological fieldwork a report shall be produced in accordance with an approved programme including where appropriate post-excavation assessment, specialist analysis and reports and publication'. This document provides an outline for post-excavation assessment reporting, which would include proposals for subsequent specialist analysis reports and an appropriate level of publication.
- 2.1.5 This document addresses condition 3 and 4 of planning permission and has been prepared in accordance with the Chartered Institute for Archaeologists standard and guidance for an archaeological watching brief (ClfA 2014) and Management of Research Projects in the Historic Environment (English Heritage, 2006). PCA is a ClfA Registered Archaeological Organisation and is bound by its code of conduct.

2.2 Location, Topography and Geology

2.2.1 The site, NGR 449015 129438 (Figure 1), lies in the eastern suburb of St Giles Hill, Winchester. It is located between Baring Road and Alresford Road, and forms a triangular plot. The existing house, El Rancho, sits at the west end of the property. There is a sharp fall to the north of the house and toward the boundary with Alresford Road. To the south and east of the property ground level is fairly flat

- 2.2.2 The natural and historic topography of the site falls steeply from north to south toward Alresford Road. The modern topography has altered the natural slope to accommodate Baring Road and likewise has been partially if not largely altered within the site to accommodate the house. Ground level within the site lies at approximately 75m above OD.
- 2.2.3 The geology of the site is expected to comprise Upper Chalk.

2.3 Archaeological and Historical Background

- 2.3.1 The site lies to the east of the historic core of Winchester, within the historic suburb of St Giles. The site lies in an area of known archaeological resources of Roman, Anglo-Saxon and medieval date. These include:
 - The line of a Roman road believed to be followed by the modern Alresford Road;
 - An Anglo-Saxon cemetery, the extent of which is poorly understood. An Anglo-Saxon burial found immediately west of the site appears to relate to the cemetery;
 - The medieval church and churchyard of St Giles located to the east of the site;
 - The site of a medieval Fair for which archaeological evidence has been found to the south of the site.

3 AIM

3.1 Archaeological Watching Brief

- 3.1.1 The aim of the archaeological watching brief is to monitor groundwork for the proposed alterations and extension to El Rancho and investigate and record archaeological resources that are identified, taking account of the date, nature, extent, bio-archaeological and palaeo-environmental potential of the resources and the research aims and questions that have been identified.
- 3.1.2 This report on the results of the watching brief aims to be sufficient to demonstrate to the LPA that the watching brief was carried out in accordance with the approved Written Scheme of Investigation, pursuant to the relevant planning requirements.

4 RESULTS

4.1 Introduction

4.1.1 The following section provides a summary of the results of the watching brief, based on the site archive, which consists of written and photographic records. The site archive is held by PCA's Winchester office under the WINCM site code AY578. Photographic images of the site are provided in Appendix 1, Plates 1-6 and are located on Figure 1.

4.2 The Watching Brief

- 4.2.1 The watching brief was conducted in four visits between the 11th June and 15th July 2015. Visits coincided with partial demolition and clearance of the existing house and excavation of new strip foundations north, east and south of the house (Plates 1-3). It was noted that the south wall of the existing house was supported by relatively shallow trench foundations cut into natural chalk while on the north side the foundations were much deeper and were cut through soil and chalk rubble. The ground conditions reflect the natural slope from south to north across the site and that more generally characterises the north side of St Gile's Hill.
- 4.2.2 The new foundation trenches revealed natural chalk and chalk rubble filled disturbance on the south side of the house beneath 0.4m of made ground and garden soil (Plate 4) and on the north side of the house beneath c. 1.5m of made ground and garden soil (Plate 5). New foundation trenches for the extended east end of the house revealed natural chalk at c. 1m below ground level and beneath made ground comprising chalk rubble (Plate 6).
- 4.2.3 No archaeological features, deposits or finds were recorded.

4.3 Conclusion

4.3.1 It is concluded that the existing house was built over steeply sloping ground and disturbance that has cut away the natural slope. The site appears to retain no archaeological resource potential.

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
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
