

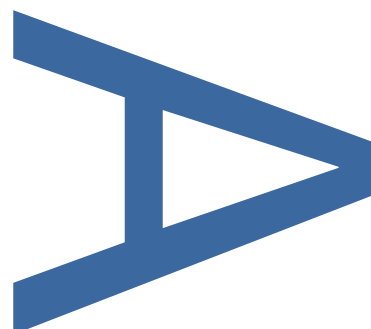
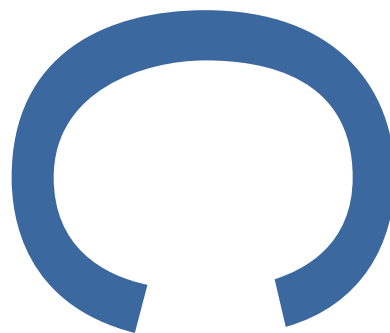

1 SUMMARY

Pre-Construct Archaeology Ltd (PCA) was appointed by CgMs Consulting to undertake an initial stage of archaeological evaluation of land off Winchester Road, Whitchurch, Hampshire. The Site is the subject of a development proposal, which is to comprise housing and associated works.

A total of 30 trenches measuring 30m X 1.8m trenches were excavated in a single field forming the western portion of the Site. Four trenches were not excavated due to a high voltage overhead powerline exclusion zone. The investigation was completed in keeping with the Written Scheme of Investigation between the 18th and 27th April 2017. This report provides the result of the initial stage of the evaluation.

The evaluation of the western portion of the Site revealed a single archaeological feature, an early Saxon Sunken Featured Building, in Trench 10, from which pottery dating to the Saxon period, animal bone and fragmented loom weights were recovered. No other significant archaeological features, deposits or finds were observed.

2 INTRODUCTION

2.1 Project Background

2.1.1 Pre-Construct Archaeology Ltd (PCA) was appointed by CgMs Consulting to undertake an archaeological evaluation on land off Winchester Road, Whitchurch, Hampshire (NGR SU 446638 147075), hereafter 'the Site' (**Figure 1 & 2**). The Site is the subject of a development proposal, comprising housing in the south-western part of the Site, recreational facilities in the north-eastern part of the Site and associated works, for which outline planning permission was granted in May 2016. The evaluation represents part of a staged approach to addressing condition 11 of planning permission, which concerns archaeology.

2.1.2 A Written Scheme of Investigation (PCA 2017), prepared in respect of Condition 11 of outline planning permission, set out a strategy of evaluation, comprising 64 30m X 2m trenches spread over the western and north-eastern parts of the Site. This report details the results of the initial stage of archaeological evaluation, which comprised 34 of the proposed trenches spread over the western portion of the site, of which 30 were excavated, the remainder constrained by overhead power cables. The evaluation fieldwork was undertaken between the 18th April and the 27th April 2017.

2.1.3 This document has been prepared in accordance with the Chartered Institute for Archaeologists standard and guidance for archaeological field evaluation (CIfA 2014) and excavation (CIfA 2014) and *Management of Research Projects in the Historic Environment* (Historic England, 2015).

2.2 Location, Topography and Geology

2.2.1 The Site, an area of approximately 6.4 ha, is located east of Winchester Road, Whitchurch, Hampshire on land currently in arable cultivation. The Site is bounded by housing on Winchester Road to the west, Test Bourne Community School Playing Fields to the north, with arable fields to the east and south.

2.2.2 The site is located on rising ground. Ground level is recorded at a height of 68m above Ordnance Datum (aOD) adjacent to the north-west boundary, rising to a height of 74m aOD in the north-eastern part of the Site. The course of the River Test lies approximately 300m to the north-west of the Site.

2.2.3 The British Geological Survey (2015) indicates that the solid geology on Site comprises Seaford Chalk Formation, overlain by superficial Head Deposits in the northwest half of the site, and River Terrace Deposits in the southeast.

2.3 Archaeological and Historical Background

2.3.1 The archaeological and historical background to the Site was set out in detail in a Desk-based Assessment (CgMs Consulting, 2015), prepared in respect of the proposed development of the Site, and is not repeated here. In summary, the assessment established that the Site has a high potential for archaeological resources of the Later Prehistoric period.

3 AIM

3.1 Archaeological Evaluation

3.1.1 The aim of the archaeological evaluation was to determine the character, extent, date, condition and significance of archaeological resources that may survive within the Site, taking account of their potential to contain biological and palaeo-environmental remains.

3.1.2 This report on the results of the evaluation aims to provide sufficient information so that the future treatment of archaeological resources identified within the Site, in respect of the proposed development, may be determined.

