# Summary of an Archaeological Watching Brief on Land at 73 & 75 Carpenters Lane, Hadlow, Kent

#### Introduction

An archaeological watching brief was conducted on land at 73 & 75 Carpenters Lane, Hadlow Kent, between  $16^{th} - 18^{th}$  December 2008 and  $5^{th} - 8^{th}$  January 2009 during groundworks associated with the site's redevelopment. The first phase monitored the stripping of topsoil across the central third of the site and the excavation of drain runs, which were positioned on the alignment of the road that was to be constructed through the centre. The second phase, in association with Francis Wenban-Smith, entailed the excavation and recording of five test pits to investigate the presence or absence of Holocene activity at the site. the results of that work are reported separately. The test-pits had the following dimensions:

All machine work was undertaken using flat-bladed ditching buckets.

# Sequence

The sequence at the site comprised natural strata of sandy / clayey gravel in TPs 1-4 and coarse gravel in TP 5 overlain by varying thicknesses of modern made ground (TPs 1-4) and topsoil (TP 5).

#### **Conclusions**

The underlying natural showed a sharp fall from northeast to southwest consistent with the site's surface topography. No finds or features of archaeological significance were observed during the investigation.
