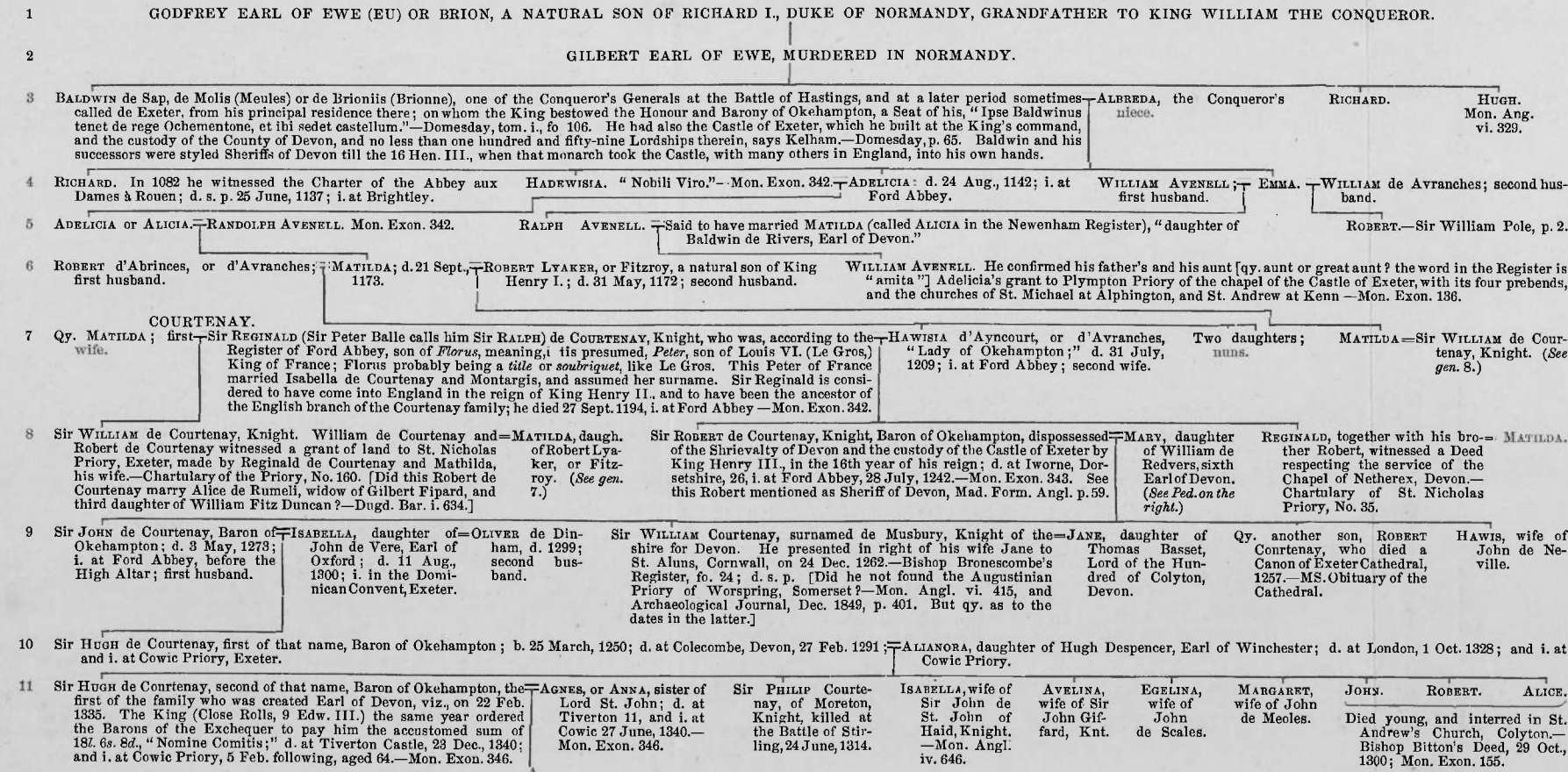

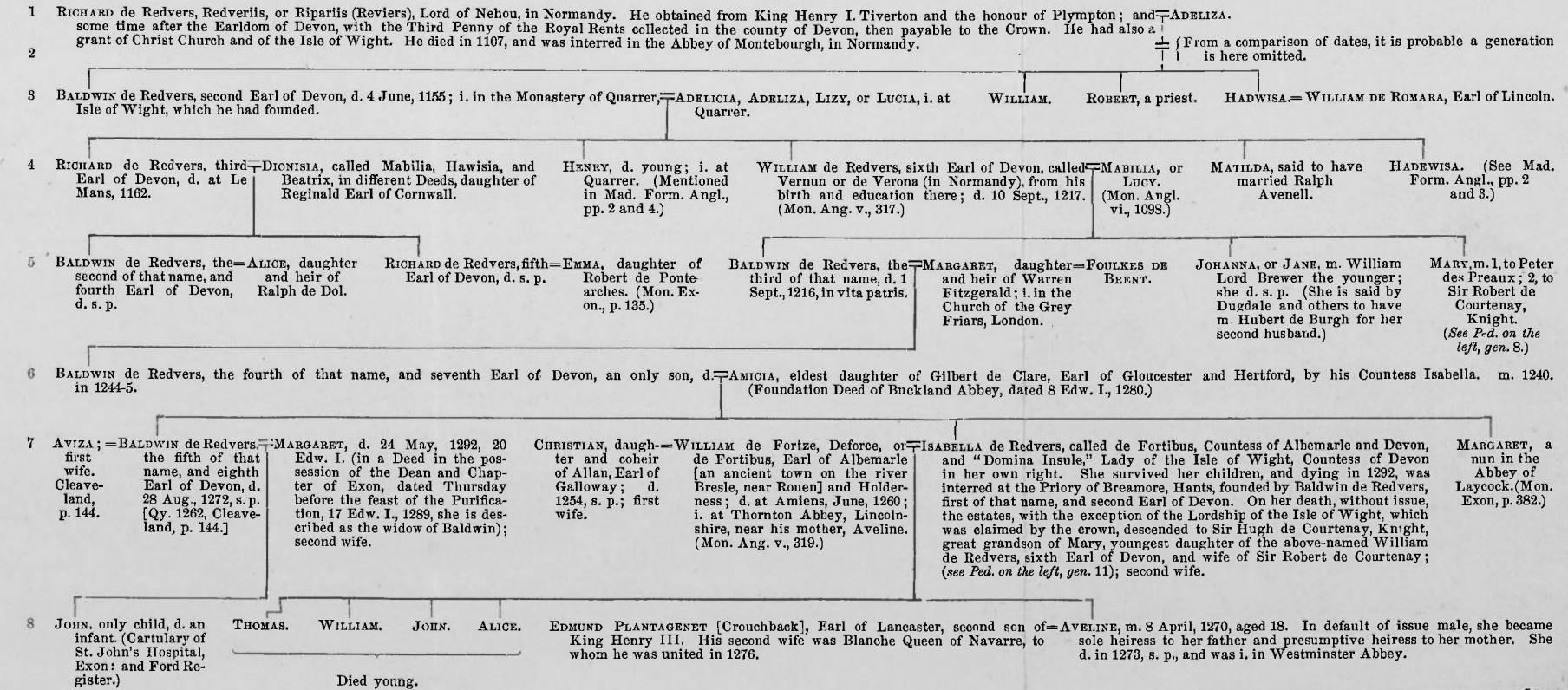