4 RESULTS

4.1 Introduction

4.1.1 The following sections present a summary of the results of the initial stage of evaluation carried out in the western portion of the Site. The report is based upon the Site archive, which comprises a Site diary, trench recording sheets, context sheets, Site drawings, digital photographs and a small finds assemblage. A summary of recorded contexts is provided in a Trench Index in Appendix 1 and photographs of the trenches and trench sections in Appendix 2. The archive is held at PCA's Winchester office under the site code WRWH17 and in due course will be deposited with the Hampshire Cultural Trust.

4.2 Methodology

4.2.1 The evaluation was undertaken following the methodology that was detailed in the Written Scheme of Investigation (PCA, 2017), which was approved on behalf of the Local Planning Authority in advance of the commencement of works.

4.3 The evaluation comprised the mechanical excavation of 30 trenches measuring 30m X 2m trenches (**Figure 2 & Plate 1**) located in the western portion of the Site. Four proposed trenches were not excavated due to a high voltage overhead powerline and subsequent exclusion zone crossing the Site.

4.4 Summary of Deposition Sequence

4.4.1 The deposit sequence seen in the evaluation trenches comprised natural sandy-clay and gravel as well as eroded chalk, a sandy-clay sub-soil and plough soil. The sequence was relatively constant across the Site. There was a significant variation across the Site in the depth of the natural deposits below ground level, which ranged from 0.22m to 0.70m with an average depth of 0.43m BGL (**Figure 5 & Plates 2, 3, & 4**).

4.5 Sunken Featured Building

4.5.1 Trench 10 revealed a large roughly circular feature, [1009], approximately 2m in diameter and 0.17m in depth (**Figure 4, Plate 8**). Six probable postholes were also identified ([1006], [1007], [1008], [1012], [1014], [1016]) within the two quadrants excavated. The feature is identified as a Sunken Feature Building (SFB) of early Saxon date. Two clay loom weights fragments, animal bone and 25 sherds of pottery, provisionally identified as of Saxon date, were recovered from the excavated quadrants (see Appendix 3).

4.6 Other Features

- 4.6.1 At the north-western end of Trench 1 the natural geology dipped significantly to a depth of 1.30m. It is probable that this relates to the post-medieval chalk pit, which is recorded in the Hampshire Archaeology and Historic Building Record (AHBR) in this area (**Figure 3, Pates 5**). A brick wall and large rubbish pit with burning was seen in the northern section of Trench 1, and these are probably the remains of foundations for farm buildings built over or close to the chalk pit (**Plate 6**).
- 4.6.2 Trench 23 contained a linear feature that was also visible in Trench 12. The feature is thought to be modern in date due to its steep, vertical sides and, in section, was observed to be cut through the existing sub-soil (**Plate 7**).

4.7 Conclusion

- 4.7.1 The evaluation of the western portion of the Site revealed a single archaeological feature, an early Saxon Sunken Featured Building, in Trench 10, from which pottery dating to the Saxon period, animal bone and fragmented loom weights were recovered. No other significant archaeological features, deposits or finds were observed.
- 4.7.2 This initial stage of evaluation appears to indicate that the western portion of the Site retains low archaeological potential overall although some potential for isolated and poorly preserved archaeological features, of which the Sunken Featured Building appears to be an example. The feature was very shallow, just 0.17m deep, and this may indicate that archaeological features in the immediate landscape have been subject to erosion such as from ploughing.

5 ARCHIVE PRERARATION AND DEPOSITION

5.1 The Site Archive

5.1.1 The Site archive, to include all project records and cultural material produced by the project, will be prepared in accordance with 'Guidelines for the Preparation of Excavation Archives for Long-term Storage' (UKIC 1990) and the Institute for Archaeologists 'Standard and Guidance for the creation, compilation, transfer and deposition of archaeological archives' (ClfA 2014). On completion of the project PCA will arrange for the archive to be deposited with the Hampshire Cultural Trust on behalf of Hampshire County Council.

Appendix 3: Artefact Summary Assessment WRWH17

Introduction

This summary assessment provides an overview of the artefact assemblage recovered from an archaeological evaluation at Land at Winchester Road, Whitchurch, Hampshire (Site code: WRWH17). The archaeological investigation produced a small assemblage of pottery, animal bone and clay loom weights). The artefacts were found in one feature [1009] in two contexts.

The Pottery Assemblage

The pottery assemblage recovered from WRWH17 appears to derive from the same broad time period; the Early/Middle Saxon period (5th-8th Century). Pottery (25 sherds) was recovered from contexts (1005) and (1011). All sherds are in a similar handmade, organic tempered fabric; however, it is not possible to identify a vessel type due to the nature and size of the individual sherds from the assemblage. Furthermore, although this pottery can be broadly dated to the Early/Middle Saxon period, it is difficult to narrow down a more specific date.

