REPORT OF THE COUNCIL FOR THE SESSION 1911-1912.

The Council have the honour to present their report, being the seventieth since the foundation of the Institute.

The income and expenditure account shows that the total receipts for the year 1911 amount to £686 2s. 11d. while the expenditure incurred is £431 7s. od. The balance to credit has since been invested.

The securities now standing in the names of the trustees are set out in the balance sheet.

The sum of £32 has been granted towards research during the year. The liabilities shown in the balance sheet as outstanding have been paid.

A copy of the accounts for the year 1911 is appended.

The senior Vice-President, Mr. Gervaise le Gros, M.A. F.S.A. retires by rotation, and the Council recommend that Mr. C. Lynam, F.S.A. be appointed a Vice-President in his place.

The members of the Council who retire in rotation are Messrs. W. H. Knowles, F.S.A; C. Lynam, F.S.A; J. Challenor C. Smith, F.S.A; C. A. Bradford, F.S.A; M. S. Giuseppi, F.S.A; and T. T. Greg, M.A. F.S.A. To take their places the Council recommend Professor W. Boyd Dawkins, M.A. D.Sc. F.R.S. F.S.A. and Messrs. G. C. Druce, F.S.A; E. L. Guilford, M.A; Herbert Jones, F.S.A; R. Garraway Rice, F.S.A. and J. W. Willis-Bund, M.A. LL.B. F.S.A.

It is also recommended that Mr. W. H. St. John Hope and Mr. W. J. Hemp be re-appointed Director and Auditor respectively for the current year.

The loss of members during the session 1910–1911 by resignation is sixteen, and by death, nine, two of whom were life compounders. Four libraries have ceased to subscribe. Seventeen new libraries have been added, and twenty-four new members have been elected, two of whom have compounded, making a net increase of twelve members and subscribers.

Among those who have passed away the Council regret to record the names of Mr. F. Braby, Mr. J. Norton Dickons, Mr. J. P. Gibson, F.S.A; his Honour Judge Lushington, and the Rev. J. Bowstead Wilson, M.A. F.S.A.
