

## Roydon Hall, nr Tonbridge, Kent KRHT 07

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An archaeological Watching Brief was undertaken during the excavation of 3 geotechnical test pits on 6<sup>th</sup> December 2007.

### Test Pit 1

Located adjacent to the southern side of the Clock Tower, where the tower and the 'side room' converge. The foundations to the Clock Tower were exposed 520mm beneath the level of the threshold to the side room, consisting of stone rubble and mortar protruding 300mm from the external face of the wall and 380mm thick. The foundation for the side room consisted of 600mm of brick footing without additional support. Excavation was made through 700mm of loose mid-brown sandy clay with occasional flecks of cbm and chalk/mortar above a moderately stiff blue-grey silty clay natural that was augered to a depth of 4m below ground level.

### Test Pit 2

Located adjacent to the buttress supporting the western corner of the main building. The foundations for the buttress were located 280mm beneath the asphalt, protruding 600mm from the buttress and measuring at least 520mm thick. Excavation was made through loose mid-brown sandy clay with occasional flecks of cbm and chalk/mortar. The remains of an additional foundation were revealed that consisted of a stepped foundation built in brick and stone running north-west-south-east (parallel with the main building) and present from a level of 430mm beneath the asphalt. At the deepest point of excavation, 800mm it appeared that the two foundations converged as the ground became in penetrable within the scope of the geotechnical exercise.

### Test Pit 3

Adjacent to the western extension to the main building, in an area artificially built up to create a paved terraced walkway round the building. 800mm of yellow sand and gravel with frequent inclusions of ragstone fragments <400mm diameter and brick was excavated and contained modern debris (including a 'Coke' can and an electric iron). A hand auger was employed that progressed to 1680mm below the slabs before encountering an obstruction- possibly a foundation.