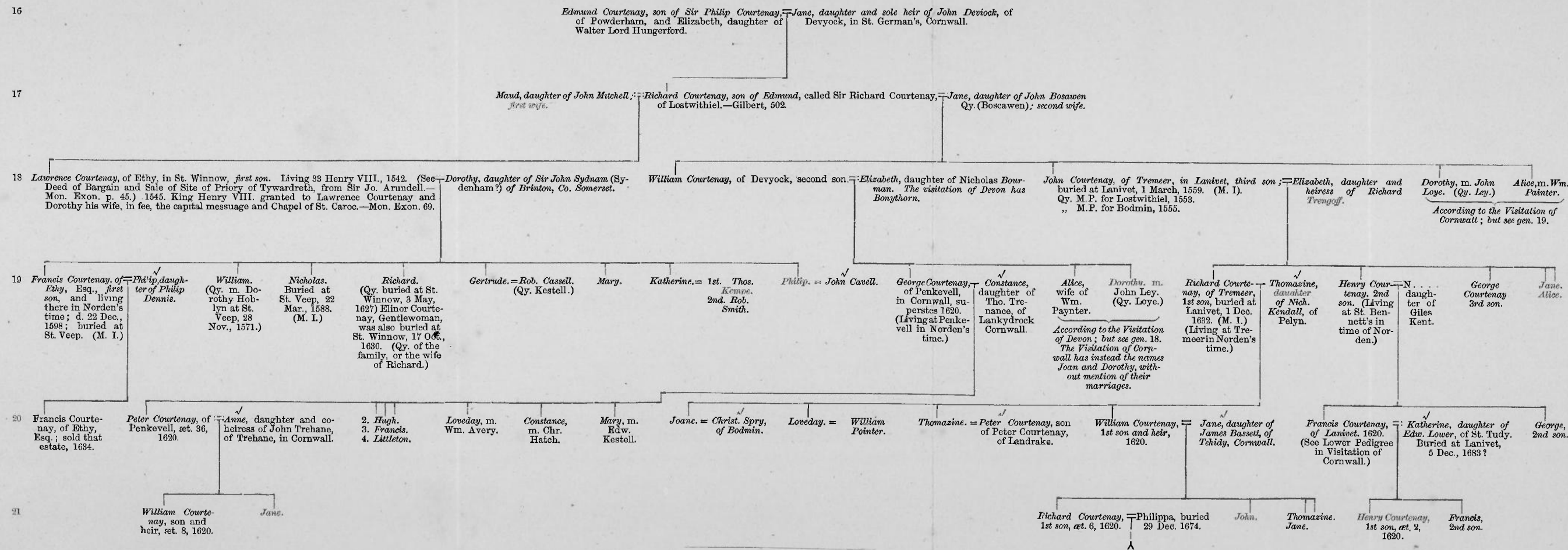


PEDIGREE OF THE REDVERS FAMILY, FORMER EARLS OF DEVON.

