

#### 1 ABSTRACT

Pre-Construct Archaeology Ltd (PCA) was appointed by Tony Langridge Consulting Ltd on behalf of Aster Group Ltd to undertake an archaeological trial trench evaluation on land at South Street, Stratton-on-the-Fosse, Radstock, Somerset. The Site is the subject of a development proposal comprising the erection of a single dwelling.

The archaeological evaluation was required by Mendip District Council, acting on the advice Steven Membery, Senior Historic Environment Officer, South West Heritage, and in keeping with NPPF Section 12 and Local Plan Policy.

The evaluation was carried out in accordance with a Written Scheme of Investigation on the 30<sup>th</sup> April and 1<sup>st</sup> May 2018.

The evaluation revealed a single archaeological feature, most probably a boundary ditch, of post-medieval date. The absence of any other archaeological remains appears to demonstrate that the Site retains no significant archaeological potential.

#### 2 INTRODUCTION

#### 2.1 Project Background

- 2.1.1 Pre-Construct Archaeology Ltd (PCA) was appointed by Tony Langridge Consulting Ltd on behalf of Aster Group Ltd to undertake an archaeological trial trench evaluation on land at South Street, Stratton-on-the-Fosse, Radstock, Somerset (NGR 365813 150717), hereafter 'the Site' (Figure 1). The Site is the subject of a development proposal comprising the erection of a single dwelling.
- 2.1.2 The archaeological evaluation was required by the Local Planning Authority Mendip District Council, acting on the advice of their archaeological advisor Steven Membery, Senior Historic Environment Officer, South West Heritage, and in keeping with NPPF Section 12 and Local Plan Policy. The evaluation was intended to provide information toward understanding the archaeological implications of the proposed development and toward determination of the subsequent treatment (mitigation) of any archaeological remains found within it, should an application for the development proposal obtain consent.

## 2.2 Location, Topography and Geology

- 2.2.1 The Site is located in the village of Stratton-on-the-Fosse, off South Street, east of the main road through the village, the A367 Fosseway and south of Church Lane. The Site lies on level ground at approximately 170m above Ordnance Datum.
- 2.2.2 The geology of the Site comprises Triassic era sandstone and conglomerate, (British Geological Survey http://mapapps.bgs.ac.uk/geologyofbritain/home.html).

#### 2.3 Archaeological and Historical Background

- 2.3.1 The Site lies in an area of known archaeological sites, find spots and monuments and in the historic village of Stratton-on-the-Fosse, a settlement that straddles the line of the Roman road linking the Roman towns at Exeter and Bath, part of the 'Fosseway', that lies some 50m to the west. An Area of High Archaeological Potential has been defined by the Retained Mendip District Council Local Plan Policy and this includes the Site.
- 2.3.2 An archaeological watching brief (Broomhead, 2015) carried out next to the Site during development of the former British Legion Club (now No. 4, The Poppies) recovered limited archaeological evidence but this included Roman box-flue tile and might indicate, along with a possible limestone rubble wall, evidence for a Roman structure; box-flue tiles are associated with heating Roman houses, including bath houses, and other structures. Medieval pottery was also recovered during the watching brief.

#### 3 AIM

#### 3.1 Archaeological Evaluation

- 3.1.1 The aim of the archaeological evaluation is to determine the character, extent, date, condition and significance of archaeological remains that may survive within the Site, taking account of their potential to contain biological and palaeo-environmental remains.
- 3.1.2 This document reports on the results of the evaluation will aim to provide sufficient information so that the future treatment of any archaeological remains within the Site, in respect of the proposed development, may be determined.

#### 4 RESULTS

#### 4.1 Introduction

4.1.1 The following provides a summary of the evaluation results based upon the Site archive, which comprises a Site diary, trench recording sheets, drawings, digital photographs electronic survey data and a small finds assemblage. The archive is held at PCA's Winchester office under the site code **SOFS18** and will in due course be deposited with the Hampshire Cultural Trust. A context index is provided in **Appendix 1**.and **Plates** in **Appendix 2**.

#### 4.2 Methodology

- 4.2.1 The evaluation comprised the excavation of 1no 12m X 2m trench (Trench 1) (**Figure 2**, **Plate 1**) located within the footprint of the proposed dwelling. The trench was mechanically excavated using a 3-ton 360° tracked excavator fitted with a wide toothless blade bucket. All mechanical excavation was supervised by PCA.
- 4.2.2 Archaeological features and deposits were cleaned by hand a sampled to meet the objectives of the evaluation. The trench and archaeological features were recorded on PCA *pro forma* Trench Recording Sheets. Plans and a representative section of the trench were drawn on polyester based drafting film. All trenches and sections were digitally photographed.

#### 4.3 Summary of Deposition Sequence

4.3.1 The natural reddish brown silt clay (101) was encountered between 0.21m below ground level (BGL) in the north of the trench and 1.14m BGL in the south of the trench. A single archaeological feature was cut into (103 and was, at the southern end of the trench sealed a modern capping/levelling layer (106) of mid reddish brown silty clay, in turn covered by modern gravel surfacing (100).

#### 4.4 Archaeological Feature


Figure 3 Plan of Trench 1 1:50 at A4

- 4.4.1 The trench revealed a single archaeological linear feature [103] running north-west to south east for the length of the trench and cut into the underlying natural clay (**Figure 3 & 4 and Plate 2**). Two hand-dug sections through the feature revealed its cut to have a sloped eastern side falling to the west, beyond the western trench edge; the full depth and profile of the feature was not exposed. Its fills comprised a lower layer (107) of orangey clay, an upper fill of reddish charcoal flecked brown silty clay, (104) and (105), and a band of sandstone rubble (102) possibly capping the feature
- 4.4.2 A small assemblage of stratified finds was recovered from fill (104)/(105), and included three small sherds of 19th century transfer printed white ware, 448gm of fragmented animal bone, burnt, undressed sandstone fragments and a single iron nail.

#### 4.5 Conclusion

4.5.1 The evaluation revealed a single archaeological feature, most probably a boundary ditch of post-medieval date. The absence of any other archaeological remains appears to demonstrate that the Site retains no significant archaeological potential.








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Figure 1 Site Location 1:1,000,000 & 1:250,000 & 1:25,000 at A4









Sandstone Rubble






Section 5A South facing Northern Sondage


Section 5B North facing Northern Sondage