Animal Bone

A small collection of animal bones were recovered from contexts (1005) and (1011). It is possible to identify a jaw from a small mammal (1005) among the assemblage. However, all other bones are too degraded to distinguish any specific species.

Loom Weight

A total 67 clay loom weight fragments were recovered from contexts (1005) and (1011).

Conclusions and Recommendations

All pottery from the archaeological evaluation can be broadly described as being from the Early/Mid Saxon period, suggesting that evidence for activity can be limited to this period. All datable artefacts were recovered from secure contexts and can provide *terminus post quem* for all features.

Although the pottery represents good dating evidence, the nature of the assemblage does not lend itself to further investigation at this time.

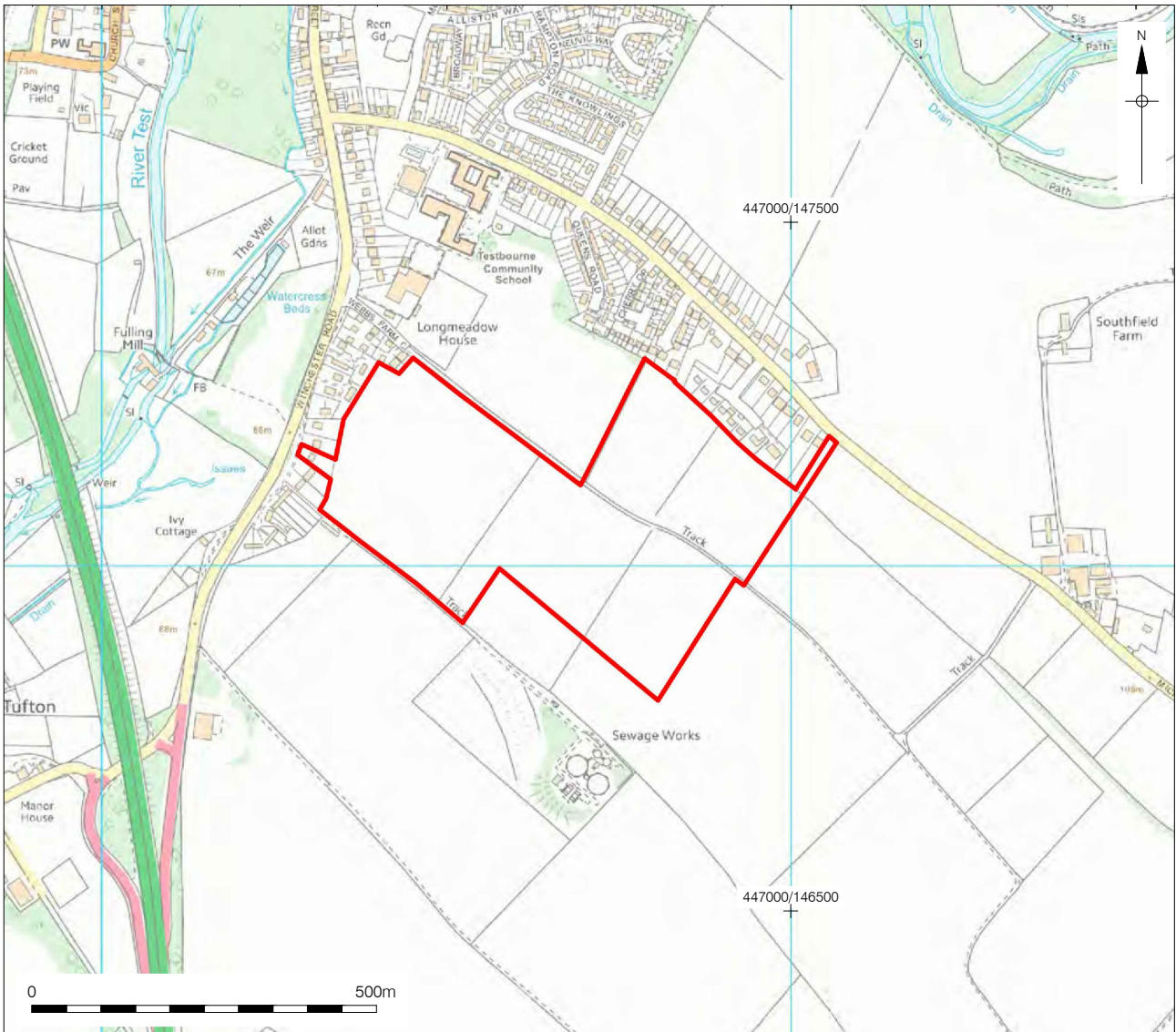
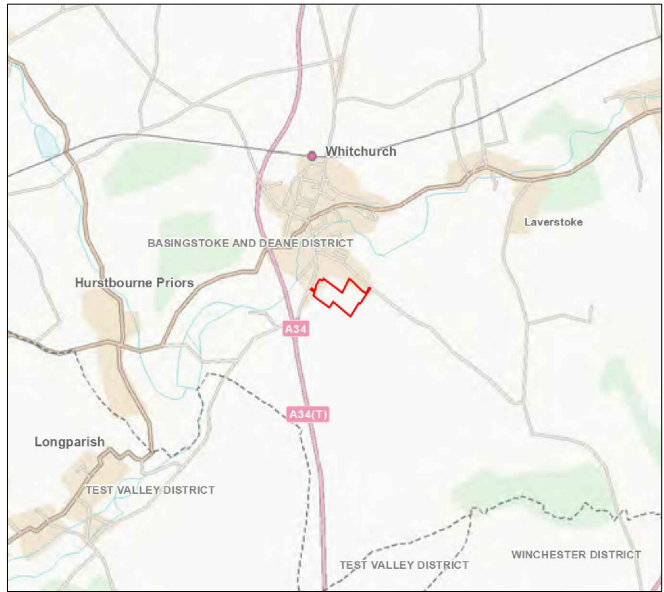