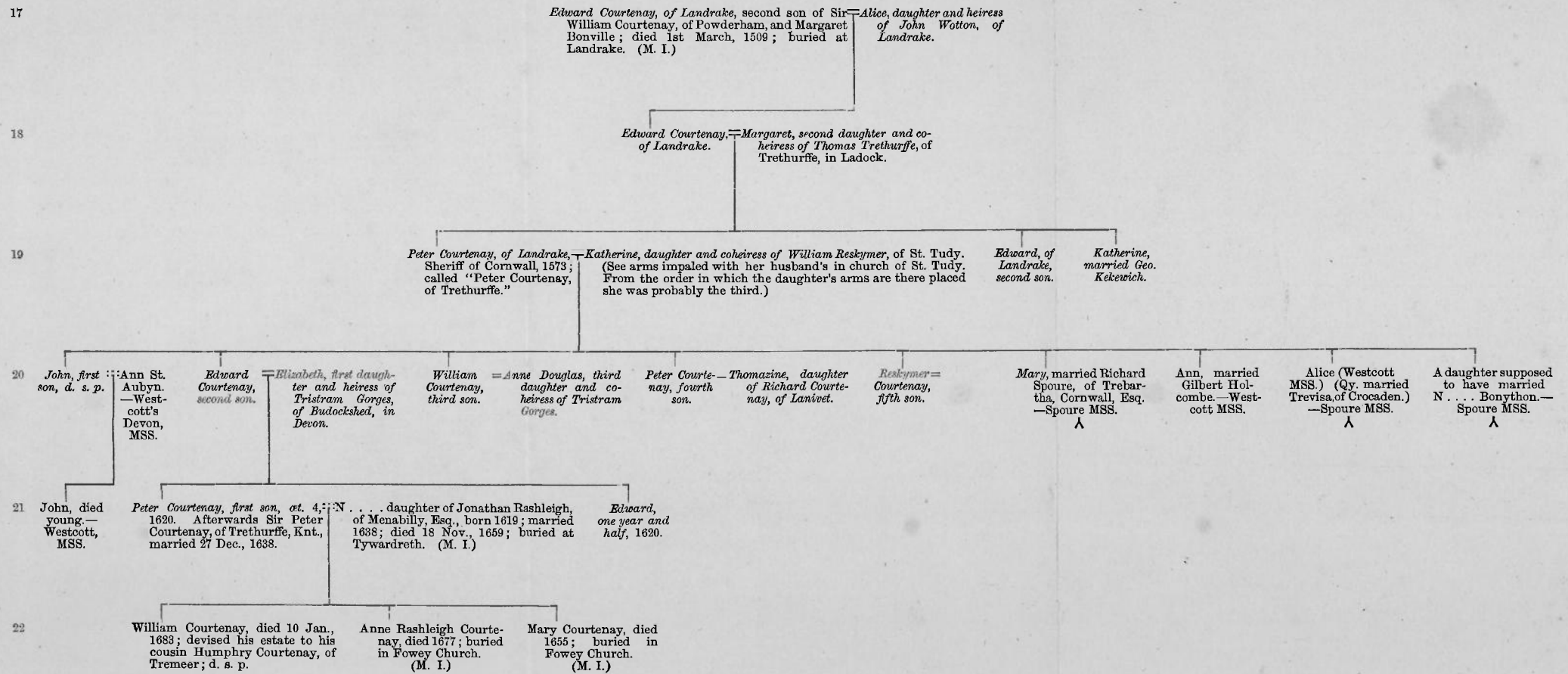
