

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#### 1 NON – TECHNICAL SUMMARY

Pre-Construct Archaeology Ltd (PCA) was appointed to undertake a programme of archaeological work in connection with the repair and replacement of a collapsed sewer at the Cattle Market, Winchester. This document provides the results of the watching brief, which comprised of visits on the 21<sup>st</sup> and 22<sup>nd</sup> February 2017.

The watching brief was carried out, in accordance with the Method Statement prepared in advance of works.

It is concluded that while other areas of the site, especially to the south, may have archaeological value, the monitored area of the site appear to retain no archaeological resource potential.

#### 2 INTRODUCTION

#### 2.1 Project Background

Pre-Construct Archaeology Ltd (PCA) was appointed by Pro Drainage Ltd. (the Client) to undertake a programme of archaeological work in connection with the repair and replacement of a collapsed sewer at the Cattle Market, Winchester, hereafter 'the site' (**Figure 1 & 2**).

- 2.1.1 This document provides the results of the watching brief, which comprised of visits on the 21<sup>st</sup> and 22<sup>nd</sup> February 2017.
- 2.1.2 This document has been prepared in accordance with the Chartered Institute for Archaeologists standard and guidance for archaeological watching briefs (IfA 2008) and Management of Research Projects in the Historic Environment (Historic England, 2006).

#### 2.2 Location, Topography and Geology

- 2.2.1 The site is located in the northern suburb of Winchester, immediately north of the junction of Andover Road and Worthy Lane, which form its boundaries to the west and east; the northern boundary of the site is formed by a footpath and Highfield Lodge (Conservative Club). The site, an area of approximately 1 hectare. The area of excavation is on the West site of the site.
- 2.2.2 The site lies on Seaford Chalk Formation with no superficial geological deposits recorded (British Geological Survey, 2017).

#### 2.3 Archaeology

2.3.1 The site was the subject of an archaeological Desk Based Assessment (DBA) which is not repeated here (PCA, 2015). The DBA found that the potential for the site to contain archaeological resources of Romano-British and Medieval date is considered to be high and may include significant evidence of Winchester's Northern Roman cemetery and medieval suburbs and defences.

#### 3 AIM

#### 3.1 Archaeological Watching Brief

- 3.1.1 The aim of the watching brief was to monitor ground work for the proposed development for the presence of archaeological resources and, if present, investigate and preserve by record the resources. Determining, where possible, their character, including their date, nature and extent.
- 3.1.2 This report on the results of the watching brief aims to be sufficient to demonstrate that the watching brief was carried out in accordance with the approved Written Scheme of Investigation, pursuant to the relevant planning requirements.

#### 4 RESULTS

#### 4.1 Introduction

- 4.1.1 The following section provides a summary of the results of the watching brief, based on the site archive, which consists of written and photographic records. The site archive is held by PCA's Winchester office under the site code AY616.
- 4.1.2 Photographic images of the site are provided in Appendix 1.

#### 4.2 Methodology

4.2.1 The watching brief was carried out, in accordance with the Method Statement prepared in advance of works (PCA 2017), during visits on the 21<sup>st</sup> and 22<sup>nd</sup> February 2017. Visits coincided with the excavation of the trench down the required level for works. (Plates 1-3).

#### 4.3 Observations

- 4.3.1 Below the modern carpark surface, large amounts of modern backfill was seen with a patch of redeposited chalk, to a depth of approx. 2m. No natural deposits or geology was observed during the excavation as the work was contained within the original cut made for the sewer and nearby storm drain. The area surrounding the trench is also likely to be heavily disturbed.
- 4.3.2 No archaeological features, deposits or finds were recorded.

#### 4.4 Conclusion

4.4.1 It is concluded that while other areas of the site, especially to the south, may have archaeological value, the monitored areas of the site appear to retain no archaeological resource potential.