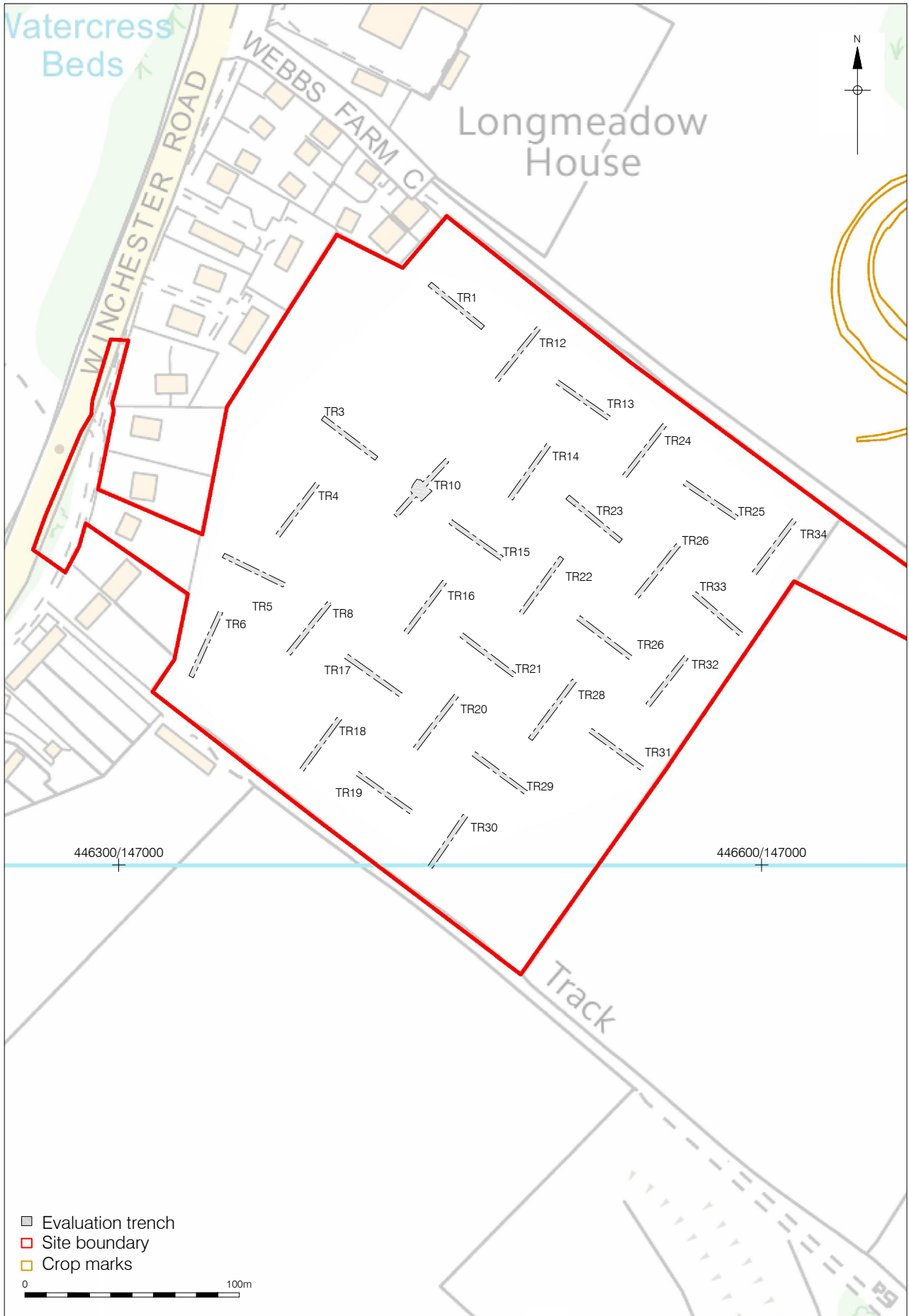

 1:10,000 at A4

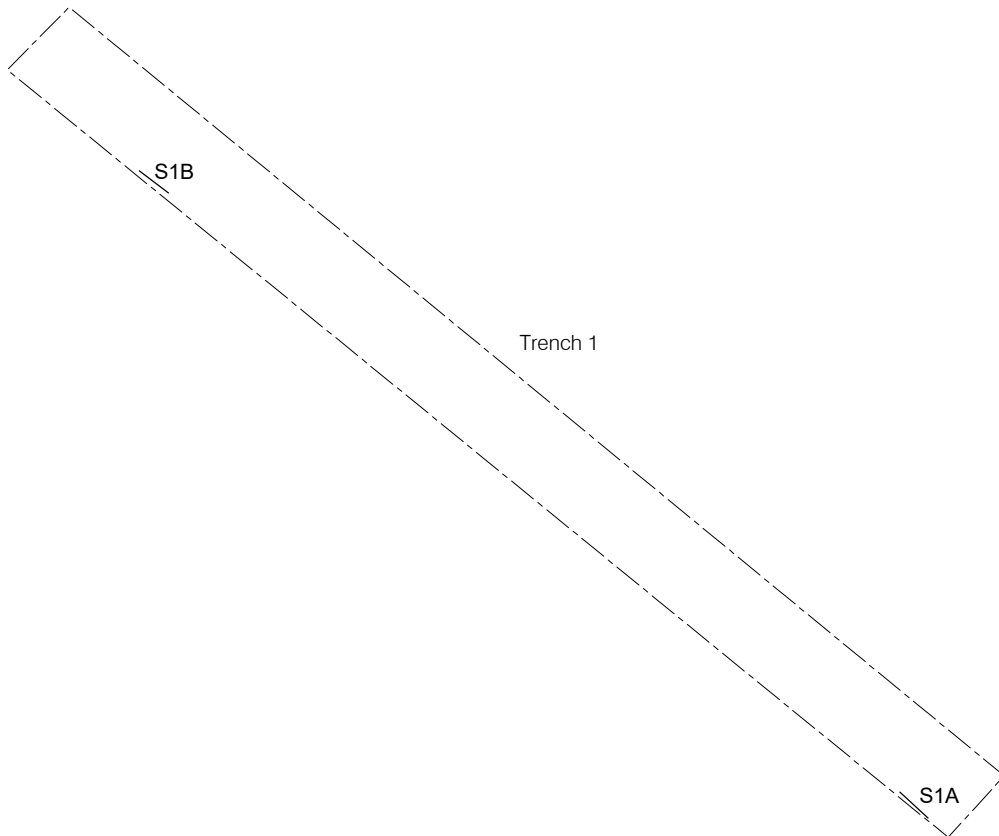

1:2,500 at A4



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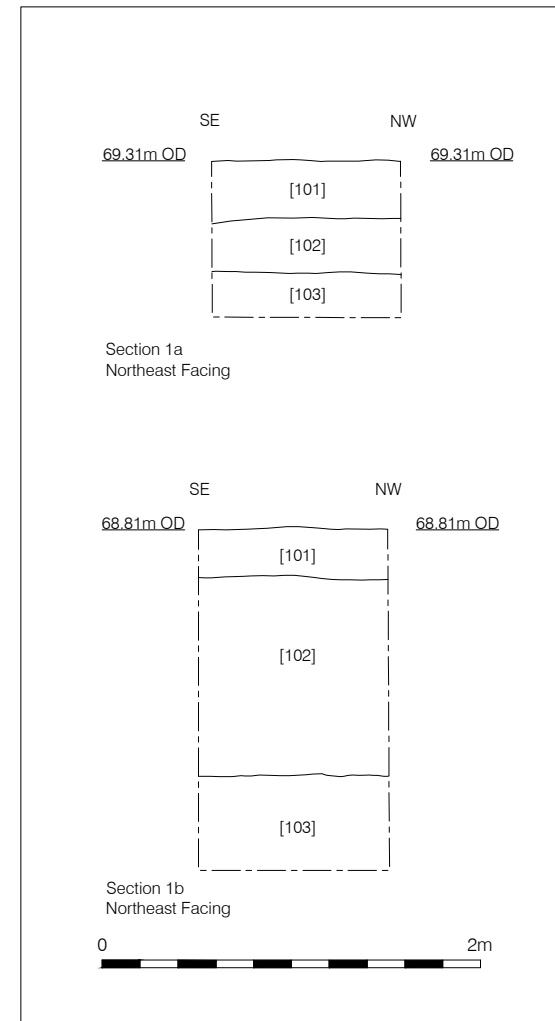
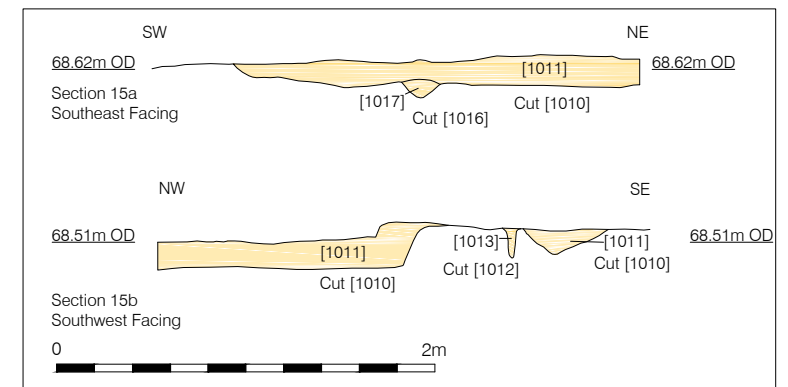
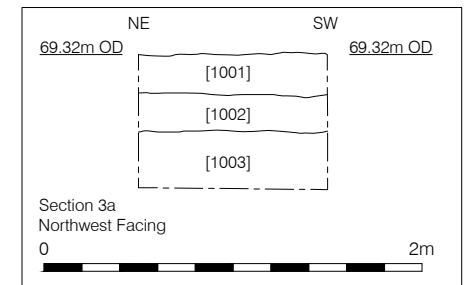
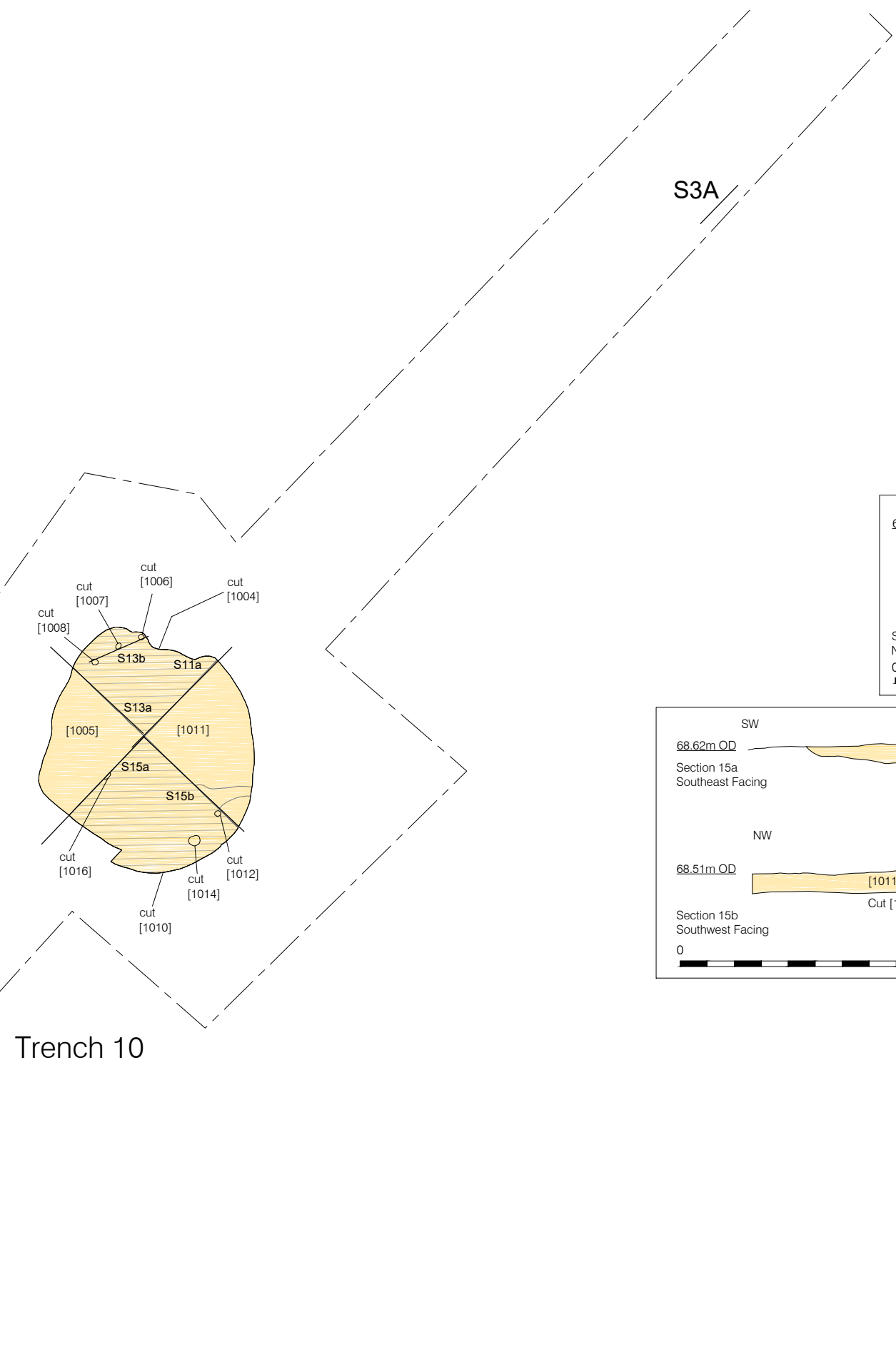
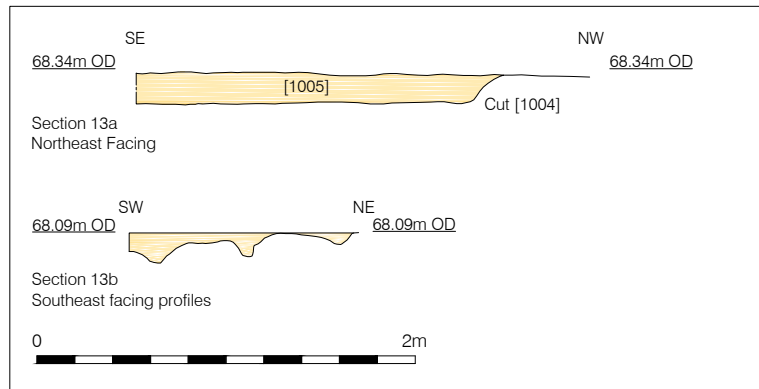
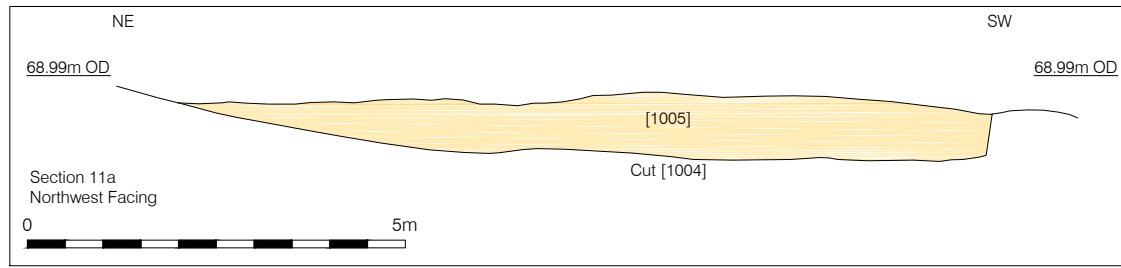

Plan 1:100, Sections 1:40, (11a 1:100) at A3

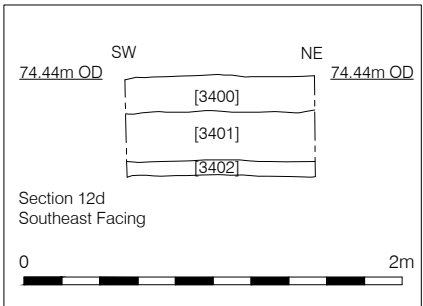
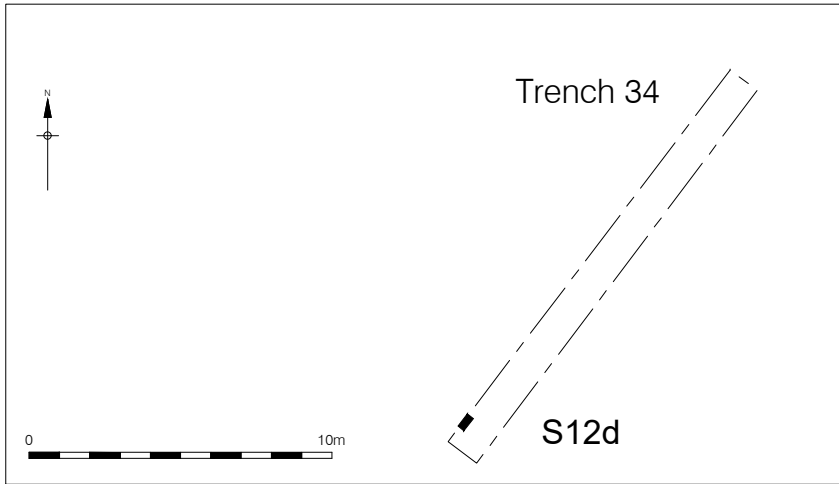
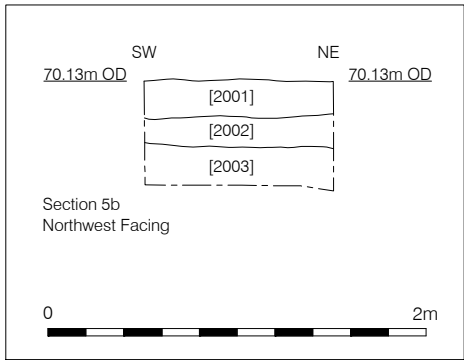
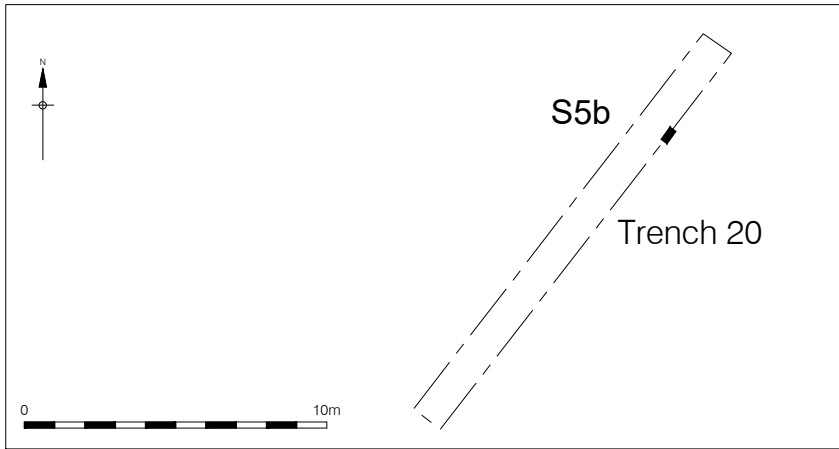
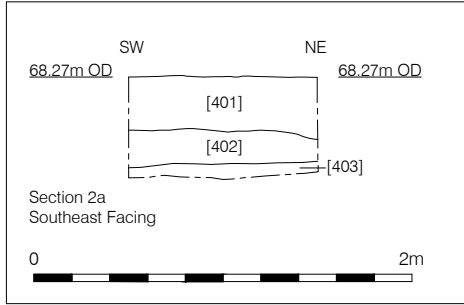
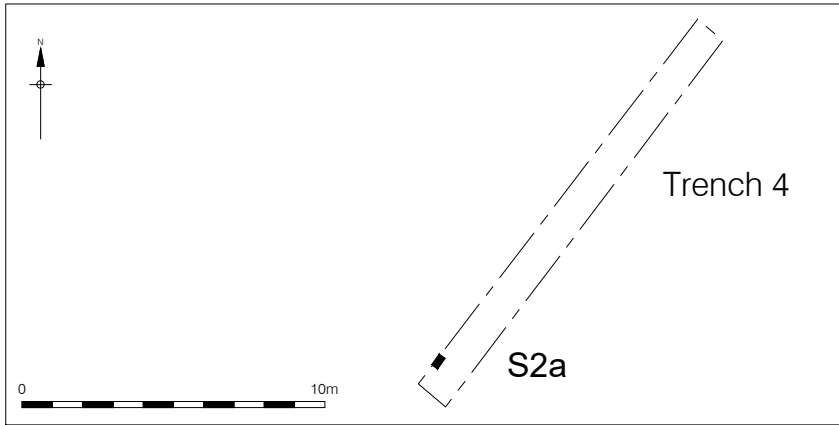
